**PARISH COUNCIL NOTES**

**Council News:** There is now one remaining vacancy on the council. If you are interested please contact the parish clerk, Steve Lawless, on 620329.

**Grants to Village Organisations:** The Well Dressing committee sought additional financial help. Council discussed this application and have given an additional grant of £250 to this important village organisation. The grant fund is now spent for the current financial year.

**Localism Bill:** Further background work was planned to enable Council to understand the implications of the new Localism Bill & Neighbourhood Planning. Training of councillors progresses with courses being held in the south of the county.

**Footpaths:** DCC contractors have been working on the footpaths from Brookside up to the Yeld. This work includes replacing a broken handrail, installing two additional short handrails and carrying out repairs to the steps and surfacing on these footpaths. In addition, the Probation Service has agreed to carry out undergrowth clearance on these footpaths, and this work is likely to commence sometime after Easter.

**Newburgh:** Following the March council meeting, council became aware of new developments regarding the planning application for the Newburgh site. By now you will have had an opportunity to visit the Newburgh exhibition to understand the scope and timings of the latest proposal. Some council members will also have met with the PDNPA case officer responsible for this application. This outline planning application could be determined by PDNPA as early as this September.

**Playing Fields:** A new contract has been agreed for mowing the grass on the playing fields at a saving of around £3,000 per year. The first cut took place in the middle of March and it is now planned to mow the grass twice per month for the rest of the growing season. A tree surgeon has already inspected the trees on the playing fields and the small amount of remedial work identified has already been carried out. Routine care and maintenance of the playing fields continues as normal. The roundabout that used to be situated on Town Bottom playing field was removed during the recent refurbishment exercise. It has been suggested that some residents might wish to have this equipment refurbished and retained as seating. The Playing Fields committee propose to provide a modest amount of money for materials if these residents would form a working party to carry out the work. If you would like to be involved please inform Steve Lawless on 620329.

**Toilet Block:** District Council have arranged for the Town Bottom toilet block to be ready for re-opening around Easter.

**Carnival:** Planning for this year's event is now well underway. Three new volunteers joined the last meeting of the committee and they have already made valuable suggestions.
