PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

District Council Matters – DDDC Cllr Furness was asked to ensure that DDDC management is made aware that the quality of the last mowing of the grass verges has not been of an acceptable quality. In addition, the parish council decided that if it is established that one of the five planned cuts for the year has been missed, then the Clerk is to apply to DDDC for a rebate.

Cllr Furness reported that significant changes are planned for domestic refuse collection starting in October and that residents will be informed of these changes directly by the District Council.

Grants - The council decided to award a grant of £350 to the Bradwell Bowls Club to enable them to buy more equipment, especially to enable it to hold open sessions for younger visitors.

Skate Park – A suggestion that a skate park be installed in the village was considered by Council. It was decided that steps would be taken to acquire the information necessary to assess the case and reach an informed decision. This work will involve inspecting similar skate parks, agreeing a suitable design, conducting noise assessments, ensuring there are no planning issues and investigating the availability for funding. It was agreed that a public consultation will be carried out prior to a final decision.

BT Phone Kiosk – Following last month's discussion and publicity, no suggestions have been received from residents for the use of this kiosk. It will therefore be retained for the short term and until a decision is made.

Bradwell Youth Club – work is progressing during the summer months to resolve a number of issues with the youth club. Interviews are being planned for the vacant Youth Leader & Youth Assistant positions. The need to establish a trust to manage the Youth Club is being reviewed. It was also suggested that a Senior Residents Club could be established to run in the Youth Club premises alongside the Youth Club. This suggestion is being investigated by councillors.

Bradwell Brook – Council decided to avail itself of a Derbyshire County Council (DCC) underwritten Community Clean-up campaign by asking it to remove the excess weed and generally tidy the Brook again this year.

Sports Awards - Council decided to nominate a village group for this year's District Council Sporting Awards. If this application is successful, it will be announced in a future edition of Bradwell News.

Council Training - Training courses for councillors and the Clerk relating to the new powers arising from the 2011 Localism Bill are planned to continue during August.

Council Finance – The receipt of a long outstanding HMRC repayment of £859 was noted by council. The Clerk had been pursuing this refund for some considerable time. The report from the last Finance committee meeting was received by council. This report advised council that if we are to maintain

our finances at an acceptable level, as required by Government regulations, then in the longer term the level of precept would need to be increased. The level of increase required will be proposed at the October Finance committee meeting.

Carnival – Council received a report on the 2012 Carnival from the committee chair. The report concluded that the Carnival had been very successful, with new events and attractions (e.g. donkey rides, Bucking Bronco) and with new floats included in the parade.

Trees – The quotation received from a tree surgeon for tree surgery work on Town Bottom playing field was considered by council and in light of the current financial situation it was decided not to proceed with this work.

OPEN MEETING - Adoption of the PARISH PLAN

The Parish Plan has reached a point where the considerable input from the village has been organised and documented. A summary was presented during Carnival and in the Post Office window, and a more complete proposal will appear soon on the village website. We are now at the point where the village needs to adopt the proposals and effectively take "ownership" of the plan. To this end, there will be a public meeting in the Memorial Hall on **Tuesday 9th October** so you can ask questions and make further comments. There will be two sessions, at **6:30pm and 8:30pm** to enable as many people as possible to attend. Please come along and make sure the plan expresses **your** wishes for the future of Bradwell.

REBELLION KNOLL W.I.

This month's meeting will be on **Friday 14th Sept** (please note the **day**) when we will be welcoming our MP Patrick McLoughlin who has very kindly agreed to come and talk to us and answer some of our questions, this promises to be an interesting and informative meeting. To drink hot chocolate out of a chocolate cup and saucer was amazing! Cocoadance supply Harrods and Harvey Nicholls, amongst others, and can also be found at the monthly Farmers Market in Bakewell. We used this outing to add to our mileage count for WI's national effort 'Big Walk, Little Splash' adding another 40 miles to the total.

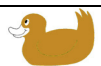

MRS ADA MARY DOROTHY BALL

Mary Ball died at the Burton Closes Nursing Home on 29th July aged 88 years. Born in Bradwell she was the daughter of James and Hannah Dakin, living on Netherside before moving to Gore Lane. She went to the Church School before starting work for Mrs Boulton at the Shoulder of Mutton. She then moved to Eyam, working for an Eyam doctor and "living in". During the war Mary worked on a lathe at Easterbrook All-cards munitions factory at Bridge Works, Parsons Lane. In 1945 she married Bill Ball and they lived with her brother Arthur at Eyam before moving to Bradwell. As her family grew up she returned to work as a cleaner at the cement works. Her main interest was her family but she also enjoyed listening to music and loved animals. She leaves a son Malcolm, daughters Irene and Gloria, six grandchildren, seventeen great-grandchildren and her sister Lilian. Her husband Bill and her seven brothers pre-deceased her. The funeral was at Brimington Crematorium on 10th August.

MISS MARY LEE

Mary Lee died at Moorland House on 5th July aged 83 years. Born in the Wirral she was the daughter of Timothy and Elizabeth Lee. They lived in north west London and she attended school at St Dominic's. After leaving school she trained as a nurse at the Harrow on the Hill and Royal Brompton Hospitals. Later, she was employed as a practice nurse in Rickmansworth. On retirement she moved to Bradwell to be closer to her family. Mary's main interests were the Catholic Church, wildlife and gardening. She leaves nieces Felicity, Elizabeth and Penelope. The funeral was at Bamford Catholic Church on 16th July, followed by burial.

MR GARNET WILSON

Garnet Wilson died at the Presentation Sisters Nursing Home, Matlock on 8th July aged 86 years. Born in Bradwell the son of Beatrice Wilson he attended the Church school before starting work at A. F. Hancock Ltd. During the war he joined

the army, serving in the Cocos Islands and India. On leaving the army he went to work at Earle's cement works. He married Bertha Eidson and they lived with her parents at the Shoulder of Mutton, then moving to rooms in Bradwell and Castleton, and finally moving to Hope. In his youth Garnet played football and cricket and he was a keen gardener. He leaves his wife Bertha, daughters Margaret and Christine, sons Alan and Martin, eight grandchildren, seven great-grandchildren and his brother Douglas. His sisters Barbara and Dolly pre-deceased him. Cremation was at Hutcliffe Wood on 19th July, followed by a service of thanksgiving at Bradwell Methodist Church.

Nellie Wytkin died at the Lodge Nursing Home, Chapel-En-Le-Frith on 16th July aged 93 years. Born in Bamford, the daughter of Malcolm and Beatrice Walker she attended school in Bamford before starting work at the Cheshire Cheese Inn, where she played the piano. She later became head cook at the Bamford Cotton Mill. Nellie married Jimmy Tattersall and they lived in Castleton before moving to Bamford. Jimmy died at the age of 61 and some years later she married Frank Wytkin and they came to live in Bradwell until about four years ago. After becoming blind she moved to the Lodge. She enjoyed shopping, knitting and watching football. She leaves her husband Frank, sons Gordon and Graham, daughter Monica, four grandchildren, four great-grandchildren and sisters Doreen, Hilary and Beryl. Her husband Jim and ten siblings pre-deceased her. The funeral was at Bamford Church on 24th July followed by burial.
