NEWBURGH PLANNING APPLICATION



As reported in the January edition of Bradwell News, on Friday 18th February the Parish Council organised a village meeting to present to the village the major differences between the planning application submitted at the end of 2012 and the

one previously submitted in 2008. Despite a few inches of snow around 120 people turned up. Councillors were available to answer questions and large scale plans of the development proposals were displayed around the room. Council had arranged this meeting to obtain feedback from the village on the feeling of residents towards the proposal and to help Council formulate their response to PDNPA on the planning application. PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

Newburgh Planning Application: Following PDNPA's receipt of the amended Newburgh planning application for outline planning permission, described as a "Masterplan for the development of Newburgh Engineering industrial site and adjoining land into a balanced mixed use residential, industrial, commercial, retail and social scheme", Council was consulted on its opinion of this application, as is usual for all Bradwell planning applications. At a special council meeting in early January Council decided it was essential to ensure that Bradwell residents were aware of the details of the scheme and to obtain their views on it, before deciding on its response to PDNPA. Council also decided to engage an independent planning consultant to review the application and produce a report on it. Council hosted a Village Meeting on 18th January to display the plans, and despite particularly adverse weather around 120 residents attended the two separate sessions and gave their comments to councillors there. These comments have been documented and are available for inspection on the village website. At the council meeting of 22nd January, council formally considered the Newburgh application and the comments received from residents, and decided unanimously to oppose the application. The next steps are (a) PDNPA will provide a 'drop-in' Q&A session in the Methodist Hall on Tuesday 29th January, (b) the planning consultant will provide his report to council by mid-February, (c) during February councillors will prepare their response to PDNPA and (d) the final version of the response will be agreed at the next council meeting on Tuesday 26th February. It is important that all residents who wish to comment on the application should write to PDNPA with their views, as their previous letters will not carry the same importance. PDNPA have indicated that the application will be considered by its Planning committee, possibly (but unlikely) on 8th March but more likely on 19th April. This Planning committee meeting will probably be held at the Agricultural Business Centre in Bakewell.

Carnival 2013: In response to the appeal in the last issue of Bradwell News, two residents volunteered to join the committee to help with the job of organising Carnival. The Carnival committee then decided that it was just sufficient to recommend to council that the carnival should proceed, even though more volunteers would always be welcome. Subject to council approval, the committee then agreed the following: **Carnival date:** Saturday 3rd August; **Theme:** "Children's Books"; volunteers are sought for village royalty (Carnival Queen, Princess, Rose bud, Rose petal); village organisations that wish to organise the street collection and the car parking should contact Steve Lawless on 620329. Various jobs have been allocated to committee members for them to start.

New Councillor: Council is pleased to announce that a new councillor has now been co-opted to the council to fill the outstanding vacancy. He is Cllr. Martin Salvage and he lives at Town End. This now brings the council back to its full strength

of ten members. Details of all your parish councillors, and other useful information, can be found on the council website at www.bradda.org.

Internal Auditor: Following a meeting with a suitable candidate for the role of Internal Auditor for the council's affairs, it was decided to engage a local accountancy business, Hodgson & Co of Bamford. In addition to internal audit, all council affairs continue to be subject to review by an External Auditor.

Part Night Street Lighting: The DCC consultation period has concluded and DCC have now decided to implement their proposal to switch off a number of carefully selected street light between mid-night and 5:30 a.m. DCC will inform us when this proposal is to be implemented

PARISH PLAN NEWS

The completed Parish Plan has been submitted to Peak District National Park Authority and a request has been lodged with them to have Bradwell Parish defined as a "Neighbourhood Area". This is the first step towards our being able to develop a Neighbourhood Plan, which is described very well in the consultation announcement from PDNPA:

Local residents and businesses are invited to have their say on whether a Peak District village should create a neighbourhood plan. Bradwell Parish Council has applied under the Localism Act to designate its village and parish as a neighbourhood area. By applying for the designation in writing to the Peak District National Park Authority the parish council has taken the first step in developing a neighbourhood plan. A neighbourhood plan is an important document that can become part of the statutory development plan for the Peak District National Park. Cllr Lesley Roberts, who chairs the National Park Authority's planning committee, said: "I am delighted that the community of Bradwell has made this move and welcome the opportunity to work closely with local people to identify ways to achieve their ambitions. Neighbourhood planning is all about bringing people together to influence the future of the places they live and work in." The application letter and a map of the proposed neighbourhood area can be seen at

www.peakdistrict.gov.uk/neighbourhoodplanning or by calling Customer Service on 01629 816200 to ask for a paper copy. People who live, work or do business in the area, are invited to comment on the application by Tuesday February 19, before a decision is made by the Authority. The process of creating the neighbourhood plan will enable the parish council and local residents to examine the capacity for growth in Bradwell and to consider opportunities for new developments, but always subject to the National Park's overall planning policies. Anyone who would like to know more about neighbourhood planning can contact village and communities officer Adele Metcalfe on 01629 816375 or adele.metcalfe@peakdistrict.gov.uk Neighbourhood plans were introduced in 2011 under the Localism Act. They are community-led plans that can carry legal weight and be adopted by the local planning authority.

BRADWELL 100 YEARS AGO

Those of you who were distressed to hear that the Liberals had beaten the Conservatives at billiards just before Christmas 1912 will be relieved to hear that the result was reversed in a return match early in the New Year of 1913. The match was tied 3-3 but the Conservatives won on points. This went on against a background in which a 'Great Blizzard' hit the Peak District with Peak Forest and Dove Holes being worst affected, with snow being piled as high as some houses. For several days it was impossible to get from Bradwell to Hope Station. The death of 20 year old Eric Jeffrey, formerly of Town Gate, was reported. Eric had moved to Canada with his family some years earlier but had always suffered from ill-health 'in the colony'. We read with interest a piece intended to help those with insurance to choose which medical man in their district they desired to attend. But the only information in the piece (drawn from the Derbyshire panel list) was the name of the doctor and his location (no qualifications were given). It seems from this list that most villages in the area (including Bradwell) had limited choice because only one doctor was listed. For Bradwell he was Dr William Houlbrook (who, with his wife, was prominent in a range of village activities). What seems to have been an annual appeal to the Magistrates at the Petty Sessions at Chapel-en-le-Frith for a reduction in the number of licensed premises in Bradwell was made; 7 licences for a total of 1326 inhabitants was excessive it was claimed. It is clear from the tone of the application, signed by 173 people, that the application the year before had been unsuccessful. This being the depth of winter it is not surprising that a number of deaths were recorded. These included the village's oldest inhabitant Mrs Harriet Hall who died in her Netherside home on her 92nd birthday. The death of Nancy Stafford required an inquest that was convened in the Primitive Methodist School Room presided

over by coroner Sidney Taylor. District nurse Mrs Alice Middleton testified that she had been called to the house in Holwogate occupied by Nancy and her brother Zach Middleton. It seems that Zach had lifted his sister (who had been bed-bound for 21 years) into a chair while he made her bed. Nancy had apparently rolled from the chair and fallen so heavily as to break her leg and had died soon after. In giving his evidence Dr T H Parke (listed in the Derbyshire panel as one of the two doctors available in Tideswell) testified that Mrs Stafford was so weak that even without the fall she would not have lived much longer. A verdict 'in accordance with doctor's evidence' was recorded.

5-A-SIDE TOURNAMENT

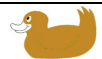

The funeral was at the Methodist Church on 1st November followed by burial at the Primitive Methodist graveyard.

Sheila Elliott, granddaughter of Hannah Hall, founder of Bradwell's Ice Cream, died in Derby Hospital on 19th November aged 87 years after a very short illness. Her last teaching appointment prior to retirement was at Markeaton Infant School. Sheila leaves her daughter Diane, son-in-law John, grandchildren and great-grandchildren. Her husband Kenneth and brother John pre-deceased her. Cremation was at Derby on 4th December, 2012.
