### SOFTWATER LANE CAR PARK

Work to create this car park is scheduled for September then it will be ready for it's first users. If you would like to register for one of the twelve spaces available now is the time to contact either Linda Granger (620416) or Steve Lawless (620329). When you make contact you can also ask questions about the eligibility criteria and rules for use of the park. The spaces will be secured using a lockable drop-post and spaces will be allocated during the coming weeks..

### NEWBURGH SITE DEVELOPMENT

On 17th June the Peak Park planning committee unanimously approved the plans submitted by Camstead Ltd. for development of the Newburgh Engineering site. As part of this, twelve houses will be gifted to the Community Land Trust, to be held by the Trust forever on behalf of Bradwell. Any profits will be reinvested in the Bradwell area. The village will also get 43 open market houses - more people for the shops and children for the schools, retention of Newburgh Engineering in the village, plus several new factory units - to attract new businesses to the village or allow existing businesses to grow. The final mix of houses and employment has been controlled by the Bradwell Neighbourhood plan, in which a large part of the village participated - a great example of what we can achieve when we all work together. More news next month.

### CARNIVAL!!

Carnival this year takes place on Beggars' Plot on 30th July, the first Saturday of Gala Week, and is organised by a small group of volunteers and Parish Councillors. This year's theme is "Pantomime" and the field will open at 11.30 a.m. You will find a variety of stalls: crafts, antiques, bric-a-brac, a beer tent, refreshments provided by the WI and commercial outlets; the Orchard group, fairground rides, activities and displays from Ferrets to Billarettes and the children's entertainer. Once again this year the judges for the Fancy dress will be taking an informal walkabout on the field between 1 and 1.30 p.m. They will award rosettes and certificates to the most imaginative and creative pantomime characters in the following categories: under 4s, under 8s, under 12s and 12+. The Queens will be judged after the parade in Arena 1 and on the roadside together with the village floats on the road

side at 1p.m. The road will be closed to traffic while the parade, which begins at 2.00 p.m., travels through the village. St. John's Ambulance Service will be in attendance on the field and there will be toilets near the play area. Please note that dogs are not allowed on the field!

## PC NOTES

**Newburgh Development:** During the June PC meeting, it was decided that a councillor would speak at the PDNPA planning committee meeting on Friday 17<sup>th</sup> June in support of the Camstead Ltd. planning application for the Newburgh site. The development will start with six new industrial buildings, followed by demolition of all existing buildings and phased construction of 55 new houses. Twelve of these houses will be gifted to the Bradwell Community Land Trust, which will manage them as affordable rental properties for the benefit of the community. The development is expected to take about three years to complete. All construction traffic will access the site via the Netherside entrance.

**Car Parking committee:** The newly formed Car Parking committee has held its inaugural meeting. The five members were each allocated a section of the village to survey, to identify both parking issues and potential opportunities to increase parking provision. Each area will be surveyed three times, during the day, during the evening and at a weekend. The findings will be compiled into a report for further scrutiny. Final refinements to the contract for the development of the car park on Soft Water Lane have been made and it has now been issued to the contractor.

**Carnival 2016:** Planning for this year's Carnival is proceeding at a pace and the final preparations will be made at the next committee meeting on Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> July. A new marquee has been bought and this year music will be provided by the Castleton Silver Band and the Chesterfield Musketeers Show Band. Besides the old favourites, this year we will have a Morris Dancing group and the Ferret Roulette will again be with us. A bar, with accompanying music, will be available on the field with profits going to the Bradwell Community Land Trust. Please be aware that dogs are not permitted on the field and a DDDC dog warden will be in attendance.

**Defibrillator:** The second defibrillator, obtained by the Bradwell Football Club, has now been installed in the red telephone kiosk on Brookside. It has been registered with the emergency services and can be accessed by phoning 999 to obtain the code required to release it from the cabinet.

**Playing Fields:** As with every year, the council employed an independent company to conduct a RoSPA safety inspection of the playing fields and play equipment. This year a problem was identified with some play equipment on Beggars Plot playing field (the tyre traverse) and this equipment has been removed from use pending repair.

**Bradwell Edge:** In order to resolve some long standing issues with the public routes up to Bradwell Edge, Cllr Furness met for a site inspection with the land owner and representatives of DCC and PDNPA. It was noted that parts of the route of the Bridleway were incorrect and it was agreed that DCC would correct the legal definitions for the Bridleway, Holloway and footpaths. Once this has been done, DCC will arrange for repairs and improvements (e.g. new steps) to be made. These

changes will be in addition to the work kindly being carried out at present by the land owner.

**Consultation on DCC funding cuts to DCCVS;** The County Council is consulting with residents on proposals to stop grant funding the voluntary and community sector. The closing date for this exercise is 24<sup>th</sup> July 2016. If you would like to respond, the forms are available on the DCC website. The parish council has responded by opposing these cuts.

## HOME ON LEAVE

We have now reached a group of servicemen who visited Bradwell in about July 1916:

**201057 Lance Corporal Clement Pierce Dix 4<sup>th</sup>** (Hallamshire) Battalion York and Lancs. Regiment. Clem Dix was living at 33 Clinton Place, Sheffield when he enlisted in November 1914. The following year he married Mabel Andrew in Ecclesfield. His military record shows that he died in hospital in Boulogne on 18<sup>th</sup> of March 1917 of wounds received in action. He is commemorated in the Boulogne Easter Cemetery. His widow was by then living in Ecclesfield. A later report states that Clem had at one time lived at Moorbrook View, Bradwell.

**WR279526 Sapper Johnson Evans** Royal Engineers. Two Johnson Evans are listed as living in Bradwell in 1911, an uncle and nephew both residing with father and grandparents Hiram and Emma respectively. Johnson Jnr's parents, William and Mary Matilda, were also living in Bradwell, in Hollowgate. It seems likely that it was uncle Johnson who was visiting home on leave. In 1911 Johnson was aged 25 and working as a railway labourer. When Johnson enlisted at the end of 1915 he was living in Smalldale. With his background he joined the Railway Troops of the Royal Engineers as a platelayer. By the end of 1916 Johnson had been wounded and was in hospital in Boulogne and did not return to active service until January 1918. He married Eleanor Haigh in Rotherham in 1924 and was still living there when he died in 1961.

**203848 Private Percy Robert Hallam Eyre 2<sup>nd</sup>/6<sup>th</sup>** Battalion Notts & Derby (Sherwood Foresters) Regiment. Percy was a Stocksbridge-born farmer living with his wife Harriett Ann (née Gibbon) at Hill Head in 1911. He enlisted at the age of 34 at the end of 1915. He was posted in France for most of 1917, was home for Christmas that year and was back in France in January 1918. Two months later he was killed in action and is remembered at the Arras Memorial in France.

**38505 Air Mechanic 2 (Rigger) Jessie Eyre** Royal Flying Corps. Fifteen year old Jessie was living at Knowle Gate Farm Castleton in 1911. He was working for his father Andrew and mother Mary Ann (née Furness). No further details of his military career have been found

**Lieutenant Alec Ewart Glassey 15<sup>th</sup>** (Service Battalion) Highland Light Infantry. In the 1911 census Normanton-born 23 year old Alec was living in Sheffield with his wife Mary Eleanor. Alec's profession was stated to be Professor of Elocution. By the start of the war Alec and Mary were living on the Hills. There are numerous newspaper cuttings describing the concerts given by both for a wide range of charities. In October 1916, shortly after his visit home, Alec was back in France when his wife received a message that he was in hospital suffering from shell shock. Later in the war after he had returned to the front he was in hospital once more this

time suffering from gas inhalation. But he survived and died in Poole, Dorset in 1970 having lived for some time in Jamaica.

### REGINALD FEARN

13<sup>th</sup> May 1925 – 8<sup>th</sup> March 2016

Following a short illness Reg, from 1 Hall Gate View died peacefully in his sleep at the Chesterfield Royal Hospital. The funeral service and tea, was held at Grenoside Crematorium, on 30th March. Reg was husband of the late Jean Fearn, Dad to the late Peter Fearn, and granddad and great granddad to Geoff and daughter Susan. Originally from Walkley, Sheffield, Reg moved to Bradwell whilst still a young boy, attending Bradwell Infant and Junior schools. On leaving school he had various jobs, from working on the Hope Valley railway, long distance haulage, foundry, and finally at Earls Cement Works. During this time he met his wife to be, Jean, at the pictures in Sheffield followed by afternoon tea! They originally lived at Windmill before moving to the newly built council house in Bradwell, where he lived until he died. Reg was active - growing tomatoes and plants in his greenhouse and allotment. In later years he took up woodturning and craft working. Reg and Jean also enjoyed holidays in Cornwall, Scotland and Norfolk. In his last few years he had help from the wonderful Eyam Domiciliary Service and fabulous neighbours Joyce and David Bennett. Geoff and Susan are indebted to them. Finally our thanks go to all in the village who looked out for dad, and to Funeral Directors John Fairest. Donations were made to the Royal British Legion.

### REVEREND MICHAEL COLLIER

The Reverend Michael Collier died suddenly but peacefully at home on 23<sup>rd</sup> April. He was 87. As a boy, he lived at Erdington, West Midlands and attended Bishop Vesey Grammar school. After leaving school he worked on a farm for a short time and then for the family firm as an accountant. He married Wendy in 1951 and they went on to have four children. He

was late taking up the ministry, training as a curate at Wycliffe College, Oxford and serving his curacy at Great Barr in St. Pauls, Hampstead. He was appointed vicar of St. Edmunds Castleton in 1975 and 3 years later, due to lack of clergy, was appointed priest in charge of St. Peters Hope, moving to Hope vicarage. He and Wendy retired to Buffers Cottage in Hope in 1997. He became Emeritus Curate and helped at funerals and sometimes services. Michael leaves wife Wendy, a son and 3 daughters. His funeral was at St. Peters Hope on May 5<sup>th</sup> (Ascension Day).

### JOHN ARTHUR COTTRILL

John died on April 28<sup>th</sup> in Chesterfield Royal Hospital aged 83. His father was originally from a farming family in Hope but John, the eldest of three children, was born in Scunthorpe. His family moved back to Castleton when he was three years old. After leaving Castleton School, he worked on a farm until the age of 26. He completed his National Service in 1959 and was then employed at Earle's Cement for over 30 years. He married Mary Peck, a Bradwell girl, in St. Barnabas Church in 1959 and they set up home at 2, Overdale, The Hills, before moving to their newly built house "Moorlands" in 1965. John was a very keen gardener and a devoted family man. He leaves wife Mary, son Peter, daughter Elaine, grandchildren Claire, Daniel, Emma, and Matthew, 2 great grandsons and 2 brothers. His eldest grandson, Mark, predeceased him. The funeral service was held at St. Barnabas Church on May 16<sup>th</sup>, followed by burial in the churchyard.
