DAVID JAMES WILSON



David was born on Christmas Day 1931 and was brought up with his two brothers, Ben and John, at Town End, Bradwell. He attended the village school and began work at the age of 14 at Earles Cement in the role of "office boy". He completed his two years National Service with the Pays Corps and chose to be posted overseas. He never forgot his time in Egypt and

this was one of the memories during his illness that he would recall and tell his family and friends of his time there. On returning to civilian life, he went back to work at Earles. When he retired in 1987, he was the Stores Manager. In 1955 David married Molly Johnson and they had two children, Tim and Jayne. They were also proud grandparents to James, Jessica, Katie, Beth and Will. David took a lifetime interest in the community of Bradwell; this is reflected in the numerous organisations with which he became involved and to which he gave his total commitment. He was Cub "Akela" for many years and created unforgettable memories for lots of boys in the village - walking up Bradda Edge in the snow, trips to Gilwell Park Camp in London, camp fires with burnt sausages! He was also a founder member of "Bradda Ten" (now Bradda Dads), Chairperson and member of the Parish Council; other committees included Memorial Hall, Junior Football Club, Historical Society, Gala Week, the British Legion and he was a trustee of the Samuel Fox Charity. David will be missed by so many and the family would like to thank friends and neighbours who helped him during his illness - in particular, Pat and Albert Repton, neighbours on Bradwell Head Road, Debbie Moseley and most recently, the wonderful staff at Haddon Hall Nursing Home, Buxton.

The family would like to thank everyone involved at the funeral on February 8th, the Rev. Sue Ives-Smith and Paul Tanfield and his team from J.E. Nouch. David would have been proud and touched by the send-off he received.

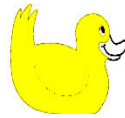

KATHLEEN DUNGWORTH



Kathleen died on 2nd February 2018 at the Northern General Hospital after a short illness. She was born in Liverpool on 19th October 1918 to Margaret and John McCormick. After leaving school she worked in the Liver Building and for Littlewood's Football Pools before becoming an auxiliary nurse at Liverpool's Walton Hospital.

Here, in 1944, she met Alan, a wounded soldier. They married in 1945 and lived with Alan's parents at Mill Cottage, Brough, before moving to 1 Brough Cottages, where they spent the rest of their lives. Kathleen later worked in the Castleton gift shops, where she made life-long friendships. She was involved with Our Lady of Sorrows R.C. Church, Bamford, where she helped at garden parties, bazaars etc. when she was more able. She had enjoyed going with Alan on continental coach holidays and liked experiencing different cultures. Relaxing with a good book in her garden next to Bradwell Brook or watching the wildlife that visited her garden gave her a lot of pleasure. Her siblings and Alan predeceased her. She leaves son John, daughter-in-law Pat and granddaughters Christina and Michelle. They would like to thank everyone for their sympathy and all at Hope Careline for their support.

ALBERT BRADWELL

Albert was born on September 29th 1931, on The Hills. He was the only child of Arthur and Annie Bradwell and for nearly all his life he lived in his neatly-kept cottage in Towngate. After leaving the Council School in 1945 he worked briefly for Der-

byshire Stone at Pindale. He then moved to Newburgh Engineering, where he served an apprenticeship which included study at night school three times a week. From 1950-52, he did his National Service, stationed at Bicester, near Oxford, where he worked in the catering corps. On his return to Bradwell, until his retirement in his late fifties, he was employed at the Derwent Valley Water Board in the forestry section, planting out new trees around the reservoirs. Albert's main interests were walking, cycling and cars. An old Ford and an Austin A40 were two of the first cars he owned and Manchester's Belle Vue, with its Big Wheel, was a favourite destination. He also enjoyed holidays in his camper van. As he grew older his pushbikes were replaced by battery powered ones. Albert never fully recovered from a fall in August 2017 when he broke his hip. After several more falls and a brief stay in Moorland House he became ill and was admitted to the Northern General Hospital, where he died on Christmas Day. A memorial service was held at the Methodist Church on 22nd January. Albert had once needed to be rescued by life-boat and donations in his memory were for the RNLI. The family would like to thank Albert's friends and neighbours who attended the service and for their donations.
