PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

Retirements

Our three longest serving Councillors - Lynda Cliffe, John Riddall and George Dawson have decided to retire at the election (May 1st).

Lynda was Council Chair for 2 years, John has been our legal and planning specialist, and George has served as Council Vice Chair and Chair of the Playing Field Committee.

Each has made a significant contribution and, on behalf of the Council, I thank them for the time and effort they have given to the village.

Lafarge / Parish Council Liaison Committee - March 11th meeting Report

Hope Works General Manager John Capewell reported that they are planning to change the direction of the Limestone Quarry face in order to make the best use of reserves. This would mean traversing towards Moss Rake rather than the current Dirlow Rake direction.

The plan was due to be submitted to Peak Park, for approval, on March 21st together with a plan for the reparation of Shale workings up to the year 2042.

A public exhibition of the new plans for both quarries will take place on April 3rd - 5th in the Works Education and Visitor Centre (4.30 - 8.00 pm on Thursday and Friday and 9.30 am - 1.30 pm on Saturday).

The new West London Depot, reported at the December meeting, is now in jeopardy as a result of the recent cancellation of Strategic Rail Authority funding by the Government.

The company is now looking at the possibility of a smaller depot, but taking only half the cement deliveries from Hope works which had been planned under the original scheme. Completion date would be delayed from Autumn this year to Spring 2004. They are also considering leasing rather than purchasing the extra rolling stock required.

The Environment Agency Representative reported that a Permit to burn tyre chips was "imminent". The trials on No. 1 Kiln had been satisfactory and indicated a reduction of 5% - 13% in NOX gases. A 3 -week trial on No. 2 Kiln would be necessary to prove it could produce similar results.

Lafarge have set up a joint partnership with a Swiss Company (GEO-DUR) to research the potential use of waste materials from other industries in Cement manufacture. The UK arm of this partnership named "GLACIER" has a site at Hillsborough, Sheffield.

METHODIST CHURCH re RENOVATION FUND

In 1996 the Church was found to be in need of a new roof. The cost £50,000. A great deal of financial support was given from chapel members, Bradwell residents and ex members living away. With the help of grants the roof was repaired in the later part of 1998.

Now due to government decree the Methodist Church and the Methodist Hall have to provide toilets and access for disabled people. In order to make the alterations and renovations necessary a sum of £100,000 is needed.

The members of the Methodist Church have, in just over a year, raised over £20,000. This amount has come from concerts, arts and crafts made by members of the congregation, catering by a newly established catering group, sales from a C.D. and generous gifts from people.

As well as the new toilets there will be a separate meeting room and a new more modern kitchen available for the use of village groups, for example, the Historical Society, the Teddy Bear club, Yoga, the Parish Council and the After School Club and others.

The Methodist Church are very appreciative of all the help, physically and financially which has been given by Bradwell Residents and we hope this support will continue and that the renovation work will be started in the near future.
