

PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

Newburgh Development. We've had a verbal report from Peak Park that a revised application is imminent. Peak Park officers say they will hold a Q and A session in Bradwell as soon as practicable after they receive it from Newburgh. They also say they will be asking Newburgh to present the revised plan to a separate village meeting.

Grants Fund. At our meeting on October 5th it was agreed to grant £1500 to Bradda Dads, in response to their written request and Mike Thompson's report to the meeting. We also agreed to a request for further £2500 from Bradwell Sports Club (making a total grant of £12500) to ensure that the 'Multi Use Games Area' project can proceed.

Youth Club. We have now received written authorisation from County Youth Services for the PC to take over management of the youth club. Our Youth Centre Committee will thus become the PC Youth Club Committee, with amended terms of reference. We are advertising for a professional youth leader to manage the club.

Public Meeting. About 50 people attended the meeting on September 28th to hear proposals from our Playing Fields committee to replace worn out equipment and to establish a BMX track on Town Bottom field. The meeting was chaired by Councillor Andy Nash (PC vice-chair) and presentations were made by Councillors Jenny Lawson and Jonathan Walker. Trevor Lafferty, MD of equipment suppliers 'Lightmain', demonstrated the preferred items and CPO Anthony Boswell spoke on security aspects of playing fields. Between and after the presentations, Andy opened the meeting to questions and suggestions. He pointed out that no decisions had been made and that any points raised at the meeting would be taken into consideration. The final decision would be made at a full council meeting which all interested residents could attend. Questions were asked about the need for replacing the equipment, reasons for preferring particular items, the cost of specific elements, the purpose of a shelter and the necessity for improving the football area. Suggestions were made for alternative equipment which might better encourage imaginative play or cater for groups of children. The overall opinion appeared to be that replacing equipment was welcomed – but that the preferred items should be reviewed. The BMX issue, however, was much more contentious and opponents appeared to be in the majority. The initiative had come from a petition signed by 33 village children, although none of them attended the meeting. Jonathan demonstrated examples of BMX tracks in nearby locations, and pointed out that there was not one in the Hope Valley. He said that the track at Hope Valley College was for mountain bikes only and not suitable for BMX. He extolled the benefits of BMX and suggested that the tracks are not noisy; they are unsuitable for skateboarding; participants are generally well-behaved and that the track would not be used after dark. Opponents claimed that it would spoil a well-used facility for football, other group sports, and

picnicking – and that the 4 ft. 'bumps' would be an unacceptable visual intrusion. There was a seconded proposal from the floor that no BMX track should be considered for either playing field – but a vote was not taken. The general view appeared to be that whilst a BMX track would be a welcome facility for village children, the playing fields were not suitable sites. It was subsequently agreed, at the Council meeting on October 5th, that the Playing Fields Committee should look for alternative sites.

The Church Magazine was first produced as a Quarterly Paper when the Rev. S.C.Moseley was vicar of Bradwell (1917-1923). It was redesigned, entitled 'Members' and cost 3d, during the incumbency of the Rev.E.N.Kemp (1944-1947). Later, when the Rev. V.Crabtree was vicar (1956-1966), the name of the magazine was changed to 'Witness' and it cost 4d. It was not until the Rev. R.S. Caney came to Bradwell that the magazine became 'St Barnabas, Bradwell' Thus, the magazine has been in production for about 90 years!! One door is closing: pray that another door will open. St. Paul said, " Whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable – if anything is excellent or praiseworthy – THINK about these things. BEWARE OF HIGH PRESSURE SELLING

Police are urging caution after reports of companies using high pressure tactics to sell mobility products to older and more vulnerable residents. Community Safety Sgt. Jon Lloyd said: "We would advise people to avoid buying from cold callers, to make sure you get more than one quote from different reputable companies in the area and to decide on the purchase without feeling pressured. We would also ask people to keep an eye out for friends and relatives, to make sure they are aware of these types of sales tactics and aware of their rights."

He leaves his wife Muriel, sisters Mary and Barbara, son Derek, daughters Susan and Denise, grandchildren Nicola, Claire and Jake, and great grandson Finn. His sister Kathleen pre-deceased him. Cremation was at Hutcliffe Wood followed by a Memorial Service at the Methodist Chapel on 7th October.

AMAZING HARVEST!

Pupils at Bradwell Junior School have been very busy harvesting the fruit and vegetables they have grown from seed in their school greenhouse and five raised beds. The initiative was funded by a 'growing better together' grant. Children have enjoyed running their own healthy tuck shop and have used tomatoes, cucumbers, climbing beans and apples from the garden. Other vegetables they have grown such as potatoes, beetroot, runner beans, courgettes, salad and herbs have been prepared by the school cook for their lunchtime meals. Earlier in the year salad, potatoes, peas and herbs grown in the garden were sold to parents at the summer fair.

One huge vegetable however can not be harvested just yet as the children are waiting to see how large their pumpkin will grow before they turn it into a Halloween lantern! The children will also be cooking some of their own vegetables in their food tech lessons in the next few weeks including garlic, onions, beetroot, butternut squash, sweet corn and leeks. We can't wait to try chocolate and beetroot muffins!


