



PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

Town Bottom Playing Field.

Please note that this field, including the football pitch, is now **closed until further notice** to allow the installation works to be carried out safely and without interruption. We will be spending around £62000 on new equipment and groundwork over the next few weeks and, when completed, the new surfaces will take some time to bed in and the new grass will need a chance to take root. Please see separate article on this subject on the opposite page. Following consultation with the village schools, a full range of new play equipment has now been agreed and ordered. We have ordered a new shelter to stand on the base of the old shelter which had to be demolished a few years ago for safety reasons. By the time you read this, the springers and the old roundabout should have been lifted from their current positions. They may be re-sited elsewhere on the field if that is considered appropriate.

Parish Council Election?

Recent experience suggests that one will not be necessary, but we can never be sure so we have included the notional cost (£1500) in next year's budget - in case there is a sudden flush of enthusiasm for joining the Council. The date set for an election is May 5th and this is also the date for the referendum on the proposed system of Alternative Voting in General Elections – which would be held at the same venue. We hope that sufficient residents (more than ten) will offer their services to the new council to make an election necessary.

Carnival

The Carnival will take place on Saturday July 30th and will be managed by Ashley Briggs. The field will open at 12 noon and the parade will start at 2.30 pm. A theme has yet to be agreed, but the PC Carnival Committee would welcome new float entrants. Village organisations who would be interested in conducting the street collections or marshalling the car park (which includes traffic management), for their organisation's benefit, should contact the parish clerk (620329). Anyone interested in representing Bradwell in the Queens competitions should contact committee chair, Vanessa Horstead (623053). A contribution towards costs is available to the selected applicants. Sarah Ridgeway, who is currently studying event management at University, has joined the committee and will manage the stalls bookings and their positioning on the field. The committee is considering promoting an indoor evening event on the second Saturday (August 6th). Any interest or ideas for this should be communicated to Vanessa.

Court notice

The PC has received a small-claims court notice regarding a claim from a contractor for work carried out in 2007, which he claims had been authorised. The PC is challenging the claim and the clerk will attend court if necessary. The claim is for £310 plus interest and court costs (total £450).

BRADWELL HISTORICAL SOCIETY

THE HOUSE I LIVE IN PROJECT 2011

From time to time the Officers of the Society receive enquiries from people who have connections with Bradwell. These usually come down to questions about who lived where and when in the village. Usually the best the Officers can do is to refer the enquiries to our members who have long memories of Bradwell and these seem to be the same small number of people. At a Project meeting of the Society held on 15th February it was agreed to start a project to gather information about the houses of Bradwell to which future enquirers can be referred. As a start, members at the meeting were asked to contribute any factual information and memories about the house they now live in or in which they used to live. But clearly to achieve any reasonable coverage of the village we will have to look beyond the members of the Historical Society and so we would like to extend the invitation to readers of the *Bradwell News* to supply any information about their houses. The sort of information we are seeking:

- Your name
- The name and address of the house. (Any information about how it got its name would be interesting)
- Any outbuildings
- The dates you have lived there
- The names of any previous occupants and (if possible) their dates. The names of owners may be found from deeds but it would be very helpful if the names of other occupants e.g. children would be helpful
- The date it was built. Was it built on open land or did it replace an existing building? If a rebuild do you have any information about the earlier house/building?
- If the house has been extended or modified in any other way how and when was this done?
- Have you any old photographs or documents (title deeds, covenants, wills etc) relating to the house and if so would you be willing to allow the Society to make copies to add to the archives?

These are only suggestions and readers may have information not included in this list. The rest of the Project meeting was varied with members identifying old photographs of Bradwell that had been donated to the Society. A variety of documents relating to the Bradwell Old Brass Band, the WWI Belgian Relief Fund, the History of the Memorial Hall and life in Bradwell in the 1920s and 1930s were examined. The evening concluded with lively video recordings of Betty Bancroft and Dora Wilson reading their poems about Bradwell.

TOWN BOTTOM PLAYING FIELD

We are sure that everyone will have noticed the activities taking place on Town Bottom field. What is happening is the Parish Council is engaged in removing and replacing the old play equipment, and at the same time giving the whole place a bit of a face lift. For this reason **the playing field is closed until the works are complete**. We apologise for any inconvenience, but when we are finished we are sure you will be pleased with it. So far the selected old equipment & associated soft pour has been removed. By the time you read this the ground works should be complete and all surface materials not required will have been removed from the site. Next step is for the new equipment to be installed and associated finishing work carried out. This is a major investment of your money, and the village should have a super playground for years into the future. But while the works are ongoing this is a **dangerous area** and you are warned to please stay off the field. Even after the work is complete there will be new turf, requiring that we keep off until it has bedded in and is growing properly. In particular, could parents please ensure that their children (especially cyclists) do not go on the field until we announce that it is safe to do so. We have also asked the Police to increase their surveillance of the area.

Thank you for bearing with us as we carry out what will be one of the biggest projects the village has seen for some time.

MRS PRISCILLA ANN (NANCY) ROWARTH

Nancy Rowarth died at home on 6th February aged 90 years. Born at Peak Forest she was the only child of John and Florence Hallam. She went to school in Peak Forest and then worked on an Uncle's farm. In 1937 she married Ernest Rowarth and they lived at Intake Farm until 1940, when they moved to Hazlebadge Hall. Nancy enjoyed gardening and was also a member of Abney Women's Institute for more than 40 years. With her husband she enjoyed holidays abroad, in Europe and North America. She leaves a daughter Hazel, sons David and Ernest, eight grandchildren and eleven great grandchildren. Her husband Ernest pre-deceased her. The funeral was at St Barnabas Church on 15th February, followed by burial.

MR DEREK WAIN

Derek Wain died at home on 24th January aged 70 years. Born in Bradwell he was the eldest of the three children of Stan and Rosie Wain. He was educated at the Church School before beginning a lifetime working in the Spar Mines, firstly for Ernest Dawson, then for Bill Eyre at Creswell Park and lastly at Longstone Edge. He married Christine Nowill and they lived at Brook Buildings before moving to Elliott Avenue. Derek was a keen gardener, specialising in growing leeks and onions and entering shows in the Durham area and latterly at Froggatt. He raised racing pigeons, flying them several times a year from the continent. He leaves his wife Christine, son Neil, daughter Clare, grandchildren Mia, Ryan, Nicola and Jake, sister Brenda and brother Trevor. The funeral was at St Barnabas Church on 31st January, followed by burial.

SIGHT SUPPORT

Many visually impaired people live alone, are unable to leave the house easily, live in rural areas and become increasingly socially isolated. Others struggle to come to terms with their sight loss and are unclear where to go for help. Sight Support Derbyshire has a telephone befriending service and home visiting service to help people in this situation. Particularly from a rural perspective, telephone befriending has great benefit to those in hard to reach areas of the County. Scheme Members receive either a phone call or visit from volunteers on a regular basis. The relationship which develops can reduce social isolation, increase confidence and pro-

vide companionship for both the volunteer and the member. The Befriending Service is available to service users over the age of 18 who have a visual impairment and live in Derbyshire. The project is **unable to** provide emergency, holiday or acute support but **the service is free of charge**. All volunteers receive training. If you can spare 1-2 hours a week, have good listening and communication skills, can empathise with the needs of visually impaired people, have a sense of commitment, and respect the values and beliefs of others, we would like to hear from you!
