PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

Grants - The agreed grants of £350 to the Bradwell Bowls Club for the purchase of new equipment and £1,800 to the Bradwell War Memorial Hall for the replacement of the guttering were authorised and paid at the last council meeting. Skate Park - The background work required to reach a decision regarding the installation of a skate park on Beggars Plot continues. Councillors have inspected broadly similar installations in three other local villages. An indicative design and cost for a suitable installation in Bradwell has been obtained and, in order to meet the tight timescales of the current round of grants, an application for a grant of £50k has now been submitted to Sports England. Council will now carry out further work in agreeing a suitable design, conducting noise assessments and ensuring there are no planning issues. It was agreed that a public consultation will be carried out prior to any final decision to proceed with this installation.

Bradwell Youth Club – work has continued over the summer months to resolve a number of major issues with the youth club. Interviews for the vacant Youth Assistant position took place in early September. A decision on the future of the Youth Club will need to be taken at the October council meeting.

District Council Matters – DDDC Cllr Furness was asked to ensure that DDDC mow the grass verges as per their proposed dates during September. Cllr Furness gave a further update on the significant changes planned for domestic refuse collection starting in October and stated that residents will be informed of these changes directly by the District Council. **Bradwell Brook** – The Derbyshire County Council (DCC) underwritten Community Clean-up campaign successfully removed the excess weed and generally tidied the Brook again over the weekend of 1st & 2nd September. The Brook now looks tidy again and this operation has greatly improved the appearance of the village.

Excellence in the Community Awards— A few months ago the Council decided to nominate a village group for this year's County Council Awards. This group was the Bradwell Litter Pickers organised by Mrs Janet Maskrey which, for the past few years, has been doing a sterling job of keeping our village tidy. Council is delighted to say that this group has now been chosen to receive its award at a presentation evening on Monday 15th October at The Dome in Buxton.

Playing Fields – Council has decided to investigate what grants may be available for the refurbishment of the Beggars Plot play equipment.

TEDDY BEAR CLUB

They've called him Arlo Spencer Freddie and he weighed in at just 4lbs 14.5oz. Baby is doing ok considering how early he was, but he is expected to be in special care baby unit for five weeks or so. BRADWELL 100 YEARS AGO

In August 1912 there is an extensive report of the completion of the Howden dam which reads '... the overflow - it has been overflowing for about 2 months - comes tumbling over the top of the long central stretch of the dam between the valve towers, dashing itself into spray. It is a veil of falling water, an artificial Niagara. In September the Primitive Methodist held their Harvest Festival when Norman Bradwell sang a bass solo accompanied by Parker Morton at the organ. It wasn't long after this event that the minister, John Goodacre found himself at the Revisions Court in Hope expecting to answer the charge that his name should not appear on the Electoral Register, but the claim was withdrawn before it was heard. In October the Football Club held a Whist Drive and dance in aid of Club funds. There were 26 tables for the cards and the ladies' and gents' first prizes of inkstands went to Miss Bramall and Mr Naylor. Second prizes went to Miss Hall (case of scissors) and Miss F. Kay (playing as a man; a pair of brushes). (If you want to learn who won the booby prizes you'll have to buy a copy of the Historical Society's DVD from the Post Office!). The Bradwell Schools' Council held a meeting October, chaired by Mr Z Walker, with Mr E Elliott as clerk. Mr S Evans and Mrs Friske were also present. The Council had appealed to the County against the recent rating assessment of Bradwell schools. Whilst the 'Mixed School' was going to have to find £19 5s and the Infants' School £7 10s, the Church School had not been assessed. The response from Derby was read out and it said that there were no grounds for appeal because voluntary schools were not assessable. It was recorded that the Schools' Council felt that no elementary school should be assessable, but the chairman believed that the matter could be taken no further; the rate payer would have to pay the money. In another matter Mr S Evans expressed dismay that Mr John Evans had received no payment for work he had completed on the school yard months earlier. Mrs Friske agreed to bring the matter to the attention of the authorities. On 1st November the death occurred of 61 year old Dr Joseph Nadin. Dr Nadin had retired to Bradwell from Sheffield 8 years previously on

grounds of ill health but had found plenty of practice because the village lacked a resident doctor.

REBELLION KNOLL W.I.

We are back to our usual meeting day this month so October's meeting will see us entertained by Bradwell's own Storybag, a drama company rather short on numbers, but what they might lack in numbers they certainly compensate for in dramatic expertise. They will be giving their own take on Brief Encounter, well worth joining us if you've not seen this before. Patrick McLoughlin, our Derbyshire Dales MP, joined us at last month's meeting. His talk was informative. amusing and totally non-political, and mainly centred around recent events when he was promoted from Chief Whip to Transport Secretary in the latest cabinet reshuffle, but there were numerous references to well-known people and events from the past. He had decided to enter politics following a school visit to Westminster in 1974 and became a Junior Minister for Transport under Margaret Thatcher. She initially asked him to head up the Roads Department then changed her mind and asked him to head up Aviation and Shipping despite Patrick's reminder that Derbyshire was landlocked and about as far from the sea as you could get in Britain! He worked in the Trade and Industry and Employment departments before finally entering the Whips Office under John Major and then becoming the Chief Whip under David Cameron. There's an eminently readable book in there somewhere! We have reached our goal of 290 miles in the Big Walk, Little Splash national WI initiative but, as mentioned last time, our weekly Wednesday swimming will continue. The tubs along the main road will be restocked soon with the customary daffodils and the land at the entrance to Town Bottom playground continues to receive love, care and attention. MRS MARGARET GRANGER

Peggy Granger died at home on 2nd August aged 86 years. Born in Sheffield she was the daughter of Charles and Marianne Wain. When she was 15 years old the family moved to Bradwell and she went to work at Bamford Mill. She married Joe Granger and they lived in Brook Building for five years before moving to Hill Head, remaining there until her final move to Netherside about seven years ago. Peggy enjoyed sewing, reading and making greetings cards. She leaves her daughter Linda, son Noel, daughter-in-law Sarah, grandchildren Robert, Katie and Sally and sister Dorothy. The funeral was at St Barnabas Church on 17th August, followed by cremation ay Hutcliffe Wood.

MR JOHN STEPHEN REPTON

John Repton died suddenly on 2nd August whilst walking near the cement works. He was 55 years of age and was born in Bradwell, the youngest son of Miles and Muriel Repton. They lived first on Netherside and then on Church Street. John went to the two Bradwell schools and then Hope Valley College. In 1973 he started work at the Newburgh Engineering Company. remaining there for 25 years. Some 11 years ago he was taken seriously ill and was not expected to survive or to be able to live an independent life. However, seven months later he returned home, where he had lived on his own since the age of 31 after the deaths of the rest of his family. He continued to live an active life, walking daily (often travelling great distances) and accompanying George Dawson on his deliveries all over the country. John became a keen gardener and each summer had a beautiful display of flowers in the yard beside his house. He was a skilled welder and made wrought iron objects for people. He also fitted carpets, a trade he learned from his Uncle Roy. He looked after George and June's dog, Ella while they were on holiday. He leaves his aunts Janet and Joyce, uncle Albert and numerous cousins. His parents and brother Miles pre-deceased him. Cremation

was at Hutcliffe Wood on 15th August followed by a service of thanksgiving at the Methodist Chapel.

MR ROBERT ARTHUR GREGORY

Bobby Gregory died at the Northern General Hospital on 9th August aged 74 years. Born in Bradwell, eldest son of Harold and Eva Gregory he lived in the village until 1984 when he moved to Matlock. He attended the Council School before starting work on the ground staff at Blue Circle Cement Works. He later worked on the roads for the Council before returning to the cement works, where he remained until taking early retirement due to ill health. He had been a member of the New Bath darts and dominos teams and enjoyed watching football. He leaves his brother John. His sisters Betty and Mary pre-deceased him. Cremation was at Hutcliffe Wood followed by a service of thanksgiving at St Barnabas Church on 4th September.

MRS RENA CHARLES

Rena Charles died at St Luke's Hospice on 11th August aged 78 years. Born in Bradwell the daughter of Raymond and May Charles she went to the Council School before starting work as a secretary at Hoffman's in Sheffield. She then joined her father and brother Brian when they started with their garage on Netherside. Rena married Brian Roadhouse but after their divorce she reverted to her maiden name. She enjoyed gardening, walking, reading and poetry. She leaves a daughter Anita, sons David and Alistair, grandchildren Alexander, Lawrence, William, James and Imogen and brother Ian. Her daughter Yvonne, sister Christine and brother Brian predeceased her. The funeral was at Hutcliffe Wood crematorium on 24th August.

MR CLIVE PERCIVAL FROGGATT
