BRADWELL CYCLE CLUB



On a mild weekend in July members of Bradwell Cycle Club, with John & Steve of Mister Carpet in the support vehicle and assisted by James, Landlord of The White Hart, travelled to The Isle of Man, for their Annual Charity Cycle Ride. They cycled to "Bradda" just above Port Erin,

around the perimeter of the island, up to St Patrick, then across to Ramsey, Laxey and back to Douglas - about 100 miles! The following day, two members cycled the 35 miles of the TT track. All are aged from their mid thirties to 71 years and they raised a massive £1,800, of which £800 each has been donated to The British Heart Foundation and Cardiac Risk in the Young [C.R.Y.] in Memory of Kyle Hancock. £100 each was also donated to The Cystic Fibrosis Unit at Northern General Hospital in Sheffield and The Sick Children's Trust at Sheffield Children's Hospital. PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

Council: The resignation of our recently appointed councillor due to business reasons was noted with regret by Council. The Clerk has started the process to recruit a replacement. Cllr Granger gave an update on progress with matters associated with the Localism Act and with the Parish Plan. The Parish Plan has been agreed by residents at the recent public meeting in the Memorial Hall and is now being prepared for publication. This plan will have the potential to give the village more control over its future.

Carnival: The running of Carnival was reviewed in order to note what was well done and what could have been done better. It was decided to hold a Carnival again in 2013 subject to there being enough volunteers to help, but not to hold a second Saturday event. It was also decided that the maximum spend on the Carnival should be £3,000. Cllr Granger was appointed as a member of the Carnival committee.

Youth Club: The current position of the Youth Club was reviewed. No applications were received for the Youth Leader vacancy and the position will be re-advertised. The applicant for the Youth Assistant has been interviewed and it was decided to offer the position to her. The Hope Valley Multi Agency team attended the last committee meeting and offered the services of a Youth Worker to act as Youth Leader for a limited time. The Youth Club will re-open from 04/10/12 but more volunteers are needed.

Young Achievers Awards: It was decided that the Clerk should nominate a deserving young resident for the DCC Young Achievers Award. Watch future editions of Bradwell News for further details if this nomination is successful.

District Council Matters: DDDC Cllr Furness stated that a) a DDDC domestic refuse disposal roadshow was planned for Bradwell on 08/10/12, b) the new bins would be delivered from 08/10/12 onwards and c) a collection calendar could be obtained, if desired, from the DDDC website. The Clerk is to check if one of the cuts of our grass verges has been missed.

Playing Fields: The committee reported on site inspections of the Rose Garden, the former Royal British Legion site and the Town Bottom and Beggars Plot playing fields. Action items identified will be managed by the Clerk. The committee proposed a budget of £10k p.a. either for agreed projects on council property or to build a reserve to refurbish the Beggars Plot play equipment as per the Town Bottom equipment.


Skate Park: Little progress has been made with this initiative over the past month but the application for a grant was submitted last month. Other background investigation work is still required before council can arrive at a decision. It was agreed that public consultation will be carried out prior to a final decision on this matter.

Former Royal British Legion site: Council debated what to do with this plot of land on Soft Water Lane. It was decided to establish a small working party to investigate what options are available and then to report back with recommendations.

Problems with Heavy Traffic: Following complaints from residents about heavy vehicles using narrow lanes in the village, the Clerk is to contact the DCC Highways department to ask them to review the placement of their signage around the village.

HIGH RAKE

The High Rake site owned by the Peak District National Park Authority lies to the south of the road through Windmill and is made up of a number of small plantations and grassland over



old lead rake hill-ocks and hollows. In part the plantations lie over long abandoned rubbish tips. Peak District Mines Historical Society carried out archaeological works on the site from 2000 to 2008, uncovering a rich collection of ruined mine build-

ings and other features. There are now three interpretation boards, a railed area to allow visitors to safely view the main engine house, and a bench sited on the best viewpoint. A foot-path crosses the site linking the Windmill road to the old Castleton road and beyond to Tideslow Rake. This is used by mountain bikes and horse riders in addition to pedestrians with no deleterious effect. Obstacles at each end of the path go some way to preventing motorbike access and seem to be largely successful. The grassland has been unmanaged for many years and as a result is becoming coarse and tussocky with a scattering of scrub, at the expense of the more interesting wildflowers. These include knapweed, field scabious and cowslip typical of unimproved hay meadows, and leadwort and birds foot trefoil found on lead enriched soils associated with old mine workings. It is proposed to introduce grazing on part of the site (the area bounded in red on the attached map) in late summer/early autumn to control the growth of grasses and scrub and allow the wild flowers to flourish. This will require a certain amount of boundary works and alterations to the foot-path access points (shown as black stars on the attached map). Self-closing 5 foot bridle gates will facilitate easy access for all. The National Park Authority recognises the importance of the site to the local community for informal recreation including dog walking. In order to ensure the conservation future of the site we are requesting that particular care is taken when stock are on the site. We anticipate signing the site when stock are present and tying the gates open when they are absent.
