

PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

New Councillor: We are pleased to announce that, at the last council meeting, a new councillor was co-opted to the council. The new councillor is Mrs. Lorraine Sowerby who lives in Smalldale. She has lived in the village for around 35 years, is married to Malcolm and has two sons. This brings council membership back to its full complement of ten members.

Closure of the B6049 through Brough from 3rd June 2013: Severn Trent Water's project continues, using 3 way traffic control at the Travellers' Rest to allow connection through to the main Hope to Hathersage road. Assurances have been received that the traffic lights should not affect the Carnival. It now looks like the works will continue through to the end of August or the beginning of September. More up to date information is on their website (www.enterprise.plc.uk/bradwell).

Planning Application for the Newburgh site: PDNPA report that more information is required from the applicant before it can be considered by the Planning committee. It now looks unlikely that this will happen before the October meeting of the committee at the earliest.

Bradwell Neighbourhood Plan (NP): Work on this important village project continued apace over the past month. Following advice from a planning consultant and with the resources presently available it was decided that more emphasis should be given to Work Groups 1 & 2. This is because PDNPA is likely to give more weight to these aspects of the Plan when considering future Bradwell planning applications. Representatives of the team plan to meet with the grant providers to decide what direct support (e.g. training) can also be obtained for team members. Leadership will now be as follows:-

- Group 1 – Infrastructure, Business, Commerce, Transport is to be led by Cllrs Nash and Higgs
- Group 2 – Housing, Buildings, Environment is to be led by Cllrs Salvage and Lancaster
- Group 3 – Services, Education, Employment to be led by Cllr Granger
- Group 4 – Sports, Leisure, Culture & Tourism to be led by Cllr Granger

You will have seen the NP exhibition stall on Beggars Plot on Carnival Saturday. This was intended to provide more information for residents and to encourage them to assist the team in this important initiative. If you would like to contribute to this important work and help to define the way Bradwell will develop in the future, then please contact Steve Lawless (620329). Your help would be warmly received. It is also planned to hold the first public meeting in September.

Bradwell Brook: Hopefully you will have seen the improvements to the Brook that were carried out in early July. The removal of the excessive weed was started with the help of the Probation Service and continued with great enthusiasm by the Bradda Dads. The Brook was cleared to allow this year's running of the world famous Duck Race on Carnival Monday.

Dog Mess: Council is now aware of some recent legislation

that is designed to help control the nuisance caused by inconsiderate owners who allow their dogs to foul the village. This legislation is presently being considered by councillors and will be discussed at the next council meeting.

Carnival 2013: By the time you read this article, this year's Carnival Day will have taken place. Many people have put considerable effort into the planning and preparation of this important village event and are deserving of our grateful thanks.

Financial Support for Village Organisations: The parish council has reserved a fund of money to be awarded to village organisations. At the last meeting, council decided to award a grant to the Bradwell Methodist Church to help it pay for recent expenses incurred in replacing the Church guttering and in tree maintenance. If you belong to a village organisation that is in need of some financial support then please consider applying for some of this fund. PC Chair & Parish Clerk

BRADWELL 100 YEARS AGO

Work was completed to make the Church School a more pleasant place. Lighting was improved by the placing of two windows in the north face of the School. The school rooms were brightened by redecoration and picture rails were installed around the walls. On the glorious 12th a party led by Mr FC Fairholme (Hathersage) spent the day shooting over Bradwell Moor. The party bagged 67 brace of grouse and a single hare. August 1913 saw the final successful push to establish Bradwell's own Scout Troop. Early in the month the scout master and troop from Castleton gave a demonstration of scouting skills in Bradwell. By the end of the month 22 boys had been enrolled in the new Bradwell troop, each paying 1d in subs. At the first meeting there was a session of PE and instruction on semaphore signalling. The continuing dry spell had a serious effect on the supply of water from the dams. Notices were posted round the village warning against the wasting of water. Water flowing down the Brook was severely curtailed and this allowed large quantities of 'water cress' to be removed from the stream between the Constitutional Club (Brook House) and the Bridge (100 years on the Bradda Dads have recently spent a Sunday in the same exercise). The Coronation band had an outing 'leaving Bradwell in a powerful motor char-a-banc driven by Mr Reginald Hall.' They proceeded via Windmill and Monsal Dale Head to Bakewell where refreshments were taken. The outing then proceeded to Had-don Hall but by the time they had arrived the Hall was closed for the day. They therefore returned to Bakewell where they performed a selection of musical pieces. It was further reported that 'the return home was performed in safety'.

ERNEST (CURLY) EDWARDS

Ernest Edwards died in Stepping Hill hospital on 14th May aged 93 years. Born in Bamford he was one of the eleven children of Richard and Rose Edwards. As a young child, with a mass of curly blond hair he would stand at the garden gate and passers-by began calling him "Curly", which became the only name many people knew him by. He went to school in Bamford before going to work for 4 years at Isaac Middleton's radio and electricity business in Bamford. He then spend 3 months working on the Ladybower dam before joining the Royal Navy. He served throughout the war on minesweepers and on leaving the navy worked at the Newburgh Engineering Company for 14 years. He then moved to the Derwent Valley Water Board where he remained until retiring. Ernest married Winnie Bradwell and they lived in Bradwell for 15 years before moving to Bamford. He enjoyed watching sports and working on his car. He leaves his son David, grandsons Paul and Gary and his wife Winnie. His ten siblings pre-deceased him. The funeral, followed by burial were at Bamford Church on 28th May.

MRS MARY LEIGH

Mary Leigh died on 16th June in Guildford Hospital aged 77 years. Born in Sheffield one of the eight children of Charles and Margaret Hunt, she went to school in Sheffield and then worked for 2 or 3 years as a "clippie" for Sheffield Transport. She then worked at her brother Dennis' cutlery manufacturing business. Mary married John Hoare and they lived at Netherwater Farm before moving to The Hills and then to Edgecot. Some years later she married Ronald Leigh and they lived at Hillhead. She finally moved to Batham Road where she remained, apart from spells in hospital, until about 9 months ago when she moved to Elstead to be near her daughter Susan and son Jonathan. In her younger days she was a keen dancer and skilled seamstress. She leaves daughters Linda and Susan, son Jonathan, five grandchildren, brother Billy and

ex-husband Ronald. Her first husband John and six of her siblings pre-deceased her. Cremation was at Hutcliffe Wood on 1st July followed by a memorial service at the Methodist Hall.

MR MARTIN ANDREW GRISDALE

Andrew Grisdale died on 30th June at Ashgate Hospice aged 65 years. Born at Hope, the younger son of Jim and Winnie Grisdale he was educated at Hope and Lady Manners. On leaving school he worked for a while at Firth Browns before moving to the wages department at Blue Circle. After a year or two he transferred to the works and remained there until taking early retirement due to ill health about five years ago. He was married three times, firstly to Karen Karlson, then to Anne Worthington and then to Pauline Morgan. Andrew lived in Hope until about nine years ago, when he moved to Bradwell. He enjoyed socialising, walking with his children and working on his motor bike. He leaves daughters Emma and Louise, sons Thomas, William and Joseph and his brother John. Cremation was at Hutcliffe Wood followed by a memorial service at St Peter's Church, Hope on 12th July.

PAT TIBBENHAM

It is with great sadness that we note the passing of Patrick Tibbenham. Patrick was a lifelong "Bradda" football player and supporter. He had worked tirelessly for Bradwell Sports FC all his life and was very proud of their recent achievements, for which he must take a great deal of the credit. As secretary of the Sports Club he oversaw the day to day running of the sports facilities as well as being instrumental in the organisation of fund raising. Patrick also played in the local darts and dominoes teams, was secretary of both the sports club and Bradwell Sports FC and was on the Hope Valley Football League Management Committee for many years. Our thoughts are with his family at this time.
