PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

Closure of the B6049 through Brough Severn Trent Water's project continues apace, now using two way traffic control from Vincent Works along Stretfield Road. Work in the vicinity of Vincent Works has been slower than expected over the past week or so due to the amount of rock encountered under the road surface. OPEN GARDENS

Open Gardens was a great success this year. 327 tickets were sold, twice as many as last year and £600 each was donated to St Barnabas and Methodist Churches. Publicity on the web brought visitors from far and wide and there were lots of first time visitors. There were also holiday makers who came from Durham and Peterborough. The weather wasn't perfect, but the rain just about held off. Everyone doing teas had brisk business and the plant stall did well and gave us a donation. Everyone enjoyed themselves, delighted by the welcome and the sense of community. A huge thank you to everyone who opened their garden, those who made donations and to all at the Bread shop and Ice Cream shop who sold tickets.

BRADWELL 100 YEARS AGO

A photograph of Police Constable Brown in full uniform proudly bearing his King's Coronation Police Medal appeared in the papers in September 1913. PC Brown was soon to retire after 30 years' service in Bradwell. After the close of business at Chapel-en-le-Frith police court, Seth Evans JP spoke warmly of PC Brown's service to Bradwell (and earlier at Peak Forest). By September 1913 the Bradwell Scout troop was in full swing with Scout Master L Coupland and Assistant S Bradwell. Boys were to be presented with uniforms by 23rd September after they had passed their Tenderfoot tests. On that day the 30 boys, divided between four patrols -Cuckoo, Peewit, Seal and Cat - were presented with the Troop flag by District Commissioner Col. Shuttleworth of Hathersage. In an interesting venture taking place on the Gore Lane Cricket Ground (roughly where Micklow Close is now built) the ladies of the Primitive Methodist Society of Bradwell played a cricket match against the men of the Bradwell PM Cricket Club. Despite having to bat left handed the gents were victorious by 55 runs to 42. The match was followed in the evening by musical entertainments and games when a total of £7 was raised for the 'Gas Installation Fund'. Also in September Mr Robert Dixon's haystack was found to be on fire but prompt action of villagers, ferrying water from the Brook ensured that only part of the stack was destroyed. The cause of the conflagration was unknown.



TIDESWELL SURGERY NEWS

Shingles: A Shingles vaccine is being offered to people aged between 70 and 79 years of age. Shingles is a debilitating condition which occurs more frequently and tends to be more severe in older people. We have set up a clinic on 18th September, 2013 and will be sending out letters asking patients to make an appointment. Please respond to our letter as soon as possible.

Influenza: We are having an open day this year at St John The Baptist Church Hall on 19th October, 2013 and there will be Doctors and Nurses available for patients from 10am-2pm. To receive a vaccine you must be either over 65 years or currently suffering from one of a number of conditions, including chronic heart, kidney or liver disease, diabetes or pregnancy. Pamela Mann died at Broomcroft Nursing Home on 19th March aged 87 years. Born in New Zealand she came to England when she was 20 years old. She lived in London whilst working as secretary to the author Ngaio Marsh, then moving to Sheffield where she taught social care at Sheffield University. It was there that she met Miss Berry and around 1986, upon retirement they moved to Bradwell, living here for nearly 20 years. They both then moved to Moorland House and on Miss Berry's death, 5 years later, Pamela moved to Broomcroft. She was a talented artist and her paintings used to be on display in the church during Gala week. Her only sister, Lorna pre deceased her. The funeral, followed by cremation was at St Mark's Church, Broomhill on 5th April.

MRS MURIEL MASON

Muriel Mason died on 8th August at Moorland House, Hathersage aged 82 years. Born in Bradwell, the only daughter of Lionel and Edith (Madge) Tanfield she attended the Council school before starting work at International Twist Drill at the old Comb Mill off Stretfield. After a short time she moved to Wilson Pecks in Sheffield, remaining there until 1951 when she married Alf Mason. They lived in Church Street, Bradwell where Muriel remained until about ten years ago when, due to failing health she moved first to Eyam Dale House and then Moorland House. She enjoyed reading, music, knitting and coach holidays. She leaves sons Philip and Geoffrey, daughter-in-law Anne, Grandchildren Alison, Lynsey and Andrew and great-granddaughters Jade and Caitlin. Her husband Alf and brother Clifton pre-deceased her. The funeral was at St Barnabas on 15th August, followed by burial.

MR PAUL CHARLES NICHOLS

Paul Nichols died at home on 26th July aged 74 years. Born at Stannington, the youngest son of Albert and Marie Nichols he was educated at Stannington and then Barnsley Technical College. He served for four years in the RAF and then worked for the G.P.O. on the technical side. On getting married he moved to the Blue Circle cement works, but later set up on his own as a driving instructor, and finally working at Bradwell's Ice Cream Factory before taking early retirement. He married Sandra Wilson and they lived in Smalldale for over 30 years before moving to Wortley Court. He enjoyed walking and painting and, in his younger days playing golf. He leaves his wife Sandra, brother John, daughters Anne and Paula, sons-in-law Andrew and Sean and grandchildren Harry, Max, Katie, Evie and Alice. Cremation was at Hutcliffe Wood on 7th August.
