## PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

**Closure of the B6049 through Brough:** Severn Trent Water's project continues apace along Stretfield, and will start using three-way traffic control once the works reach the Samuel Fox. As always, the weekly progress reports can be obtained each Saturday on the Enterprise website ([www.enterprise.plc.uk/bradwell](http://www.enterprise.plc.uk/bradwell)).

**Planning Application for the Newburgh site:** The Parish Council has been informed that all the required information has now been provided by the applicant. PDNPA will now start analysing the full package and will have to consult with all statutory consultees yet again. The Parish Council will let you know as soon there is any further news to report.

**Bradwell Neighbourhood Plan (NP):** Work continues with this important initiative. A training session was held on 3<sup>rd</sup> September for key members of this project team. Hopefully, you will have attended the Village Meeting on Thursday 26<sup>th</sup> September in the Memorial Hall. The objective of this meeting is for you to understand the scope and implications of this initiative and for the team to gather as much comment and feedback from you as possible. As mentioned previously, if you would like to contribute to this important work and to help to define the way Bradwell will develop in the future, then please contact Linda Granger (620416) or Steve Lawless (620329). Your help would be warmly welcomed.

**Youth Club (YC):** The Club has now re-opened and is available on Thursday evenings from 7 to 9 pm during term time, for members to enjoy the facilities. There is a vacancy for a Youth Leader at the Club, which has been advertised around the village and in the Peak Advertiser. The YC committee is seeking more volunteers to help with running of the Club. This is not particularly onerous and will involve one evening per month for two hours on a Thursday evening. If you feel that you could help with the running of the Youth Club then please contact Katrina or Steve.

The Youth Club committee has been investigating ways of raising money to cover running costs. An appeal for donations was recently undertaken and local businesses asked to underwrite individual sessions. The committee is delighted to say that the first donation has been received from Jez & Karen of the Old Bowling Green, and further donations have been offered. More information in future editions.

**Carnival 2013:** Following yet another excellent Carnival this year, council was upset to learn that a visitor to Bradwell, who slipped and fell at one of the gates to Beggars Plot, has sued the Parish Council for the injury she claims to have sustained. After discussion with the council's insurers, it appears that there is insufficient evidence to defend the claim, which will now have to be settled by the insurers.

**Playing Fields:** The annual RoSPA inspection, last carried out in May this year, identified nothing more than routine mi-

nor maintenance and remedial work. The Playing Fields & Open Spaces committee recently reviewed both playing fields and the other council owned public spaces e.g. the Peace Gardens, to ensure that all was in good order. Again, only minor maintenance and remedial work was identified, which will now be addressed by the council. Council would like to engage another person to help existing caretakers. **DDDC Car Parking:** Council continues to liaise with DDDC regarding the provision of car parking facilities within the village.

## MR PETER WILSON

Peter Wilson died on 5th July at Gernon Manor aged 85 years. Born in Hathersage, the son of William and Dorothy Wilson, he attended school in Hathersage before starting work at Marsh Brothers. After serving in the RAF he spent the rest of his working life at the Newburgh Engineering Company. He married Joan Foster and they lived in Hathersage for about two years before moving to Bradwell Head Road in May 1964. They later moved to Wortley Court. Peter was a member of the fire service for 31 years, firstly at Hathersage and then Bradwell. He enjoyed walking and playing bowls. He leaves his wife Joan and nieces Karen and Helen. His brother Thomas pre-deceased him. The funeral, followed by cremation was at Hutcliffe Wood on 19th July.

## REBELLION KNOLL W.I.

This month we're keeping it local with what should prove to be an interesting and informative talk from our very own **Kerry Davies** from **Mimosa**. Last month we welcomed **Ann Hall** to talk to us about the Iron Age Settlement at **Fin Cop**. Ann is the Project Leader of what was to become the Fin Cop Dig; Longstone Local History Group wanted to find out more about what was on the hill above their village but even they were probably a bit surprised with their findings! They gained Lottery money, hired archaeological expertise, had help from Peak Park, and, with lots of enthusiasm from the village, eventually, after two years hard graft, made a rather surprising and gruesome find. The ditch surrounding the settlement appears to be the last resting place for at least 14 bodies, all of whom were women and children; their deaths, they think, the result of intertribal warfare. Ann's enthusiastic talk inspired members to want to look at the site and we are hopeful that she will be able to take members to Fin Cop in the spring. The land at Town Bottom has responded to the green fingers of the WI, giving a lovely display throughout the summer and continuing to look good. The tubs in the village will be replanted next month.
