Mid-day supervisors are responsible for the care of the children during the dinner hour. This includes supervision of lunch and engaging with the children through play and motivational rewards. They also listen to the children read for 10 minutes at the end of lunchtime...even read to the children if they are feeling brave! Mid-day supervisors at Bradwell Junior School are highly valued as members of the staffing team; they receive training and are encouraged to bring ideas and initiatives to the school. They are also asked to give input about the well-being of the children as we appreciate the extra insight that they gain through their role. 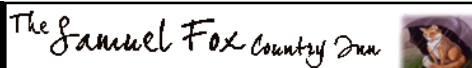

PC NOTES

Neighbourhood Plan (NP):

Following the latest Public Meeting on 2nd October, comments and feedback from residents has been considered and incorporated where appropriate into the draft policies. These policies have again been reviewed by the planning expert commissioned by the council to refine them to the level of detail required by PDNPA. Thanks to the tremendous efforts of the team, excellent progress has again been made in bringing them, and all the supporting documents, up to the required standard to take them onto the next stage in the lengthy, legally defined adoption process. Next steps are for these policies to be approved by the Parish Council and for the commencement of the six week public consultation period. As part of this consultation process, the policies will be available for public inspection on Friday 14th and Saturday 15th November in the Methodist Hall.

Youth Club:

Work continues to enable the Club to be re-opened. Assuming that a Youth Leader can be identified it is hoped to re-open in the Sports Pavilion on Monday evenings, with the first session on Monday 3rd November, after half-term. For latest information, watch for signs and posters around the village and the Bradwell Youth Club page on Facebook.

Road Signs:

Inappropriately large vehicles continue to cause damage to properties in the narrow lanes of our village. The latest problem was caused by a HGV, whose driver 'was only following his SatNav', damaging the wall of a property in Hollowgate. The wall is still screened off to protect the public until repairs can be carried out. This month two councillors met with DCC Highways officers to review these problems and to investigate what additional actions can be taken. These officers will review their findings and then let us know if further measures can be taken.

Liaison with Partner Authorities:

Council continues to liaise with principal authorities, agencies and local businesses. Examples of possible collaboration include working with DCC re nominating Snow Wardens now that winter is approaching, with the Environment Agency / Severn Trent re nominating Flood Wardens, with the Police re sharing of resources and in reporting incidents of crime and anti-social behaviour and with PDNPA on routine planning applications.

DDDC Litter Bins:

Following a consultation by DDDC and the subsequent response by the parish council, DDDC has agreed to replace a number of smaller dog litter bins with larger general litter bins. This change is designed to increase capacity (in the past a number of the small dog litter bins became overfilled) and also to increase flexibility (as general litter as well as dog litter is allowed in these bins).

MISS LILLIAN FRANCES DAKIN

Lillian Dakin died at home on 26th August aged 89 years. Born in Bradwell, the daughter of James and Hannah Dakin, she attended the church school. During the war she worked at Metro-UK in Bamford, and then after the war she worked mostly in domestic service, firstly at Birchfield Lodge (the Holiday Fellowship guest house) and then at Kelsey's family in Castleton. Later on she worked in the café at Treak Cliff Cavern and finally at the Brough works of Cooke and Stephenson. Lillian enjoyed baking, cooking and gardening, and also car trips around the Peak District with her brother Ellis, and later with her nephew Malcolm. She leaves nephews and nieces. Her sister Mary and brothers Stanley, Arthur, Arnold, Colin, Douglas, Ellis and Norman pre-deceased her. There was a funeral service, followed by burial, at St Barnabas Church on 9th September.

MR BRIAN JELLIS

Brian Jellis died on 17th August in Weston Park Hospital aged 80 years. Born in Jessop's Hospital, Sheffield he was the son of Thomas and Gladys Jellis. He attended the church school in Hathersage before going to work for Doug Turner, and then the Blue Circle cement works. Brian married Dorothy Clark from Aberdeen, who he met while on a camping holiday in the Lake District where she was working. They lived in Hathersage for a short time before moving to Hope about 10 years ago. After Dorothy died he moved to Wortley Court. Brian enjoyed playing football and fell running, and was a keen supporter of Sheffield Wednesday. Later in life he played Bowls, Darts and Dominos.

He leaves daughter Elaine, sons Michael, Graeme, Kevin and Alan, six grandchildren and one great-grandchild. His wife Dorothy and son Neil pre-deceased him. The funeral was at Hutcliffe Wood, followed by a service of thanksgiving on 27th August.

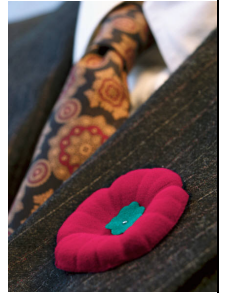
