## Parish Council Notes

### Carnival Finances

The PC Carnival Committee organised the procession and all the events on Beggars Plot playing field on the first Saturday of Gala Week.

Despite perfect weather, and the sterling efforts of Carnival Committee members, the initial unaudited financial estimates suggest that the events produced a net deficit of around £1150. This is reduced to approximately £850 when the proceeds of the Glam Rock event, which are to be donated to the CC fund by the organising group, are included.

There is no consequent impact on precepted PC funds because the old independent Carnival Committee donated £2431 to cover this year's event and this was recorded separately in the Parish accounts. But it does mean that this Carnival fund has now reduced to £1580 and next year's event will have to be structured within the reduced funding constraint.

By the time you read this, the future of the Carnival will have been considered by the full Council, but if you have views on the venue, content, cost, continuance or any other aspects of the Carnival please let us know. If there is sufficient interest we may decide to call a public meeting to further discuss its future.

### Roundabout

Many thanks to Councillor Reg. Davies, who has refurbished and re-installed the Town Bottom Playing Field Roundabout at his own expense and to Reg's wife, Angie, who made an excellent job of repainting it for free.

Reg. has reinstalled the roundabout at a lower level to overcome an objection made in the last ROSPA report. The next inspection, to be paid for by Severn Trent, is due shortly and we are awaiting the inspector's report before deciding on any necessary finishing work to the ground surface surrounding the roundabout.

### Bradda Dads' Children's Fireworks Display.

We sponsored last year's fireworks and by the time you read this the 2003 planned event will have been discussed at our September meeting.

Bradda Dads are having difficulty getting insurance cover and have asked if the PC public liability insurance could be extended to cover it.

We are in discussion with our insurers to determine the conditions, and any extra costs involved, and hopefully these will be established in time for a decision to have been made at the meeting.

## Village Caretaker

We are very pleased that Julian Frith has agreed to accept this position. He started work on clearing footpaths, tending Parish land and litter-picking a few weeks ago and will also be involved in repairing Council property, walls and fences.

## National Park Authority Tour

Around 40 members of the National Park Authority were invited to Bradwell on Friday 1<sup>st</sup> of August for a presentation of the Bradwell Village Action Plan.

The visit which was part of a wider visit of the area lasted some 45 minutes, during which the visitors were presented with the current status of the project and plans for its immediate future. It was noted that Bradwell was only the second village in the Authorities' area to complete an action plan. In addition to the benefits already achieved, the visitors seemed to be particularly interested in the way that the residents of Bradwell had been given the opportunity to become actively involved in the production of the plan. We were able to report a number of successes, this newsletter being one, but also an active environment group and a number of successful film shows staged at the Memorial Hall. Other active areas include traffic / parking concerns within the village and the Peak Park have now conducted a number of surveys to gauge the extent of the problem.

Members of the tour expressed concern that the available funds vanished all too quickly for those groups that didn't submit their applications quickly enough. Perhaps this is advice we would do well to heed.

Hot on the heels of this visit came the news that the Centenary Players had their funding application accepted, so if you are the owner of a part completed grant application, take a leaf out of the Centenary Players script and get it in while the funds are still available.

## Obituaries

**Mrs Nancy Eyre** of 11 Hallgate View died at her home on July 21<sup>st</sup> aged 73 years. She was the only daughter of Mr Joe and Mrs Lena Daniel and lived in the village all her life. She was educated at the Church School and then at New Mills Grammar School. On leaving school she went to work in Sheffield as a dressmaker, an occupation for which she was particularly gifted. After a year or two she left and went to work at the Bamford cotton mill. She remained there until her marriage to Mr Bateman Eyre who predeceased her.

She leaves daughters *Christine* and *Allyson*, five granddaughters and a brother *Ian*.

A service took place at the Methodist Chapel on July 31<sup>st</sup> followed by interment at St. Barnabas Church.

**Mr Paul Farrand** died on July 11<sup>th</sup> as a result of a motorcycle accident. He was 40 years old and the eldest son of the late Mr Thomas Farrand and Mrs Jean Whitlock.

In 1986 he married Mandy Askew and soon afterwards they went to live in Yeovil. He joined the Royal Navy when he was 16 and served with the Fleet Air Arm for 24 years until his retirement in May.

During the Falklands War he served aboard HMS Hermes; other ships he served on were The Ark Royal, Illustrious and Ocean. He saw service in the first Gulf War, Sierra Leone and Bosnia. He reached the rank of Petty Officer and acted as an aircraft director and as a fire fighter.

He leaves a wife Mandy, three sons Michael, Shaun and Ryan, mother Jean, stepfather Paul, brother Mark and sister-in-law Tracy and their children Joe, James and Laura.

A service took place on 25<sup>th</sup> July at St James Church, Yeovil followed by interment at Preston Road cemetery.
