COMMUNITY LAND TRUST

We are pleased to report significant progress with the establishment of Bradwell's very own Community Land Trust. The Trust has now been fully incorporated and is a "company" registered with the Financial Conduct Authority. Anyone can join and it costs £1 for a share to become a voting member. You can buy more shares but they still only entitle you to one vote. Membership gives you a say in how the Trust is operated and as this is a limited liability, not for profit company, your financial risk is limited to the number of £1 shares you have purchased. You only need one share, but some people have bought more. The more people that join the more representative of the village the Trust will be. To Join application forms are available from the Post Office, on our website or from the membership secretary, Katrina Lancaster - call 620446 or e-mail katrina.lancaster@btinternet.com. A Board of Directors has been appointed to take the initiative forward but Trust Members will have a chance to elect a new board at special general meeting later this year. The aims of the Trust are to build a better Bradwell through a number of projects which will benefit the village, for example affordable homes. The first job for the CLT is to work with the developers of the Newburgh site to ensure the village gains as much benefit as possible from the development, particularly through the provision of a number of affordable houses for local people. NEWBURGH SITE

The consortium negotiating to develop the Newburgh site - I.D.Planning and Scotfield Developments - held a drop-in session in the Memorial Hall on 23rd July. A large number of residents came to look at the proposed plans and to ask questions of the developers. The proposal is for 55 houses of mixed types and includes up to 12 affordable houses. We understand that a formal planning application will be submitted to Peak Park on 14th August and this will be followed by 16 weeks of consultations. This will include an additional village meeting arranged by the Parish Council once the plans are finalized so residents will have another opportunity to ask questions and raise any concerns. The outline plans shown on 23rd July are available for inspection in the Post Office and will also be exhibited in the Memorial Hall in carnival week.

PC NOTES

Carnival Planning: A Parish Council committee organises the Carnival parade and the events on the playing field on the first Saturday, together with various other activities during Carnival week. This committee is busy planning for this year's Carnival and at present all the plans are progressing well. Many village organisations put a tremendous amount of work into the preparation and running of the Carnival. We wish them all a very enjoyable and successful event.

Playing Fields Management: The independent annual playing fields inspection reports have been received, which indicate that there are no issues of any significance with the Town Bottom and Beggars Plot playing fields, their surroundings or the play equipment. Some items of low priority were noted and these will be addressed as part of routine maintenance. The Playing Fields committee carried out another inspection of the playing fields and other public spaces on 27/07/15. A number of items were identified for attention. Some additional tree maintenance on both fields has been agreed and this is planned to be completed prior to Carnival. Other items will be dealt with by council caretakers over the coming weeks.

S137 Grants: Another application has been received for a Parish Council grant. At the last meeting Council decided to award a grant of £400 to Bradwell Bowls Club towards the cost of replacing its benches around the bowling green. If your group would like to apply for a grant, just contact the Parish Clerk for information on how to apply.

Car Parking on the Former Legion site: Negotiations are proceeding with DCC Highways & PDNPA to agree changes to the conditions attached to the planning permission for the construction of this car park. Once this has been resolved, then it is planned to extend the area to be completed using tarmac and new quotations are being obtained for this work.

Bradwell Youth Club: The Youth Club committee recently met to discuss the future of the club and it was decided to re-open from 14th September until 14th December. It is planned to continue to use the Sports Pavilion on Monday evenings. Further details will be included in later issues of Bradwell News.

Neighbourhood Plan: The Community Land Trust has now been incorporated as a company. This is an important step forward in the development of the Neighbourhood Plan. Examination of the Plan by an external examiner has been completed and his report includes excellent feedback on the way the Plan was developed by the team. Some minor changes have been made to tighten up the wording to make it more legally rigorous. The next significant step will be to put the Plan to a village referendum later in the year.

Parish Council Meetings: The Parish Council always reserves a short period of time at the start of parish council and committee meetings for residents to raise matters of concern directly with council members. The notifications and venues for all parish council and committee meetings are posted in

advance on the notice boards at the Memorial Hall. Parish Council meetings are usually held on the first Tuesday of the month in the Methodist Lounge, Towngate and start at 7:30 pm

Parish Councillors: There is still one vacancy on the council and any enquiries / applications for this vacancy would be welcomed as the council is keen to fill this vacancy as soon as practicable. If you would like to become involved in helping to run the parish or would simply like to know what is involved in becoming a councillor, then please contact the Parish Clerk who would be pleased to provide background information or to just chat about the role.

PARKING ON VERGES

Several times in the past we have published requests for people to not park or drive on the grass verges in the village. Especially when it is wet this can churn up the grass and create an unsightly mess, but in some cases it can block foot-paths or force pedestrians into the road to get around the parked vehicle. It might be useful to remind residents what the law says on this:

"Footways and verges are part of the highway and **are covered by any yellow lines on the carriageway alongside them**. If you park on the footway or verge next to a yellow line you may be issued with a Penalty Charge Notice (PCN). A Penalty Charge Notice (PCN) is issued by a Civil Enforcement Officer to a vehicle or to the person appearing to be in charge of a vehicle which is believed to be parked in contravention of the council's Traffic Regulation Orders."

BAKEWELL BAKING FESTIVAL

The festival returns this summer with a new venue and ambitions to attract food-lovers from across the UK to the Peak District. First held in the town centre two years ago, this year's event is at Bakewell Showground from 14th to 16th August and organisers say they want to want to recreate the atmosphere of a country fete but on a much bigger scale. The move to the showground means festival-goers from outside the area can now stay close to the action, with a camping ticket at £70 covering Friday, Saturday and Sunday nights for a family of four, with festival entry and parking included. Early bird tickets are also available, reducing the cost of day entry from £9 to £7. Backed by the Peak District National Park Authority's Sustainable Development Fund, the festival sees the return of TV favourites Stacie Stewart and Edd Kimber and welcomes Fabulous Baker Brother Tom Herbert, Great British Bake Off stars Iain Watters and Howard Middleton, plus food blogger MsMarmiteLove. New for this year is a vintage night on the Friday in aid of the Helen's Trust charity. There will also be artisan bread makers, creative bakers and biscuit makers plus a selection of hand-picked food and drink suppliers, including cheesemakers and chocolatiers. HOME ON LEAVE

In August 1915 visits to Bradwell by 10 soldiers was recorded in local newspapers. But a connection with the village for only half this number has been possible to establish. The names mentioned but not traced were: Pte William Bellamy Royal Field Artillery (RFA), Pte Sansom RFA, Paymaster H. Fiske and Sergeant (William?) Duckworth Machine Gun Instructor 10th Notts & Derby Regiment (Sherwood Foresters). The other five soldiers were:
2999 Company Quartermaster Sergeant Walter Moorhouse 10th King's Own Yorkshire Light Infantry. Sergt. Moorhouse was formerly a tram conductor in Sheffield having joined up on September 3rd 1914. He was visiting his wife Mrs (Fanny?) Moorhouse who was residing on the Hills. In 1917

he received severe wounds, shrapnel having penetrated his left knee. It was possibly for this action that he was awarded the Distinguished Conduct Medal (DCM). The citation reads 'For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He displayed great courage and determination throughout. Later although partially buried for 3 hours he remained at duty.'

1263 Pte (later Signaller Corp) Oswald Darneley East Riding Yeomanry (ERY). 'Ossie's' home was in Hull where the family were builders, but they had a house in Bradwell. On 27th October 1915 he embarked at Southampton for Salonika but en route was diverted to Alexandria in Egypt. In 1916 120 officers and men from the ERY were detached to serve under T E Lawrence (Lawrence of Arabia) but it is not known whether 'Ossie' was one of these. In December 1916 the ERY were moved to the Suez zone to form part of an ANZAC mounted division and took part in three battles in Gaza in 1917. He was injured when his horse was shot from under him and left Egypt for England on 12th January 1918. He was medically discharged on 29th March 1918 and was issued with a blue serge jacket to identify him as a returning injured soldier. This he wore to identify him and prevent him receiving a white feather (a token of cowardice). After the war he met and married Isabella Thomson and they had three children Jean, John and Alison. Alison still lives in Bradwell in the house called Dale End.
38989 Pte George Elliott 9th York & Lancaster Regiment. George who was 31 in 1915 was living at home in Smalldale with his parents William and Marina in 1901. His occupation in 1901 was given as railway labourer.
1449 Pte William Elliott Notts & Derby Regiment (Sherwood Foresters). William who was aged 28 in 1915 was living with parents on the Hills in 1901. His occupation in 1901 was given as apprentice shoe maker.
10/1097 Pte John Darneley Petty. Jack had also been on leave in July 1915.
