COMMUNITY LAND TRUST

Wow, it seems like only yesterday we started the Bradwell Community Land Trust (BCLT) and already over 10% of the village have joined. It's important that we continue to get more of the village to join and there is a membership form with this copy of Bradwell News. Why is it important now? Well, the new planning application for the Newburgh site has just gone in and part of it will be to provide affordable housing. We want the affordable housing to be owned by the BCLT so that we can ensure it really is let to local people, that we can control the rent and that any profit is reinvested in the community. We have met with the Developer (Scotfield), Peak Park Planning and Dales Housing and they are all broadly supportive of our objectives. Over the next three months, while the application is being considered, there will be a lot of negotiation between the BCLT and these groups. We already have the Neighbourhood Plan backing our objectives and the greater the involvement from Bradwell people the more weight we'll carry. All the details are on the form, but the BCLT is essentially a limited company so your £1 membership is all you need ever pay. 

PC NOTES

Bradwell Carnival: Council reviewed the parts of Carnival week which we had organised. In summary, Carnival was considered to have been another great success. On the first Saturday the weather mainly held off until later in the afternoon. This year we were very lucky with the number of Carnival Queens, with four royalty to represent Bradwell and a total of over seventy royalty/attendants in the parade. The arrival of some new and different stalls as well as the old favourites maintained the interest and excitement on the field. The appreciative crowds greatly enjoyed the occasion and grateful thanks to all whose hard work and preparation over many weeks contributed to making the event a success. A more detailed review of the council aspects of the Carnival will be held by the Carnival committee at its next meeting. Neighbourhood Plan: The changes proposed by the External Examiner were accepted by PDNPA at its planning committee meeting of 07/08/15. This committee then decided that the Plan should proceed to the next stage - a village referendum on Thursday 22nd October, to be organised by DDDC. If the village votes to accept the Plan it will be incorporated into PDNPA planning procedures for Bradwell from November 2015 until the year 2030.

Bradwell Youth Club: The club will re-open from 14th Sept. to 14th Dec. in the Sports Pavilion on Monday evenings from 18:30 to 20:30. A programme of events is being finalised. Further details are elsewhere in the newsletter.

Meeting with PDNPA's Chief Executive Officer: Prior to the August PC meeting, a separate meeting was held with the recently appointed CEO of PDNPA, Sarah Fowler. Sarah took over the role in January 2015 and is meeting with representatives of the many parishes in the PDNPA area, to listen to their concerns and comments. She is especially keen to get feedback and opinion on PDNPA. The discussion was wide ranging and covered many topics including car parking, the impact of cycling, broadband and mobile phone communications, Bradwell street scene, the future of the Newburgh site and progress with the Bradwell Neighbourhood Plan.

Council Financial Planning: The Finance committee re-

ported on its last meeting when the forward planning of the council's finances was discussed. The committee reported on the routine year-on-year costs incurred in running council and highlighted the additional significant costs likely to be incurred over the coming 5 – 7 years, e.g. refurbishment of the Beggars Plot play equipment. The findings and recommendations of the Finance committee were adopted by council.

Bradwell Dale Quarry Piece: Council owns a plot of land in Bradwell Dale (the portion of the former Morton's Quarry nearest to the village). We considered future ownership of this land and are minded to dispose of it, mainly due to the fact that very little use is made of it and that it incurs some cost in its maintenance. Council would be interested to know if any resi-

dents have views about this proposed disposal of the Quarry or any expressions of interest in acquiring it.

HOME ON LEAVE

Sadly two of the soldiers who were home on leave in September 1915 were both dead by the end of the following year. They were Alf Petty and Lionel Middleton. Lance Corporal Nicholson (Yorkshire Dragoons) also visited Bradwell during the month and George Elliott, Percy Bradwell and Alf Truman made return visits.

2nd Lieutenant Alfred Hallam Petty 5th Notts & Derby Regiment (Sherwood Foresters). 26 year old Alf Petty, like his brother Jack, was born in Hull. Also like his brother Alf had been a school teacher, teaching for a while at Chesterfield Grammar School. Their father Mortimer ran Eton House School in Hull but the family had strong ties with Bradwell and when Mortimer received word in July 1916 from the British Red Cross that his son had been wounded it was addressed to him at Kinder Cottage, The Hills. The message said that Alf had been wounded in the thigh during the advance and had crept into a shell hole. Another wounded soldier had managed to crawl back from the hole to report that Alf was wounded and was unable to move. Alf was considered to be too close to the German lines for rescue and so was taken prisoner of war to be transferred to a German hospital. Mortimer's hopes must have been raised when he received a note from a Lieutenant Theodore Downman dated 15th July. The note in part said Alf was being well looked after. His wounds were not necessarily serious but would keep him in bed for some time. After this reassurance it must have come as a hammer blow to Mortimer and his wife Sarah Hallam Petty when they learned on 9th September that their son had died in captivity just 2 days after Lieutenant Downham's encouraging note. In 1924 Alf's body was re-interred in St Souplet British Cemetery near Cambrai, France.

7823 Private Lionel Middleton Notts & Derby Regiment (Sherwood Foresters). Lionel, who was aged 21, would have been visiting his father Thomas Middleton in Church Street. Lionel's mother Isabella had died before the war. In the 1911 census Lionel's occupation was given as apprentice joiner. The Commonwealth War Graves Commission record shows that Lionel died on 24th October 1916 of wounds received fighting with the 6th Northumberland Fusiliers in the Battle of the Somme. Not surprisingly in view of the confusion that must have reigned at the time the War Diary of the 6th Battalion show Lionel as being wounded one day later on the 25th October. Lionel is buried at Dartmoor Cemetery, Belcordel-Belcourt, France.

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN REFERENDUM

Neighbourhood planning was introduced under the 2011 Localism Act and enables local communities to write a neighbourhood plan – part of the statutory development plan – for their own area. Neighbourhood plans must have regard to national planning policy, contribute to sustainable development, be in general conformity with strategic policies in the development plan for the area and be compatible with European Union obligations and human rights requirements. A draft plan was prepared by Bradwell Parish Council, in consultation with local residents and businesses, and submitted to the Peak District National Park Authority in December 2014.

An independent examiner found that the plan, subject to modifications, does meet legal requirements and should proceed to referendum. A referendum on Bradwell Neighbourhood Plan will therefore be held on Thursday 22 Oct 2015. The question that will be asked in the referendum is:

Do you want the Peak District National Park Authority to use the neighbourhood plan for Bradwell Parish to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?

BURIAL URN FOUND

An ancient earthenware pot containing cremated human remains has been discovered by a worker repairing a footpath on the Roaches nature reserve, near Leek. Close inspection of the pot fragments may reveal where the clay came from, and C14 dating of the charcoal will help to place a date on the cremation. Study of the cremated bone will give an indication of the age, and even the sex, of the individual.
