Dear Editor

Chris Furness wrote recently about the changes at Bradwell and Hope sewage works which Severn Trent say will sweeten the air for campers at Hope without adverse effects for Bradwell.

This is a huge 18 month project. A large new pipe will be laid under most of Eccles Lane and under Stretfield. Most of the existing works at Bradwell will be demolished to install new plant with 5 times the capacity of the old one. The tankers that used to take the waste from Hope will then take it at least twice weekly from Bradwell instead of twice a month as now.

Severn Trent say that the new aerobic system will mean that the smell from this five-fold increase in throughput will be less than that from the present Bradwell plant and that disruption while the work is being done will not be serious.

A petition is being sent to Severn Trent signed by people who feel that more consideration is being given to campers and the prosperity of Hope than Bradwell inhabitants.

Surely Severn Trent could afford to hold a public meeting so that concerns can be aired and answered? If everybody is a winner from this scheme what have they got to lose?

First in 30 years

The appointment of Councillor Goodison to the Chair of DDDC (formerly the West Derbyshire District Council) is the first of a Bradwell representative since its formation in 1974.

During the 80-year life of its smaller predecessor, the Bakewell Rural District Council, four Bradwell Councillors acted as chairman:

	1938 - 1939	Cllr B S Shirt
	1939 - 1941	Cllr E Elliott
and	1948 - 1953	
	1963 - 1967	Cllr W B Rowland
	1971 - 1974	Cllr C Evans JP

They all also served on the Parish Council, Cllr Evans for over 50 years and Cllr Rowland as chairman for nearly 30 years. Cllr Elliott also served on the County Council for a while after the war and Elliott Avenue is named after him.

During the first 44 years of the Bakewell Rural District Council there were only 4 chairmen. This sequence was broken by Cllr Shirt and during the remaining 36 years Bradwell supplied the chairman for 15, including its final year in 1974.

It is interesting to note that during its 80-year existence there were only 3 female councillors.

Obituaries

Mrs Gwen Caudwell of Westwick Crescent, Sheffield and Bessie Lane, Bradwell died on August 15th at home in the presence of her family.

Mrs Caudwell was born at Bull Farm near Mansfield in 1927. She was the youngest of the three daughters of Mr Herbert and Mrs Gladys Allcock. On leaving High Oakham School at the age of 16 she worked in the offices of the CWS at Mansfield.

She met John at the Palais de Dance at Mansfield and they married in 1954. They started married life in Firth Park, Sheffield, moved to Teversal for a short time before settling in Greenhill in 1959. They bought Jack Dakin's cottage on Bessie Lane in 1979.

Gwen and John were regular attenders at St. Barnabas Church and took part in many church and village activities. In particular they organised the opening of Bradwell secret gardens and arranged publicity for the Centenary Players for a number of years. They were regulars on the Tuesday walks.

Gwen leaves her husband John, daughter Jane, son Martin and grandchildren Joshua and Freya.

The funeral took place at St. Peter's Church, Greenhill on August 23rd and was conducted by Rev. John Vaughan. Cremation was at Hutcliffe Wood.

There will be a memorial service for Gwen at St. Barnabas Church on Saturday October 25th at 11.00 am. John and family would appreciate your support at this service of thanksgiving for Gwen's life.

John Caudwell and his family would like to thank the people of Bradwell for the great outpouring of sympathy shown, as news of Gwen's passing became known. This has been a great source of comfort and eased the shock felt after her departure.

Parish Council Notes

Highways

As previously reported, Parish Councillors completed the survey of all village roads and we submitted a report, as requested by DCC Highways, listing all the repairs which we considered necessary and urgent.

Apparently Highways didn't agree with our list and have only mended the holes they thought deserving. So please don't be fooled by the new tarmac patchwork - continue to drive and walk with caution.

If you live near one of the potholes which Highways have decided not to repair, you might be moved to voice your dissent by phoning them on 01246 250108.

Lafarge

At the Lafarge / Parish Council liaison committee meeting on September 23rd it was reported that there had been some big changes in the cement market and that sales from Hope Works are expected to fall over the next 2 years, although Hope would be less affected than Cauldon Works.

Major competitive factors next year will be the commissioning of the new 800 thousand tons capacity cement manufacturing plant at the BLI Tunstead, near Buxton, works and the stated intention by Aggregate Industries to import 200 thousand tons per annum.

However, phase 1 of the new London depot - to be supplied from Hope - is still expected to open in July 2004 and phase 2 will go ahead as planned

The tyre-chip burning operation was reported to be going well, except that they are now experiencing a shortage of car and van tyres and an application has been made to the environment agency for permission to burn truck tyre chips to fill the gap. Other alternative waste fuels are also being considered.

A major review of transport to and from Hope Works has been carried out and the findings will have been reported to a special liaison meeting by the time you read this. I hope to give details in the next newsletter.
