## Obituaries

**Eric Chadburn** passed away on 26/8/03 in the Renal Unit at the Northern General Hospital at the age of 63.

Born in Rotherham Eric moved to Bradwell from Eyam in 1974 and worked for a while at Hoveringham's before moving to Blue Circle. He later worked at Stretfield Mill for Bradwell Packaging.

Eric was involved with St John Ambulance for a number of years when he took part in several competitions with them. He also helped with the scouts for a short while in the 1980's. He also bred and owned English Springer Spaniels from the 1970's until 2002. Amongst the dog fraternity he was well known both as a judge and as an exhibitor under the Trand prefix, having owned the top winning Springer in the country in 1976, which he also bred. His other main interest was playing darts and more latterly dominos for the New Bath in Bradwell.

Eric was cremated on 2/9/03 and leaves his wife, Jennifer, son Andrew, daughter Tracy and grandson Max. He was the eldest son of Maud and the late Eric Chadburn of Rotherham.

## Parish Council Notes

### Rec. or Wreck ?

The Town Bottom Rec. committee met on the field and in the Memorial Hall recently to consider possible improvements once it's been handed back to us by Severn Trent. They have received the report they commissioned from ROSPA and now need to carry out the work recommended therein before we can accept the return of the field and equipment.

ROSPA's requirements for fully reinstating the Roundabout are too onerous and expensive to contemplate and our only options are to keep it immobilised, or remove it permanently. They say that the BMX ramp is substandard and in need of repair and recommend it's removal. However it seems to be popular for climbing and sitting on - so we might consider making it more suitable for that purpose.

Now that Henry Walker has rebuilt the wall behind the shelter site we are considering extending the Netball Court over the shelter base and are investigating costs and possible grants.

Other considerations are - A wooden fence all round the play equipment area to discourage cyclists; A new fence behind the Shoulder; Repairs to the Roundabout running boards; Additional hard surface between the toilet block and the equipment area; Chasing the contractor who quoted for a woodchip trench beneath the Zipwire.

The week after our meeting, an unofficial 'wreck committee' met on the field after dark - decided that the 'Millennium' wooden seat merited their attention - and kicked it to pieces.

We'll be discussing these options again at the next Council meeting on November 4<sup>th</sup>. If you have views you would like us to consider, please contact the Parish Clerk or bring them to the meeting.

### Lafarge

At a special Parish Council liaison meeting on September 29<sup>th</sup> we were given a presentation by consultants commissioned by Lafarge to consider transport options for Hope works. They had surveyed traffic at all major junctions in the area over a 12-hour period, during which there were no movements of clinker to or from the works. The results were then compared with a similar survey carried out 20 years ago.

These indicated that the total number of all heavy goods vehicles was about the same, although many of them were carrying twice the weight. The number of Lafarge related vehicles had reduced substantially but this had been offset by an equivalent increase in other heavy vehicles. Over the period car movements had doubled and it was concluded that this was the cause of any congestion.

John Capewell asserted that they agreed with the consultants opinion that Hope works should concentrate on rail, for distribution of cement, and that capital expenditure should be

on rail infrastructure rather than road. Consequently, the possible direct road connection to Bradwell would not be considered further.

Intermodal trials - road trailers on special rail trucks - are being carried out at Westbury.

Questioned about the import and export of raw materials, Mr. Capewell stated that where possible they would be rail-borne, but that tyre chips (currently 10 loads per day), and clinker, will have to continue by road for the foreseeable future.
