PC NOTES

Playing Fields & Open Spaces:

The programme of remedial and improvement work identified following the annual RoSPA inspection and the subsequent inspections by the committee responsible for these amenities will continue over the coming months with a view to ensuring that all amenities are maintained at a good standard prior to considering the acquisition of new facilities. Although some initial work has already been carried out, the remainder is planned for the near future.

Carnival:

As is customary, a committee meeting was held shortly after Carnival to review the running of the event and to begin initial planning for next year's Carnival. This year's event was highly successful and again the weather was kind to us. Thanks are due to everyone who contributed, in so many ways, to ensure that everything went smoothly. This year we were lucky to have over 60 Queens / Royalty in the parade which contributed greatly to the spectacle. A bar was provided this year and some new acts were booked which were very well received. However, some pre-booked acts did not arrive, which left a few gaps on the field and reduced the expected income. Some 200 metres of additional bunting was provided by the council and erected by the Fire & Rescue Service. It was very much appreciated that residents of Smalldale provided their own bunting. The date for Carnival 2017 will be Saturday 5th August.

Car Parking:

The process of surveying the village, recording the findings and taking supporting photographs is continuing. Following a re-quoting exercise to ensure best value for the work to construct the car park on Soft Water Lane, the contract has been issued to the selected contractor, who has scheduled the work to commence in December. Subject to the weather, it is hoped to complete the work in December.

Youth Activities:

The committee planning activities for Bradwell young people over the coming months has made plans for a series of exciting events e.g. a night hike, abseiling, canoeing, caving, weaselling and high ropes, with each of these events limited to twelve members. The events will be provided by the Edale Activity Centre. In addition to these, the committee plans to organise additional events on a more ad-hoc basis. Speed Monitoring:

Recently the Police carried out a number of speed monitoring

exercises in the village. The results were very disappointing, in that they showed that many drivers continue to exceed the speed limit and hence risk the safety of Bradwell residents. The results of one exercise showed 77 drivers exceeded the speed limit. Following the number of recent accidents, one of which tragically was a fatality, the Police have registered Bradwell as a 'Community Concern Site' and as such will continue to monitor traffic speeds through the village at irregular intervals.

HOME ON LEAVE

A Truly Bradwell Wedding

The month of October 1916 saw a very special visit home for three Bradwell soldiers: **Private Allen Bradwell, Sergeant Stanley Bradwell and Gunner Parker Davis Morton.** They were there because Louisa, the sister of the two Bradwell brothers, was marrying Thomas Frost Bradwell. Apart from Parker (who played the organ) and Carl Smith, who was the best man (and Swiss born), this was very much an all Bradwell affair because the bridesmaids were Louisa's sisters Moressa and Myra. The bride was given away by her brother Stanley because their father John had died in 1896, but mother Nancy was at the ceremony. Other servicemen visiting Bradwell and around included Private Horatio Cooper and Private Alan Boyes.

106363 Private Horatio Wyght Cooper 3rd Battalion Notts & Derby (Sherwood Foresters) Regiment. In 1911 Horatio was living with his wife Martha (Patti) on Meersbrook Road in Sheffield. Four years later they were both living in South View, Little Hucklow, when Horatio enlisted in the Army. Horatio came safely through the war but sadly the same did not apply to his son Wilfred. In WWII Wilfred had followed his father by joining the Sherwood Foresters. He was wounded at Dunkirk and although he was brought home he never fully recovered from his injuries and died in March 1943. Wilfred is buried with his parents in the Primitive Methodist graveyard on Hugh Lane.

19176 Private Alan Leuty Boyes Coldstream Guards. When he joined the Guards in 1915 Alan was living in Gainsboro but his father George and mother Jeanne Ann were living in Woodcroft, Bradwell. Alan sailed from Southampton for France in March 1917 where he joined the Guards 7th Division. He was hospitalized in Boulogne by July that year and transferred to England in the following month. He didn't return to his division until December 1918 and then spent a brief time in France before demobilisation in 1919. Alan married Dora Hartland from Middlesbrough in 1924. He died in Doncaster in 1958 leaving Dora as a widow.

This month we have Matthew Baker and a colleague from Specsavers who will talk to us on "Eyes and Ears" – promises to be an eye opening experience! New members are always welcome and we meet in the Methodist Hall lounge, the second Wednesday of the month at 7.30pm. Last month we heard from Louise Firmstone, a Macmillan Nurse from Blythe House Hospice in Chapel-en-le-Frith. It all started in a small terraced house and with the initial inspiration of the local vicar, Betty Packham, and a number of legacies grew into a day care centre for those in their last years of life. It receives some funding from the ever diminishing government (and now local) pot but most of the money comes from voluntary contributions and fund raising. They offer a huge array of services not only to those suffering from cancer and other life threatening illnesses but also to their families and carers. Recently they started a new service for children and young people funded by Children in Need, and it was so successful they funded it again! Blythe House's catchment area is mainly in the High Peak area but extends towards Cheshire and includes Hope Valley. Services they offer are not only medical but include financial signposting, bereavement and spiritual counselling, and a range of complementary therapies, all encompassed in their Living Well Service. It is proposed we have our Christmas meal in January at lunch time and, following on from the success of our outing to London last year, another trip to London perhaps taking in Windsor Castle. Lastly, a big 'Thank you' to everyone who supported and ran our Gala Tea tent – we hope you enjoyed the vast array of cakes, buns, pastries and savouries.

GEOFFREY WILLIAM LINDLEY June 1927 – September 2016

Geoffrey married Irene Walker, youngest daughter of Mr & Mrs Percy Walker of Bessie Lane, at the Methodist Chapel where he was buried on September 16th, 2016. They celebrated their Diamond Wedding Anniversary in August of this year and have lived all their married life in Geoffrey's home town of Nottingham, where he was employed by HSBC. He leaves wife Irene, sons Richard and Edward and granddaughters Kirsty and Emily. Born into a Scouting family, Geoffrey loved the Great Outdoors and was a keen cyclist and long distance walker. He knew the Peak District well and would lead walks for Nottingham walking clubs and the 41 club. Being a prolific writer, all his walks were recorded in minute detail. He was a great admirer of L. du Garde Peach, who wrote and produced plays for the nationally renowned Great Hucklow Players. Throughout their married life, Geoffrey and Irene travelled widely, sometimes staying with friends on sugar estates in places like Kenya, Swaziland and Papua New Guinea. A keen gardener, he not only tended his own garden in Nottingham but also spent many happy hours at Millmeadow.

NEWBURGH DEVELOPMENT NEWS

The application by Camstead Limited and Newburgh Engineering Limited to carry out "Demolition of existing industrial buildings, development of 55 dwellings (C3), erection of 6 industrial starter units (B1), car parking, landscaping and drainage attenuation with access from Netherside (starter units) and Bradwell Head Road (residential)" has been granted subject to the development starting within 3 years from the date of this permission. It is also stated that "the development shall not be carried out otherwise than in complete accordance with the submitted plans" and is subject to a

very large number of conditions with which the developers will have to comply. It is anticipated that the initial work, to demolish the existing industrial buildings and construct a new, purpose built facility for the current Newburgh operations, will commence fairly soon. We will keep you updated as information becomes available. It should be emphasised that all access and egress for construction traffic for the duration of the work will be via the current main site entrance off Netherside.

This decision marks a significant milestone in the life of Bradwell. Newburgh Engineering has been in the village since 1939 and one of the key aspects of this site development plan is that it retains them as a local employer, yet utilises the currently unused space to best advantage. Newburgh Engineering is an ISO 9001 and ISO 14001 accredited contract manufacturer of precision engineering components and assemblies ranging across all sectors, specialising in the defence, oil and gas, aerospace and nuclear industries. The company was founded by Isaac Middleton and remains a family run business which has thrived through successive generations by seeking excellence in everything and by continually manufacturing the most challenging engineering components and assemblies. Although their Bradwell operation is smaller than it has been historically, it is significant that this development retains their operation in the village.

The other thing which this plan brings to the village is a sensibly sized and tastefully designed housing development. A majority of residents accept that something would eventually have had to be done with this prime brownfield site, the key has been to create a development which has sufficient size to be viable, yet not so large as to dwarf the village into which it has to be incorporated. 55 houses will bring new families into the village, providing more children for our schools, more trade for our local businesses and so much more.
