BRADWELL DEFIBRILLATORS

I'm sure everyone knows that Bradwell has two defibrillators, one sited at the Sports Pavilion and one in the telephone box on Towngate. The Sports Club and the Parish Council agreed to take ownership of these for the Bradwell community. They were obtained by Bradwell Junior Football Club using funds raised from donations, plus the donation of the defibrillators themselves from a colliery which had closed down. (They had never been used and are a great asset for the community). We now need to establish a maintenance fund to ensure that they continue to be available when needed, because the main battery pack on both machines now needs replacing at a cost of £200 each. The Bakehouse have agreed to locate a collection box in their shop, purely for donations towards this maintenance fund. Bradwell Parish Council - parishclerk@bradda.org We would also like to send an important message to the younger generation that these defibrillators, installed in their secure boxes are **not** to be tampered with as we have noticed on several occasions that someone has tried to access the boxes. These are a vital community asset which could be needed to save a life at some point in the future.

Parents, please speak to your children and help them understand how important this is!

PC NOTES

Public Participation: Six residents attended the last parish council meeting, either to raise matters of concern directly with the council or to keep informed of developments in the village. Some were concerned about their planning applications and were able to discuss their concerns directly with councillors, who then considered these concerns later in the meeting. It you are interested in attending a council meeting, either as an observer or to raise concerns with councillors, then you would be most welcome. The meetings are generally held at 7:30 p.m. on the first Tuesday of most months in the Methodist Lounge on Towngate. See the parish notice boards (on the side of the Memorial Hall and in the Peace Gardens bus shelter) for meeting announcements and agendas.

Finance Committee Report: The committee has reviewed the routine running of Council's finances and the longer term financial planning of major expenditure items e.g. renewing Beggars Plot play equipment. The committee reported that the routine handling of council finances was satisfactory and all expenditure in the half-year accounts was within the expected budgets. The five-year financial plan was on track subject to no unexpected major expenditure, and that the precept for 2017/18 would be decided at the next PC meeting.

PC Surgeries: The idea was discussed of Council holding 'surgeries', similar to MPs, at which residents could meet with councillors (perhaps two councillors per session) in an informal environment to seek information or to raise any concerns. It is possible these surgeries could be run for a trial period to see if there is interest and a proposal for them will be presented at the next PC meeting for consideration.

Playing Fields & Open Spaces: Routine tidying and maintenance of the playing fields and equipment continues as usual. The committee responsible for managing the Playing Fields proposed three separate projects to council, seeking permission to proceed. These projects are converting the basketball court on Town Bottom playing field into a secure toddler's play area, revamping the Rose Garden and finally management of the large number of trees on Council property - approximately 100 in number. Council asked the committee to produce fully scoped and costed proposals for each of the three projects for consideration at future PC meetings.

Speed Monitoring: The Police will continue to monitor traffic speeds through the village at irregular intervals. At the last exercise it was clear that a large number of drivers continue to speed through the village and over forty offences were registered. In order to help ensure the safety of Bradwell residents, the council asked the Police if they could also a) monitor the use of mobile phones by drivers and b) monitor vehicle speeds at different points throughout the village.

Town Bottom Toilet Block: District Council has now closed & mothballed the toilets for the winter months. They will be reopened around Easter time.

Street Lights: Now that the clocks have moved forward it is

even more important that all the street lights are working correctly. If you notice a street light that is not working you can report it on the County Council website. Do make a note of the lamp post number when reporting the fault.

S137 Grants: We are now over half way through the current financial year and some of the funding remains available. If your group would like to apply for some of the council's remaining S137 Grant money, contact the Parish Clerk for information on how to apply.

REBELLION KNOLL WI

Following the business section of the November meeting, where members discussed next year's programme and arrangements for the forthcoming High Peak Group of W.I.'s Carol Service, to be hosted by Rebellion Knoll in the Methodist Church on Monday 5th December at 7.00 pm, the rest of the meeting was given over to our speaker, Nick McCloud, Instead of Line Dancing we learnt about Life Saving. Nick is Hope Valley Area Coordinator Emergency 1st Responder East Midland Ambulance Service and one of eight volunteers in this area who provide cover if an ambulance is not immediately available to respond to a call. He gave an interesting, informative talk about the service and a demonstration of how a defibrillator works. He explained the differences between 111 and 999 calls and how people are now being encouraged to seek advice for ailments and medication from nurse practitioners and pharmacists to alleviate the pressure on Doctors and hospitals. Members then practised CPR on dummies, counting to 30 (mentally singing to the Bee Gees 'Staying Alive') then breathing into the patient's airway. This was followed by the obligatory cup of tea and biscuits and the members are grateful for being better informed and feeling confident in the knowledge that help is quickly available in an emergency.

HOME ON LEAVE

Among the military visitors to Bradwell around Christmas time 1916 were the following:

Mitrailleur (Machine Gunner) Norbert Selhorst Belgian Army. Norbert had served in the Belgian Army since the bombardment of Liege very early in the war. He was visiting his wife who was sharing Hill Head Cottage (the lower of the two cottages of the same name?) with Mme Vermaelen. This was not to the liking of the Bradwell Belgian Relief Committee because in their minutes the arrangement was questioned and the reason appears to have been financial. Mme Selhorst had already moved from her lodging in Moorbrook on Moorbrook Lane. The owner of the property, Mr Harries, had written to the Relief Committee to inform them that the lady was no longer his responsibility (with what sounds like a sigh of relief). Later in the war Mme Selhorst was lodged with Mrs Nancy Bradwell on Church Street. Mme Selhorst appears to have been an ongoing thorn in the side of the Committee because later their minutes show questions being asked as to who had ordered an ambulance to bring the lady back to Bradwell from hospital in Sheffield (it appears that she had been in a road accident in the city) before the bill for the vehicle could be paid. Later minutes make only an indirect reference to the affair when it was minuted that Mr Craig, the Committee Treasurer, was asked to seek a reduction of the ambulance fee 'in the circumstances'. So perhaps it was Mr Craig who ordered the ambulance but there is no evidence whether a reduced or full bill (or indeed any bill at all!) was paid.

45995 Air Mechanic 2 (Fitter) Levi Peck Royal Flying Corps. In 1911, 14 year old Dewsbury born Levi was living with his father George and mother Mary Ann on Batham's Farm. Levi was given as working as a farmer's son.

45115 Lance Corporal Stanley Benson 7th Field Ambulance Royal Army Medical Corps. In 1911, 21 year-old Stanley was living with his parents Michael and Amelia and his brothers Alfred and Harold in Urmston, Lancashire. Stanley was working as a banker's clerk in Urmston. In May 1917 Stanley Benson was wounded and taken to the 19th Casualty Clearing Station in France where he died. He is commemorated in the Duisans Military Cemetery in France. Stanley's visit to Bradwell was probably to see his aunt Mrs Grace Benson who lived on the Hills.

Mitrailleur (Machine Gunner) Auguste van Achteen, Belgian Army. Although a visit by Auguste to Bradwell is noted in a newspaper cutting in 1917 it is not known who his wife was or where she was living.

The work is part of a rolling programme to improve safety and accessibility on the trafficfree trails in the UK's first and original National Park.

RECYCLING ELECTRICAL ITEMS

Derbyshire Dales residents can now recycle small Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment at special recycling banks located in car parks at Bakewell's Granby Road, Matlock's Lido in Imperial Road and in Canterbury Road, Wirksworth. Items accepted at the banks include small electrical appliances such as irons, kettles, hairdryers and fairy lights, small electrical devices such as mobile phones and smoke alarms and small DIY and garden electricals such as drills. Recycling electrical items can have a huge impact because the precious metals they contain are used to make new components for technological equipment. People are asked to ensure all personal data is removed from electrical devices before recycling them.

JOHN BARRON ELLIOTT

John died at Whitworth Hospital, Darley Dale on 25th October, 2016 aged 82 years. He was the eldest son of Ernest and Annie Elliott and as a young child lived on Lydgate Lane in Sheffield. In December 1940 Lydgate Lane was bombed and John came to live with his Mother's aunts at the Bath Hotel, Bradwell. He was educated at the Church school and then went on to attend New Mills Grammar School. He married Phyllis McLellan in March 1958 and their only child, Jonathan was born in 1961. John was a keen gardener and was always happy to lend a helping hand to others. He leaves wife Phyllis, son Jonathan, Carol, grandchildren Jan, James and their partners, and great grandchildren Jamie and Hannah. His younger brother, George David predeceased him. The funeral was on 1st November at St Barnabas Church, Bradwell.

DAVID DOUGLAS BRADWELL

David died suddenly on October 16th at his home in Great Yarmouth, aged 73. As a boy he lived at 9 Gore Lane with his father Douglas and elder sister Gloria. His mother, Margaret Winifred Bradwell, (nee Boyes), died when he was just 11 days old and he was raised by his grandmother, Florence. He was educated at Bradwell C of E School and Hope Valley College. For a short time after leaving school, he worked at Proctor's Nurseries in Bamford before moving to Earle's, where he continued to work until he retired. His 4 children were born in Bradwell and the family home was in Batham Road. Great Yarmouth had always been a favourite holiday destination for the family and it was here that David spent the last 16 years of his life. He had many good neighbours and friends and enjoyed spending time in their company. He was an avid Sheffield Wednesday fan and was very interested in the history of World War 1 and 2. He leaves daughter Claire,

sons Kevin, Darren and Carl, eight grandchildren, two great grandchildren and sister Gloria. The funeral service was on November 9th at St. Barnabas' Church, followed by burial alongside his mother in the churchyard. Donations were in aid of the Royal British Legion.
