Any young people living in Bradwell will qualify and the aim of the group is to *promote team working skills and improve confidence levels*. These activities have included caving, abseiling, weaselling and canoeing, and the next planned activity is "high ropes" at Edale Youth Hostel on 25th September. There is then a night hike on 30th October to get into the Halloween spirit. The canoeing brought out their competitive spirit, as well as raucous laughter, and a few interesting songs! We are now working with Edale YH to provide an activity each month, with the exception of August. This is where new members have a chance, because during the winter months we might be able to increase our numbers. PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Carnival: As is customary, a committee meeting was held shortly after Carnival to review the running of the event and to start the initial planning for next year. This year's event was highly successful and again the weather was kind to us. Warmest thanks to everyone who contributed, in so many ways, to ensure that everything went smoothly. Thanks also to the Bradwell and visiting Royalty, and to the many groups and organisations for their floats, which contributed greatly to the spectacle of the parade. A bar was provided this year by the CLT. Three village groups organised and benefitted from the street collection taken during the parade and many of the village businesses enjoyed the extra trade generated on the day. Detailed planning of Carnival 2018 will start in January and if you would like to become involved in the planning please contact the parish clerk.

Community Resilience committee: A supply of sandbags and Floodsax are now in the Flood store at Town Bottom, together with other equipment for use in emergencies. The grant money promised by the Environment Agency to cover the cost of these items has been received and a further grant application has been made to DCC to cover additional agreed items of equipment.

Playing Fields and Open Spaces committee: A number of different projects are presently being considered around the village. Some initial work has been started in the Rose Garden and quotations have been received for the remainder of the project. These will be considered by council at their September meeting. At the Peace Garden further work is planned to open up the access by undertaking some tree work. Quotations are being obtained. Work is planned to improve the playing surface of the basketball court at Town Bottom and work is expected to be completed in the near future. The management of the c. 100 trees on council property is being reviewed and some work will be undertaken over the winter months.

Youth Activities: The programme of events organised by Councillor Sowerby and delivered by the YHA Edale Activity Centre has continued over recent months. The most recent activity was a canoe / rafting event at Coombs reservoir and future planned activities are a High Ropes event on 25th September and a Night Hike on 30th October. Further events could also be planned for later this year. A programme of events is being planned for the coming year so watch out for posters around the village.

S137 Grants: Council has topped up the fund of money available to award as grants to village groups / organisations and can now consider applications for financial assistance. If your group would like to apply for a Grant please contact the Parish Clerk.

HOME ON LEAVE

The servicemen to visit Bradwell in next group to be described were:

265337 Corporal Charles Clarke Hallam 2nd Battalion Notts & Derby (Sherwood Foresters) Regiment. In the 1911 census Charles was listed as a 33 year-old rural postman living at Yard Head with his mother Emma (father John had died in 1896). Charles enlisted in February 1915. He left the army in 1919 a year after the death of his mother. He was living on Netherside when he died in 1942. In the parish of St Barnabas' record of Baptisms for 22nd March 1878 his first name appears as 'Giles' but perhaps this is a transcription error.

2nd Lieutenant Arnold Henry Mason 4th Battalion King's Shropshire Light Infantry. Perhaps Arnold could be considered to have had one of the most distinguished careers of all of the wartime visitors to Bradwell. His father William Henry Mason was the Primitive Methodist Minister in the Manse on Brookside throughout WWI. Arnold had been born in March 1885 in Birkenhead, then lived in Cheshire, where his father was minister; his mother was Elizabeth Ann (née Gerrard). By 1911 William's ministry had taken the family to Ludlow, but sadly Elizabeth had died in 1905. In the 1911 census Arnold's occupation was stated to be artist (painter). By the time he enlisted as a private in the Artist's Rifles (London Regiment) in November 1914 he had already acted as an assistant to Sir William Richmond in the internal decoration of the Old Bailey. But it was to be as a portrait painter that he made his reputation. One of his first portraits was completed in late 1918 when now as 2nd Lieutenant he was in hospital in Blackpool. He painted a portrait of Mrs Hearn the wife of his adjutant. While in hospital and believing he might die he married his nurse Nora Settle (to save her from being sent to the front?). The marriage was destined not to last and divorce proceedings were begun in 1920. After the war he joined the Slade School in London and thereafter his reputation grew until he was elected to the Royal Academy (RA) in 1951. He died in 1963 and a notice of his death and cremation, in Mortlake crematorium appeared in the *Times* that year.

LESLIE SPENCER BRADWELL

Leslie died on June 12th, a few weeks before his 94th birthday. He was the second son of Thomas, a local butcher and grocer, and Louisa Bradwell of Towngate. He attended Bradwell C of E School, leaving at the age of 14 and started work at Earles Cement as an office boy. During the Second World War he was as a wireless operator in the Royal Navy and was one of the last living survivors who served on board the R.N. battle cruiser H.M.S. 'Penelope'. After the war, he returned to work in the offices at Earles Cement. He leaves a son and three daughters, grandchildren and great grandchildren. His

wife, Barbara, predeceased him. The funeral was on July 6th and donations in memory of Les were for Water Aid UK.
