County Council have published plans for big changes to all public library services in the county. The one most affecting Bradwell would remove the monthly Thursday afternoon mobile library van. Instead, the places it currently visits are invited to think how an unspecified "community organisation" could provide some kind of substitute, using "shops or post offices", or establishing "limited collections of library resources located in community settings".

There are focus group consultations at various places, including one at County Hall, Matlock, on July 11, from 8-10pm (a ticket must be booked before attending). The consultation finishes at the end of July and there is more information on the County Council's website.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Carnival: Planning of Carnival continues. The annual removal of rubbish and weed from the Brook is planned for 30th June and 1st of July, in advance of Carnival. The removed debris will be put on the hardstanding near the toilets for a few days prior to it being removed and the area cleaned. This clean up will facilitate the Bradda Dads' famous Duck Race. We are still looking for more helpers for Carnival, especially on the day. If you can help in any way please contact the Parish Clerk on parishclerk@bradda.org or come along to our next meeting - advertised on the village notice boards.

Council Finances: The council's 2017/18 accounts have been approved by the internal auditor. Council has approved the overall Governance and Accounting Statements, and these have been posted on the village website. PKF Littlejohn have been appointed as External Auditors to review the accounts and it is expected that this audit will be completed by the end of September.

Grass verges: Unfortunately, the grass verges in and around the village are very overgrown. The council has been in touch with Derbyshire Dales District Council, who are responsible for cutting the grass and they have promised to get to it as soon as possible. We have been advised that they will catch up on the backlog of cutting and maintain the scheduled cuts for the remainder of the growing season.

Toilets at Town Bottom: Discussion continues with Derbyshire Dales District Council on the future of the toilets. There are a number of issues that need to be resolved before the running of the toilet block can be considered by the Parish Council. As soon as the outstanding issues are resolved the future of the toilet block can be determined.

New Councillor: As previously stated there is still an opportunity to join the Parish Council. Notices have been posted in the village advertising the vacancy. If you are interested in joining Council please contact the Chair, olrdown-ing@bradda.org or the Parish Clerk parishclerk@bradda.org. This is a great opportunity to join a proactive council and we would welcome a new member to the team.

Car parking: Please be aware that there is still a space available for rent on the Softwater Lane car park. If you would like to rent this space please contact the Parish Clerk on parish-clerk@bradda.org. The space costs £25 PCM which can be paid monthly or yearly.

Public Participation: Residents continue to attend council meetings to raise matters of concern directly with Council. We welcome members of the public at main Council and all committee meetings. Council meetings are generally held at 7:30 p.m. on the first Tuesday of most months in the Methodist Lounge on Toggate. See the parish notice boards (on the side of the Memorial Hall and in the Peace Gardens bus shelter) for meeting announcements and agendas.

FRANK WYTKIN

Frank passed away peacefully on 27th April in Stepping Hill Hospital at the age of 91. Born in Poland he was 13 when WW2 broke out, and when Germany invaded Poland he was put to work on the farms. After the Russians arrived he escaped with an Italian couple to Italy where he joined the Polish army. When he first came to England, he lived in Lincolnshire and then in Chapeltown, near Sheffield. Once he could prove that he had obtained a job, he was allowed to leave the Polish army and, in 1946 he found work with the Rowarth family at Hazlebadge farm, where he stayed for 2 years. In December 1948 he started work at Earles Cement, where he was to remain for over 40 years, retiring at the age of 63. Frank enjoyed playing dominoes and until fairly recently was a member of The White Hart team. His main interest was his huge and immaculate allotment (which he always referred to as his "garden") where he grew a wide variety of vegetables, fruit and flowers. Frank's first marriage, to Peggy Bradwell with whom he had 4 children, ended in divorce. His second wife, Nellie Tattersall, to whom he was married for 26 years died in 2012, a fortnight before the death of his son, Alan. He leaves daughters Ann and Kathryn, son Stephen, 7 grandchildren and 7 great grandchildren. The funeral was at the Methodist Church on 14th May, followed by cremation at Grenoside Crematorium.



BRADWELL EDGE BRIDLEWAY/FOOTPATHS

District Councillor Furness explains what is happening up on Bradwell Edge.

The project started with an idea I had, about 15 years ago, when I first "discovered" the old Holloway, (ABC on the map), which zig-zags up the Edge. It was part of the main road from Bradwell to Abney before it was cut off by the 1819 Enclosure Awards (when Brough Lane was created). It was the only public road out of Abney before 1819. The Holloway was replaced by the present bridleway. The lower part of this bridleway has become hazardous and badly drained. It is also frequently used by mountain bikers (legally), with risks for walkers where there is insufficient width for passing. My idea was to clear the Holloway of vegetation, give it a decent surface and drainage, and divert the Bridleway through it. The Bridleway section (ADCE) could then be re-designated as a footpath (cyclists excluded) which would allow steps to be constructed in difficult sections. Mountain bikers would be restricted to the Holloway route. I first discussed this with the Parish Council and they agreed to support, in principle. I discussed it with the former owner, who agreed to go along with the proposal but not pay for it. I then approached DCC, and a site visit was arranged which ended with a promise from DCC to carry out the work and repair the whole of the remaining bridleway. However, they said that the present bridleway (ADCE) was not aligned with the map and that the Bradwell PC must first re-align it before the legal process could start. So the Parish Council caretaker cut through vegetation to create the new alignment. Then, DCC announced that they did not have the money to do the work but would press ahead with the legal process. Years have passed, I'm told the legal work has now been completed and DCC say they have £10,000 to spend on groundwork. The new owner, Alan Ridgeway is keen to see the project completed, has already cleared the vegetation from the Holloway and is also prepared to do some of the widening on the upper part of the bridleway. On March 22nd I met with Peak Park and DCC officers and this is what they said:

"DCC hope to start work on the newly created bridleway and footpath this summer, but it's more likely to be Spring/Summer next year." Peak Park will endeavour to provide volunteers to help Alan with his clearance and widening work. The DCC officer said he would check if DCC own the top end of Edge Lane, between the house and the stile. If they do he will ask DCC road maintenance department to repair the surface and drains. He hoped that work on this would also start this summer but it is more likely to be next year. There is no promise of steps on the difficult parts of the new footpath but I'm hoping they can be included, once work starts. There is nothing in writing and no promises (only verbally stated intentions) but it would be good to have a safer, easier, path up the Edge to Rebellion Knoll. 
BRADWELL AND EYAM SURGERY
