#### **CARING FOR YOUR WOOD BURNER**

It's amazing what you learn by having your chimney swept. Like many other residents, we have a wood burning stove and have just had the chimney swept after several years of operation. The highly professional engineer did far more than I expected, dismantling and cleaning the whole fire in addition to sweeping the chimney. Did you know there is a baffle plate at the top of the fire which you are supposed to clean periodically (about every 6 months)? Did you know that it is good to keep your fire door open during summer when the fire is not in use? This allows warm air to circulate up the chimney and prevents condensation dropping down the chimney and corroding the baffle plate. It is best to have the fire serviced at least every year or so, depending on frequency of use so it can be kept running at peak efficiency and reduce its effect on global climate. p.m. on the first Tuesday of most mPARISH COUNCIL NEWS Annual Parish Meeting:

The meeting, in the Methodist Hall on 30th April, was attended by residents, local organisations /businesses and representatives of principal authorities. The meeting reviewed work carried out by Council during the year, and was followed by reports from our district councillor, the Fire Service and Peak District National Park Authority. This was followed by presentations from organisations who received grants through the year, and issues of local interest were discussed.

#### **Annual Meeting of the Parish Council:**

The last council meeting was the council's "AGM". Cllr Downing was re-elected as Chair & Cllr Higgs was re-elected as vice-Chair. Council then appointed Chairs to all committees. As some committees have been amalgamated the terms of reference need to be amended. These changes will be reviewed in the June meeting and adopted if passed by Council. Council policies were review and adopted.

#### 2019 Parish Council Elections:

As there were seven nominations for the ten parish council vacancies, all nominees were duly elected. At the last Parish Council meeting an applicant for the council vacancy was interviewed and co-opted onto council. This filled one of the vacancies on the council. The new councillor is Peter Wallis, who is also actively involved in Bradda Dads. We welcome Peter as our new Councillor and look forward to him making a positive contribution to our activities. #### **HOPE VALLEY COLLEGE NEWS**

There have been some changes at HVC. A new Principal has been appointed after a rigorous selection process. She is Mrs Gaynor Jones and she will be joining the school in September, following the retirement of the Acting Principal, Mr Paul Dearden. Mrs Jones is currently the Director of the Sheffield Teaching School Alliance (STSA), which works with over 100 schools across Sheffield and the Peak District to provide training and support to teachers and schools.

The Regional Schools Commissioner, John Edwards, has confirmed that the school will join Chorus Education Trust, a local multi-academy trust serving South Yorkshire and North Derbyshire. Chorus was founded by Silverdale School, an Ofsted-rated 'Outstanding' school in the south-west of Sheffield, where some Hope Valley students often go on to join their sixth form. Steve Dawson, Chair of Hope Valley College's Board of Governors said, "The Board of Governors has been investigating potential Trusts for some time, to ensure the school can benefit from being part of a larger organisation, but without losing its unique identity. We chose Chorus because it shares our school's values, recognises our place at the heart of the local community and is committed to maintaining our school's unique offer." Chorus will be holding an evening for parents and carers in the local community in the coming months, so everyone can meet their team and Mrs Jones. We understand that further details will be publicised shortly.

#### **WILLIAM ROY BAKER**



Roy was born at Brewood, Penkridge Staffordshire on 13<sup>th</sup> February 1931. He was the third child of Dick and Victoria Baker, who moved to Brough after Dick obtained work on the construction of Ladybower Reservoir. Roy, with his 5 siblings, David, Audrey, Pat, Peter and Robin, lived at Brough Cottage. On leaving Bradwell School at the age of 14 he began work on Woodall's dairy farm in Brough, but better money and shorter

hours beckoned at Earle's Cement, where he became the ganger in charge of kiln repairs. In 1960, whilst on holiday in the Isle of Man, he met 19 year old Barbara, from the Wirral and they married the following year. They settled in Pindale, where they brought up their 3 sons. Roy cultivated vegetables and raised hens on land surrounding the cottage. He won many prizes at local horticultural shows and was well known for his successes at Hope Show. He also grew produce for various markets. After leaving Earle's Cement, Roy obtained a job he adored, with the Ministry of Agriculture, as pest control officer for Derwent Valley Water Board, looking after an area of 13,500 acres. His last job before retirement, was at Sickleholme Golf Club, where he spent 17 happy years as head Greenkeeper. In retirement he was always in demand for various gardening jobs and he had a regular slot at Hathersage WI market, where he sold his home grown produce. He was a talented darts player and played for various teams in the district. In 2002 Roy developed throat cancer. Although the treatment was extreme he managed to drive himself to Weston Park Hospital each day for 6 weeks for radiotherapy. His wife, Barbara died in 2016 after 5 years of ill-health, during which time Roy did his best to look after her. Roy died in the Northern General Hospital on 18th April, following the return of the pneumonia from which he had suffered the previous November. The funeral was on 7<sup>th</sup> May 2019, followed by burial in the churchyard. He leaves 3 sons, Ken, Chris and Paul, grandchildren Alfie, Helen and Richard and brother, Robin.

By the end of the project there will be twelve affordable units on the site, dispersed between 43 open market houses of various sizes. Owned by Bradwell CLT, the intention is to provide long term, affordable, stable living accommodation for local families into the future.
