PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

2020/21 Council Precept: For the coming financial year a proposal from the Finance Committee to the January Council meeting that the precept should be increased by 3% to £51,465 was approved. This figure was calculated by reviewing and updating the five-year plan which was established by the Parish Council some time ago. The increase has been kept to a minimum bearing in mind the extra responsibilities that come with running the public toilets, which are now kept open all year instead of just for the summer months. Some other projects in work during 2020 are the provision of additional parking in the village and providing adult excercise equipment in the playing fields. More details of these will be communicated in the coming months as the projects develop. The precept is the amount of money requested by the Parish Council to operate its responsibilities for the village. It is collected from you by the District Council (DDDC) as one of a number of charges (e.g. Police, Fire) which are included in

your overall council tax. \$137 Grant Fund: Council awarded a grant of £150 to St Barnabas Church for the cost of servicing the church clock. Council also awarded a grant of £250 to FOBS, to be used to engage the local school children in the Bradwell Swift Project. Waste management contract: Council were advised by District Councillor Furness that Derbyshire Dales District Council (DDDC) have awarded the new waste management contract to Serco, who are the existing contractors. The new contract will be more expensive and to offset this DDDC have confirmed that there will be an annual charge of £50 per bin per year for garden waste collections. Residents will have to opt in to the service and will not be obliged to take part. DDDC are purchasing new waste collection vehicles as part of the new contract. As they are specifying the vehicles the plan is to get the correct sizes to go around the village. This means that they can get more bins to households which are currently using bags. More details will be advised when available. Parish Council Vacancies: Council are still looking for people to fill the current vacancies. If you are interested, please do come to one of the monthly meetings to see how Council operates, or for more information, contact the Council Chair Cllr Downing at cllrdowning@bradda.org or the Parish Clerk at parishclerk@bradda.org. This is a great opportunity to join a proactive council so please consider joining the team. Car parking: There are some spaces available to rent at Softwater Lane Carpark. Samuel Fox to Stanley Bradwell 1894 - 2019. The life span of a Bradwell Charity

2019 saw the demise of the Fox Noblett Bradwell Charity Trust after 125 years. It had been established in the Will of Samuel Fox in 1889 as the Samuel Fox Bradwell Trust. The Trust came in to being in 1894, as Fox's Bradwell Charity with a Deed signed by the 10 original Bradwell Trustees and capital of £12000 (around £1.5 million in today's values). The terms of the Will were that the capital must be totally invested in Government Securities, with the interest being distributed monthly to Bradwell residents who were in poverty and distress, plus a Christmas bonus. The number of beneficiaries was generally around 50 persons and even in the 1950s and 60s it was never less than 40 persons. Unfortunately, whilst Government Securities retain their face value they do not allow for inflation, so the real capital value has fallen drastically over 125 years. It would have been a very different story if the capital had been invested in property, and if it had it is likely that the Trust would still be thriving. Unfortunately, the Trustees had no choice in the matter and had to abide by the terms of Sam Fox's Will. Consequently the payments in recent years, which had once been a very valuable monthly addition to the beneficiaries' incomes, and kept many of them out of the workhouse, had become a relatively small quarterly payment. In 2018, with the capital standing at about £23,000, the Trustees decided to wind up the Trust, but before they could do that they had to either find a suitable home for the funds or hand them over to the Charities Commission. It had to be a local Charitable organisation which would carry out the intentions of Sam Fox's Will. There was no local charity which exactly conformed to the conditions, but it did prove possible to persuade the Charities Commission that the Bradwell War Memorial Hall Trust would be able to put them to good use for the benefit of residents. Sadly Stanley Bradwell, who had been a Trustee for around 50 years and was the Trust's Chairman for around 30 years, was too ill to make the final winding up meeting but Chris Furness, who was also a trustee, shepherded through the transfer of funds, which have now been formally received by the Hall Trustees. The £23,000 will be used to enhance the hall for the benefit of all residents of Bradwell and grateful thanks are due to the F&N trustees for their help and support in making this happen.
