It costs us over £90 each month to print and deliver a copy to every house in Bradwell - over 700 copies. We are part of Bradwell Village Action group, but are independent and must meet our own costs.

Our volunteers don't claim anything for preparing the paper and getting it to and from the printer, or chasing up advertisers and contributors, or delivering it to you.

Selling advertising and copy space meet about 80% of the cost. We have been lucky to find sponsors to make up the deficit. We get no other financial help.

We rely on you to give us news to print. We try to print what you write, but we have only limited space and sometimes have to edit. We cannot afford to reduce our advertising or to produce extra pages frequently, but we are prepared to publish original copy, if necessary. We will consider anything of local interest, especially from, or about children, or family events.

PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

Countryside Rights of Way Act (CROW)

This new legislation comes into effect on September 19th and has some interesting local implications for walkers. Areas, which will become more accessible, include Deadman's Clough, Pindale, Intake Dale and parts of Shatton and Abney Moors.

Deadmans Clough is the little wooded valley surrounding the old disused Bradwell Reservoir, which the Parish Council used to manage, on behalf of the RDC, until responsibility was taken over by the old Derwent Valley Water Board - later merged into Severn Trent Water. The only current footpath crossing this new access area is the Edge Lane-Abney path, near the top of the Edge, but there is no stile or gateway to the Clough from this path at the moment. The lower part of the Edge footpath has recently been realigned and widened by the village caretaker and is now much easier to walk.

Peak District National Park is responsible for enabling access to the new areas and is discussing the creation of new stiles and footpaths with landowners and DCC Highways Department.

Boundary Stone

A replacement Parish boundary-stone has been placed in position, by Reg. Davies and Julian Frith, near the bottom of New Nook lane. David Wilson discovered the site of the old stone about 3 years ago, following discussions he had had with Wilf Cusworth. A stone-laying ceremony has been arranged, which David and Mrs. Cusworth will attend.

Fifty percent of the cost of the new stone is covered by a grant from the PDNPA Archaeology Department.

Dog-mess

We are still getting complaints from residents in various parts of the village and would again ask owners to collect free bags from the Post Office and make use of the dog-bins we have placed in strategic positions. District Councils now have greater powers to apprehend and prosecute offenders but we would prefer persuasion rather than requesting their wardens to patrol the village, and we hope they wont be necessary.

Please let us know if you think your area would benefit from the installation of a new dog-bin.

The Brook

We consider the weed to be a serious problem and have asked the Environment Agency to look at ways of removing it permanently. In past years Bradda Dads have cleared it, to facilitate the Duck-race, and we have made a contribution to their funds in appreciation, but they now feel that the current state of the Brook would make it a health risk for their members. Consequently there will be no further Duck-races until the Environment Agency can be persuaded to take action.

The general view is that the stream bed needs to be dredged to remove the silt, which has built up and created a root-base for the weed.

BMX Ramp

This piece of Town-Bottom playing field equipment has been well used, although not often for its original purpose.

ROSPA classified it as medium/high risk on their last inspection but the modifications and repairs they say are necessary would not be viable and, since it is vulnerable to arson, we decided to authorise the Parish Clerk to arrange for its safe disposal.


