Parish Council Notes

Affordable Housing

In response to a letter, published in the tast newsletter, I've been asked to make it clear that the PC have no powers to provide or operate 'affordable housing'. The only type of housing, in Bradwell, which can be described as affordable for first time buyers nowadays is that provided by Housing Associations, such as the 12 new 3-bedroomed houses planned for Michlow. According to Northern Counties Housing Association, a 50% share can be purchased in one of these for £37,500.

We try to maintain the village stock of these heavily subsidised Association homes in their original form, by opposing major alterations and extensions, because we believe they should be kept within the reach of those for whom they were originally intended. The final decision is, of course, made by the Planning Committee at PDNPA.

Co-incidentally, I've just been elected to the new post of 'lead member for affordable housing' in the Peak Park, with a brief to work with planning officers and housing providers to develop and present the Authority's position on this topic.

The situation in Bradwell should be an interesting first case-study. Youth Committee

Jeancue Jewell presented the initial proposals from the Young Peoples forum, which had met for the first time recently, at the Parish Council meeting on October 5th. It was unanimously decided to form a PC Youth Committee to pursue these proposals and £370 was allocated to a fund to enable some of them to be realised asap. Two Councillors (Paul Richardson and Ashley Briggs) joined the committee, which now includes 6 adults.

Dead Man Weds

is the title of the Johnny Vegas comedy drama which has been filmed in Bradwell, Castleton, Darley Dale and Manchester. The first episode will be shown on all ITV regions on Wednesday January 5th at 10pm. The other 5 episodes will follow at weekly intervals. Other main actors involved are Dave Spikey, Keith Barron, Paul Copley, Michael Brandon, Alan Rothwell (Coronation St. original). Tim Healy, Angus Barnett and several others from current TV sit-coms.

Not to forget our own Billy Young, whose autograph was in great demand.

Evelyn Medical Practice

Dr. Hutchinson attended a meeting of the Hope Valley Parish Councils Association on September 24th to give an update on proposed changes to the practice. He said that planning permission had been granted for conversion of the industrial unit at Hathersage station into a new Health Centre and that work should start in the next few weeks. It will comprise a waiting room, reception, 2 consulting rooms and a treatment room. There will be parking for 8 cars, including staff. Hope will still be the main surgery but Hathersage will operate on 5 mornings and 2 afternoons per week – appointments only. A super-highway broad-band connection is planned which will give access to hospital records and facilitate instant booking of hospital appointments.

The branch closure procedure is currently being discussed but no branch surgeries, including Bradwell, are expected to continue beyond the short term. A prescription delivery service is being considered.

Saturday morning emergency surgertes at Hope will cease after December 1st, when the new NHS fout of hours' service begins. A special phone number will be provided for fout of hours' treatment.

The 'Eyam Practice' Bradwell surgery will not be closing.

Mr. Eric Andrew of Bamford, died on 14th September, in Ashgate Hospice, aged 75 years. He was born in Bradwell, the eldest son of Mr. Fred and Mrs Sarah Andrew and lived in Church Street and later at Barham Road until his marriage to May Slack of Tideswell, who died last year.

He spent all his working life with the Forestry Section of the Derwent Valley Water Board and later The Severn Trent Water Authority.

He was a Model Railway Enthusiast and enjoyed gardening and Big Band Music

The Funeral Service and Cremation took place at Huteliffe Wood on 20th September 2004.

Mr. Alfred Thompson of Wortley Court, died in Stepping Hill Hospital on 26th September, aged 92 years. He was the eldest of the seven children of Mr. and Mrs. B. Thompson of Bamford. He spent his working life, firstly with the Derwent Valley Water Board, and later at the Blue Circle Cement Works. During the War he served in the Royal Navy from 1943-1946.

So if you live in the county (including in Derby City) and are aged 60 or over or are disabled. Gold Card will give you half fare or free travel - depending on which card you qualify for - and discounts at over a thousand local shops and services.

Gold Card replaces the old-style Derbyshire concessionary bus pass but with the added benefit of being a discount eard.

The new Gold Card is a modern and attractive photo card, reflecting a much more positive image of older or disabled people. It is more hard-wearing than the old cardboard pass, and it's a handy wallet size too!

It is not a credit or debit card and very simple to use. To claim your travel or shopping discounts just show your Gold Card when you board a bus or buy a train ticket, or to the retailer or person providing you with a service.

If you think you're eligible for a Gold Card and still haven't got one it's not too late!

Application forms are available from local district/horough council offices, libraries and some post offices, including Bradwell.

Bradder Hat

Could you please put out a request for any information, photos, stories or takes about the Bradder hat, hat making equipment or lead mining in general. The "bradder" was a pressed felt, or leather hat worn by Derbyshire Lead Miners. The hat was domed with a round brim, the miners would be guided down the mines by the light cast from the candle stuck to the front of the Bradder with a blob of clay.

The bradder was a style used in Cornish tin and lead mines brought to Bradwell by the Cornish immigrant miners and engineers, brought in to drain the mines of water using engines.
