PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

Newsletter Editor

Many thanks to Clir. Spencer Cooke, who, as a member of the VAG, has acreed to take over the role on a temporary basis.

Christmas Lights

We'd like to place some seasonal decorations on Netherside this year, as well as illuminating the Peace Garden tree. Funding has been agreed and we'll be having discussions with interested shops and getting quotes from electricians. Hopefully, we can get it all together in time. On behalf of the Council, may I wish all our readers a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

Approaching 90?

We try to keep a record of residents nearing their ninetieth birthdays, so that the Chairman can present our congratulations and a gift at the appropriate time. But we would still like you to remind us, in case you, or someone you know, are not on our list.

TV film

RED, the producers of 'Dead Man Weds' are donating £250 to P.C. funds. We will decide how to use this at the next meeting. Reminder – first episode Jan. 5th, 10pm.

Financial Assistance

We have substantially increased our grants budget for local organisations this year. Projects we are sponsoring include Bradda Dads' Pensioners' Christmas Lunch; their Childrens' Bonfire and Fireworks display; the newly formed Youth Committee; Bradwell Allsports application for grant-funding for a new all-weather centre; St. John's Ambulance Brigade, and Bakewell and Eyam Community Transport. If you are a member of a charitable village organisation, which you think needs our support, please let us know.

No.10, Downing Street Delegation

On November 8th, we hosted a visit from two officials from the Prime Ministers Strategy Unit. The Government are considering delegating greater powers to Parish Councils, and Bradwell was one of four picked, at random, to give our views on what these new powers might be and how we would administer them. One Government suggestion, covered in the press recently, is for PC's to employ part time officials who could issue on the spot fines to offenders.

Councillors' Allowances

The Government's recommendations for the development of 'Quality Parish Councils' include the option for appropriate monetary allowances for Parish Councillors. We have already agreed to aim to achieve 'Quality' status, and our support of this newsletter is part of that process.

With regard to allowances, we have agreed to follow the guidelines for setting up an approved scheme, before making a decision on

whether or not to adopt it. This includes asking Derbyshire Dales District Council to prepare an appropriate scheme and recommend payment levels. Allowances would be paid from the Parish Precept. It's an emotive subject! Do you think Parish Councillors should join District and County Councillors in receiving allowances – or are they different? Please let us have your views.

It will be several months before we need to make a decision.

Dog mess

Sorry to have to mention this again, but we are getting complaints about the state of Charlotte Lane, Smithy Hill, Jeffery Lane and Granby. If you witness an offence in this area, could you please advise the owner that there is a dog-bin on Charlotte Lane and that doggie-bags are available free from the post office. If persuasion doesn't work, our only other option is to ask District to set up patrols by dog wardens who can issue instant fines. If you think more dogbins are needed, please suggest locations to us.

ALLSPORTS UPDATE

The Bradwell Sports Club / Allsports project to develop the sports field has been ongoing for several years. Earlier this year, we approached Sport England for the balance of funding for the project. Unfortunately, this application was unsuccessful.

Unsure of what was the best course of action following this decision, and on the advice of Clir. Lawson, a meeting was arranged with Les Warren the Derbyshire Dales District Council Leisure Officer.

The meeting was very useful and the main point that emerged on the project would best proceed was for les to include Bredwell as a site for a floodilt Multi-Use Games Area, or MUGA, in the revised Football Facilities Strategy for Derbyshire. We have just been informed that this has happened and Bradwell has been given priority status. The next step is to arrange a meeting with the Football Association to discuss the development of the project

It is planned to make an application to the Footbali Foundation in the Spring of 2005.

THE JABEZ BRADWELL DIARY

The Jabez Bradwell Diary was brought to the attention of Lillian Riddall in 1995 by Ben Wilson. Written mainly in pencil on very small sheets of paper which had once formed part of a small notebook, the text was barely legible but was painstakingly deciphered by her. Some words have been inserted in this version when they have appeared obvious but where this has not been possible a blank has been left. Some words could be dialect ones and have been printed as written. The Diary has been transcribed by John Unsworth and the commentary is by David Wilson (the great nephew of the author) together with Lillian Riddall and John Unsworth who are descendants of James A. Cramond, the Bradwell tailor.

The Diary was kept by Jabez Bradwell in a 'free' form. He did not have the benefit of a printed diary, and kept notes as things happened or because he wanted to be reminded at a later date about something important that had happened in the village. Because of this, he sometimes made notes on successive days but frequently several weeks elapsed between entries. Dates are shown fully or just as a number.

The Diary contains a fascinating catalogue of domestic incidents and information about local inhabitants. It is interesting to note that the author speaks of local people visiting Buxton, Oughtibridge, Stocksbridge, Haddon Hall, Manchester, Southport, Blackpool and, of course, Sheffield.
