THE PASSING OF DAVID EYRE

Mr David Eyre of Smalldale, Bradwell died at home on June 14th aged 70 years. Born at Abney, the son of Benjamin and Connie Eyre, David was educated at the Hathersage Church School before going to work as a porter at Hope Station. He next worked for Capons Industrial Painters, in Parson's Lane, Aston and then did his National Service with the East Yorkshire Regiment, serving time in Malaya. After leaving the army he resumed work, firstly at the Sheffield Drill Company, and then the Blue Circle Cement works. He started in the yard, then after a period as Laboratory Manager he became a Shift Manager, working at Hull, Indonesia and America, before returning to Hope Works where he remained until taking early retirement.

David married Irene Cooke and lived in Bradwell. He was very active in village affairs, serving as President and Chairman of the Sports Club, in particular the senior football section, of which he was also treasurer. Together with Graham Riley he ran the under fifteen football team for several years, winning the league on six occasions. For many years he acted as Groundsman, marking out the pitches for the teams and cleaning the pavilion with Irene's help. David was one of the main people involved in fund raising and building the sports pavilion, the all-weather playing area and the pavilion extension. For many years he organised the senior and junior fell races, taking part in the senior race until well into his sixties, and following the junior race to ensure all returned safely. He also organised the preparation, assembly and dismantling of the well dressings.

David leaves his wife, son Stephen, daughter-in-law Elizabeth, grandson Robert, sisters Janet and Beryl, and brother Tony. Cremation took place at Hutcliffe Wood, followed by a service at St. Barnabas' Church on 21st June.

PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

Lafarge plans steam- train rides to Earle's sidings

At the quarterly Parishes liaison meeting on June 14th, works manager, John Capewell spoke of further expansion planned for rail despatches. To achieve their goal of exporting 1.2 mm tons of cement by rail (currently 0.8mm), investment in new on-site track is now expected to exceed £10 million. Subject to planning approval, up to eight additional tracks, a trans-shipment platform and a new access road will be laid on part of the golf course and over the site occupied by the offices. New offices would be built closer to the works entrance and the two new golf fairways currently being constructed in the old shale quarry will maintain the course's nine hole status. **An open day is planned for September 17th – 18th**, with steam-train rides from the works to Earle's sidings. The last works steam railway engine, *Nunlow*, now preserved, will return as a static exhibit, with other attractions, including an exhibition of old works photographs and documents. A local character, **Oliver Wain** was the last driver of *Nunlow* from 1955 until it was replaced by a diesel locomotive in 1964.

Hope Valley Forum – Bridleway access

The first meeting, organised/funded by Peak District National Park, was held at Hope Valley College on June 22nd, and attracted nearly 200 local people. The meeting was chaired by Peak Park chairman, Tony Hams, and questions were answered by DCC Highways. The topic was use of off-road vehicles on unsuitable local tracks, which generated a heated debate between residents, farmers and off-roaders. Highways and Peak Park agreed to jointly reconsider their approach in light of comments/suggestions made at the meeting. A major problem seems to be parliamentary delay in introducing the new legislation, which is designed to protect bridleways from damage caused by reckless drivers of motorised vehicles. It is still at least a year away, and Highways have received more than 100 applications for the use of such vehicles on bridleways in the Park, including one for the path from **Edge Lane to the top of Bradwell Edge**.

Apparently the new legislation will not be retrospective and these applications are obviously intended to circumvent its purpose. In response to this threat we have established a **Rights of Way sub-committee** to protect, and monitor the maintenance of, all footpaths and bridleways within the parish boundary.

Street cleaning

This is the responsibility of Derbyshire Dales DC and, despite our regular complaints to them, the service still leaves much to be desired. In response to recent correspondence from residents and concerned well-wishers, we asked DDDC to give us details of their schedule for sweeping Bradwell streets. This has now been received, we consider it inadequate, and have **asked them to provide a more frequent service**.

We realise that parked cars pose a problem for their mechanical sweepers, so we have asked them to give us their proposed sweep dates for publication in this newsletter. This would at least give you the option to move your car whilst your street is being cleaned – if you can find somewhere else to park it, of course!

New floodmap

The PC hosted a meeting, on June 8th, of about 30 residents whose

properties are affected by the new map. Concerns and comments were noted and information on how to approach insurance companies was distributed by the Parish Clerk. It was agreed that the PC should continue its efforts to convince the Environment Agency either to down-grade their risk-assessment in the light of recent flood alleviation work, or to prioritise whatever other work they consider necessary. It was also agreed to meet quarterly to review progress.

OBITUARIES FOR JULY

Mrs. Dorothy Cusworth, of Hugh Lane, died on 22 May on her way to Chesterfield Hospital. She died the day after her 84th birthday and a few days after her sister, Stella. She was born in Bradwell, the eldest daughter of Mr. Harold and Mrs. Sarah Mabbott. Educated at the Church School, she then went into service in Leeds. During the war she served in the WAAFS, as did her sisters, Vera and Olive. After the war she married Wilfred, who predeceased her. She was a keen gardener, fond of reading and a big supporter of church activities. She leaves a son, Stewart, daughter-in-law, Janet, grandsons, Thomas and Ewan and sisters, Audrey and Rita. A Funeral Service took place on 31 May at St. Barnabas' Church, followed by burial.

Mrs. Stella Ferraby, of Horsley Woodhouse, died at home on 7 May, aged 77 years. Born in Bradwell she was one of six

daughters of Mr. Harold and Mrs. Sarah Mabbott. She was educated at the Church School and New Mills Grammar School. She represented the Church School, as did her sisters Vera and Olive, at the Annual Hope Valley School Sports. Towards the end of the war she served in the ATS. After leaving the ATS, she went to Teacher Training College and then went to teach at Horsley Woodhouse, near Derby. She married Jim Ferraby of Hope, and lived at Horsley Woodhouse for the rest of her life. She was a keen Bowls player and was, at one time, President of the Derbyshire Ladies Section. Stella leaves her husband, Jim, and sisters, Audrey and Rita. The Funeral took place on 18 May at Horsley Woodhouse Church followed by Cremation. Her ashes are to be buried in Bradwell Churchyard.

The families of Dot and Stella would like to express their thanks for the cards, flowers and expressions of sympathy they have received at this sad time.

Mrs Lena Maine, of Hallgate View died on 15th June in the Hallamshire Hospital, aged 86 years. Born in Bradwell, the daughter of Mr Samuel and Mrs Aletha Wright, she was educated at the council school, but then moved to the Church School as did others who had "differences" with the Headmaster. She worked at Bamford Mill until marrying Sidney Maine, who she met after being pen friends while he was in the army. After Sidney died she went to work in the Blue Circle canteen until her retirement.

The funeral took place at the Methodist Chapel, followed by interment on 22nd June.
