## PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

**Brook Weed Clearance**

In past years this work has been done for us by Bradda Dads, but health and safety considerations caused them to decline last year. In any case the great mass of weed, which had developed over the last two years, meant that heavy machinery was necessary. It was therefore decided at our July meeting to accept a commercial quotation for £1200, for the removal and disposal of the weed, in time for Gala Week. This was the best offer received as the result of our tender process, and the contractor also agreed to remove the large stones, which Severn Trent had left in the stream after completion of their foul-flood alleviation scheme. We thank Dick Morley and Henry Walker for allowing access to their land for the contractor's equipment and Brookside car-owners who heeded our request to park elsewhere on the day.

Some residents have expressed the view that weed growth has been aided by silt deposits on the river-bed. However, the environment agency do not accept that the river bed has risen significantly or that silt needs to be removed to aid flow. They also maintain that the weed is part of the river eco-system. That may be so, but it is also unsightly, smelly in hot weather, a trap for refuse and a haven for rats.

It seems, therefore, that it will be necessary for us to carry out this work annually, at Parish expense, unless we can obtain grant funding.

**Bradwell Edge Footpath**

DCC Highways Dept. have apologised for misinforming us about an application for opening this Bridleway to all traffic. Apparently no application has been made.

As reported in an earlier newsletter, we have previously held discussions with Henry Walker and Highways Dept. regarding moving the line of the footpath into the old Holloway, which zigzags up the lower part of the Edge. We believe this would make Bradwell Edge more accessible to walkers and we understand that our proposal is still under consideration.

## THE NIGHT SKY

We are going to start running a series of articles explaining some of the more significant objects visible in the night sky. This month, look to the west after sunset and you will see a brilliant "star". This object is not a star at all, but is the planet Venus, currently setting later and later after the sun and so getting higher in the sky every night. Venus is the brightest object in the sky after the sun and moon, and it is so bright because it is permanently covered by clouds, which reflect back all the sunlight which falls on it. Seen in a telescope, Venus would look like a small crescent moon.
