EASTER

Rowan Williams, our Archbishop said, "New things are possible for us in our life once we acknowledge the innerness, Jesus comes to life here and now, and if I begin by saying: 'Where we are he's been', we begin to hear the other side of this great message, 'Where he is, we shall be." (Quoted by Esther De Waal in 'Lost in Wonder, 2003).

Drama is an entertaining recreational activity to be enjoyed by all, young and old alike, and can touch the core of our beings and emotions. In particular a cultural, moral, ethical or political message can also be explicitly or implicitly deployed. Actors performing on the stage often 'get into the skin' of the characters they are playing and can sometimes testify to the influence this has upon their personal psych, and how on some occasions their understanding and philosophy of life is challenged.

The drama of Holy Week begins with **Palm Sunday**. Do come and join us for the joint and ecumenical procession carrying Palm Crosses, singing hymns accompanied by Castleton Silver Prize Band as we follow a donkey. We begin our procession of witness at St Edmunds and conclude with a service at the Methodists. You are welcome!

Maundy Thursday enables us to re-enact the Last Supper through our joint ecumenical service of Holy Communion together at St Barnabas Bradwell that prepares us for the following day as we remember the desertion of Jesus by everyone. You are welcome!

Good Friday at Hope gives opportunity to spend the 'Last hour at the Cross', a meditation of readings and hymns facilitating our reflection on the suffering that Jesus went through for you and me. In the evening we look forward to an ecumenical service at Hope Methodists. You are welcome!

Easter Eve is an opportunity to worship with Anglicans from the whole Hope Valley at St Barnabas Bradwell, for an Easter Vigil. Here we have a dramatic service using light, renew our baptismal vows and receive the first Holy Communion of Easter. Each parish present is invited to take the new Easter Light to their own churches from which to light the Paschal Candle during the Easter Sunday Worship. You are welcome! I wish you all a very happy Easter and look forward to meeting you sometime in your Church or Chapel. Rev Ian A Davis

PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

New Councillor

At our March meeting Linda Harrison was selected as the preferred candidate to fill the casual vacancy caused by the resignation of Patricia Allen. She will now be invited to attend our April meeting to sign the necessary documents for cooption to the Council. More information about Linda will appear in the next issue, once her appointment has been ratified. It is very encouraging that five people applied for this vacancy and we hope that this level of enthusiasm will be maintained until May 2007, when the four year term of the current Council comes to an end. If more than ten residents were to apply for the new Council, an election would be necessary. This would be a very welcome event, and would provide the one remaining qualification we require to achieve the much sought after '*Quality Parish Council*' status, as defined by the Government.

Village Map

Our application to Hope Valley and High Peak Transport Forum, for a grant of £1000 to produce and display a map of the village for visitors, was successful. We will now decide what information the map should contain and where it should be situated. A condition of the grant is that it should carry full information on local public transport facilities – bus and train routes and bus stops etc.

Hope Valley Forum

The subject of the meeting held on March 23rd, at Hope Valley College, was 'Affordable Housing'. Around 80 people attended, including a substantial contingent from Bradwell. There were presentations from Peak District National Park and Derbyshire Dales District Council and I chaired a question and answer session. The most productive part of the meeting was an interactive question session in which the audience was asked to split into village groups which were allocated individual 'village' tables. Maps of each village were placed on the tables together with a list of questions relating to the nature of that village and the need for and desirability of new 'affordable housing'. Each villager was given strips of coloured dots to apply to their map indicating where they thought the new housing would best be situated and what type of housing (1,2 or 3 bed) was most needed. The results will be collated and analysed by PDNPA and disseminated to Parish Clerks, Housing Authorities and Housing Associations and reported back to the next Forum.

Housing Needs Surveys

Derbyshire Dales and High Peak Borough Councils will soon be issuing 20,000 questionnaires for their sample-survey of housing needs in the region and if you receive one of these, we ask that you respond – even if you have no need for housing. Perhaps more significantly for Bradwell, Northern

Counties Housing Association, who are building the new Michlow houses, are planning a full needs survey of the village which is to be carried out by Hallam University. Chris Furness

BRADWELL JUNIOR SCHOOL – ECO NEWS

We became an ECO school in 2004, and have been having fun finding out more about our world and how to look after it and each other. We already have a Bronze Award, and are hoping for Silver this year. We have an ECO Council, made up of children elected from all year groups, who meet regularly to plan and monitor our work – helped also by School Council. Some of our exciting projects so far have included: exploring special local habitats, e.g. lead rakes & hay meadows building a living willow den and planting wildlife-friendly gardens putting up nesting boxes and birdfeeders – and bird watching improving the pond and wildlife areas in the school grounds composting our fruit & vegetable waste (and the Infant School's!) preparing a new vegetable garden

a fruit tuckshop (helped by a Community Award from the Co-op) new playground games, benches and tyres for seating starting a buddying scheme to help each other at playtimes starting a counselling service to help children talk about their worries recycling cans, plastic, glass and ink cartridges

reducing energy, water and paper wastage

MRS ELINOR BROADBENT

Mrs Elinor Broadbent of Wallasey died on 13th February at the Castlebridge Hospital aged 90 years. Eldest of the five children of Robert and Sarah Martin, Elinor was born in County Tyrone, Northern Ireland. She worked at the Inland Revenue in Northern Ireland and then in Llandudno. She met her husband, George when he was posted to Northern Ireland whilst serving with the Inniskillen Fusiliers. They married in 1945 and lived in Bradwell, most of the time at Outland Head. In 1999 Elinor left to look after her son, Kevin who was suffering from leukaemia. A diligent member of the Parish Council for over 20 years she made her own way to meetings at various locations, even though she had no transport of her own. She served as manager of the primary school, and was also a governor of Hope Valley College. She studied with the Open University and obtained degrees in Geology and the Humanities. Elinor spoke five languages, enjoyed visiting other countries, and was planning a visit to India when she was taken ill.

She leaves a daughter, Irene, sister Mary and grandchildren. Her son, Kevin pre-deceased her. A funeral service took place at Wallasey on 15th February followed by burial in the Bradwell Primitive Methodist graveyard on 17th February, the same day as the funeral for Mrs Pashley, her friend for many years.
