TIME TO LOOK BACK

All that remains of Pashley's garage may soon be changed forever, as the property is to be auctioned. Although Pashley's was a landmark, it was first and foremost a bus and taxi service. There were two buses - the little bus (13 seater) and the big bus (20 seater), one with folding doors and the other with a tricky swinging door – which could be seen waiting to take passengers to the station or being washed at the side of the brook.

The bus route through the village was the same as it is today. The bus didn't start until its regular passengers were on board, with "Is Miss/Mr. here yet?" This didn't leave much time to catch the train, but there were ways of letting the guard know we were not far away. When the train could be seen puffing towards Hope Station it was a heavy hand on the horn all the way up the station approach and a mad dash over the bridge to fling open the carriage door to stop the train moving away as the guard stood there with the green flag in his hand, whistle in his mouth. It was hard luck if it was Monday – if you needed a weekly ticket the ticket clerk wasn't too happy. The bus was back on the road up to Bradwell to collect passengers and children for the Manchester train. If that train was moving off when the bus returned, the Bradwell New Mills contingent would give a loud cheer. Two lessons missed and a wait for the next train! Words were exchanged between Mr. P. and the porter – "Why did he let the train go – we always arrive." Well, something like that!!

On the return journey we knew our bus wouldn't clear off because the train was delayed, like the North Western buses did. Bradwell passengers crowded on the bus but the passengers for Hope and Castleton started to walk home, with their bags and brief-cases, in the cold and dark. Some people will have mixed memories of the taxi service meeting the last train from Sheffield or Manchester on that all important special, possibly, first date, or as newly weds going at speed to catch the London train from Millers Dale Station. Not to be forgotten is the delivery service. The mail was picked up from the Post Office and put on the train and bundles of newspapers were brought up to the village.

Those who went to school or work on the bus and train will have their own memories, as will those children who were given a free ride to the station and back at 'off peak' times. Maybe it was their reward for making sure that Mr. Pashley was up and about to catch those weekend trains.

PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

Housing needs survey

Because of errors made by their agency, Derbyshire Dales District Council is re-issuing the survey forms to every household this month. We request that everyone complete the form, even if you have no need of housing at the moment. The information collected from the survey helps DDDC to estimate future village needs for all categories of social housing, including retirement homes. The more people respond, the more accurate will be their calculations.

AGM – May 9th

Councillor Alan Slater was re-elected as Chair of the PC and Cllr. Reg. Davies was re-elected as Vice-Chair. Gillian Nowell was re-appointed as our Internal Auditor. All sub-committees and external body representations were re-established with the same Councillors in place, and with Linda Harrison filling the vacancies left by the retiring Councillor.

Ringmaster

Our new village policeman, PC Doug. Eyre, attended the Parish meeting, which followed the AGM. He informed Councillors of the new Ringmaster messaging system, which is now operative. Membership is open to all residents - and members receive automatic messages from the police, either by phone or email. These can be descriptions of people or vehicles seen in the vicinity of suspicious incidents in Bradwell – sometimes within minutes of the incidents being reported. There have been many successful arrests already this year in nearby areas where Ringmaster is already operating. The service is completely free and if you would like to join you should contact the co-ordinator, Trisha Mellor, on 01298 762102.

Youth facilities

PC Eyre also spoke of his concern at the limited recreational opportunities for young people in Bradwell and declared his intention to do what he could to bring facilities such as a playing field shelter and a hard-court football pitch to the village. Councillors expressed their support for his intentions and wished him success in obtaining the necessary funding.

PC Ian McGregor

It was agreed that the Parish Clerk should write to Ian expressing our appreciation for all the good work he had done during his time as our village policeman and to wish him well in his new duties in Traffic Control.

Scout Hut

A letter from David Wilson to The Scout Association was read to Councillors and David attended the meeting to answer questions. The main concern expressed in the letter was that a new lock has been fitted to the building, which excludes access to all current keyholders in the village (Bradwell Scouts old committee members). David pointed out that that the loss of this fine building to the village would be a catastrophe, especially considering all the hard voluntary work, fund raising

and support from the people of Bradwell in the past. Councillors unanimously supported David's action and views and asked to be kept informed of any responses he receives from the Association before they decide what action to take

PLASTIC RECYCLING BANK

Did you know that the plastic recycling bank in the Co-Op car park will accept more than just 'plastic bottles'? In fact it will take most plastic packaging, and the operators, Recresco Ltd have provided the following summary of what they will accept:

All post consumer packaging (as a general rule this means all plastic bottles, and what is termed loosely as 'brittle plastic', such as CLEAN yoghurt pots, margarine tubs and produce/fruit trays - but **not** polystyrene).

Ideally the plastic will have a plastic recycling mark 1-5 but this is not essential. They do **not** accept:

Plastic Type 6 (polystyrene/ PS) or 7 (usually mixed plastics)

Plastic Toys

Plastic Bags

Cling Film or Bubble Wrap

Non Plastic Items

Video Cassettes

Drain Pipe

Any items that do not fit through the round opening in the bank as these damage their machinery.

- One off purchases for individuals
- Grants for agencies providing medical care in our community, e.g. St Johns Ambulance
- Patients' Library (for patients at EMC)
- Procurement of physiotherapy items e.g. wrist braces at cost.

WATER AID

On 15th July over 500 people from across the UK will be coming to the Peak District to raise money for WaterAid, an international charity dedicated to helping people who are forced to live without safe water and sanitation. Participants can choose between a 23 or 30 mile strenuous walk or a 32 or 62 mile cycle. **1.1 billion people** in the world do not have access to safe water and **2.6 billion people** do not have access to adequate sanitation. A child dies every 15 seconds from water-related diseases. 2006 is WaterAid's 25th birthday year, so we'd like to make this event as wide-reaching as possible. The event has been running for over 13 years, and raised over £300,000 for the charity. In previous years the course began & ended at Tittesworth Reservoir, but this year, to incorporate new routes, our base will be the Hollowford Centre near Castleton. OBITUARY

Kenneth Elliott passed away peacefully in hospital in St Helens on 5th May 2006 aged 88 years. Ken was born at Nether Gardens, Netherside, Bradwell on 18th August 1917, youngest child of Ernest and Annie Elliott, brother of Megan and Edith Bradwell (nee Elliott) both deceased. He helped in the family business and was a member of the Methodist Chapel. Ken trained as a teacher at Bangor College and taught at Bakewell Methodist School before being called up to serve as a Sergeant in the Royal Corps of Signals, seeing service in Malta during WW2. He continued his teaching career at Summerford Camp School in Congleton where he met his future wife, Pat. They married in 1952 and set up home in St Helens, bringing up their family of 3 boys. Ken taught at Haydock Secondary School until his retirement. He was a keen and talented gardener and was always happy in the company of his wife and best friend, Pat, having been married for 54 years in April. Sadly Pat Elliott has since been reunited with Ken as she also died very quietly in hospital on 17th May 2006

They were very dear parents to Peter (deceased) and will be very sadly missed by sons, Alan and John, daughters in law, Christine and Ann and grandsons James and Thomas.
