A MESSAGE FROM BRADDA'S BEAT OFFICER

PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

New Councillor

Linda Harrison was co-opted onto the Council in April this year. She is married and has lived on The Hills for about 8 years. Linda is currently employed as a Programme Co-ordinator with the NHS in Sheffield and has a background in Project Management, Product Management and as an Executive PA within a major international organisation. She applied to be a Parish Councillor because she appreciates the sense of community spirit in Bradwell and wants to employ her communications skills in understanding the needs and concerns of residents and to effectively communicating these to other authorities. Linda was selected at interview from five applicants, for the one vacancy, and has already made positive contributions to Council meetings.

Lafarge

At the Lafarge Community Liaison meeting on June 13th, manager John Capewell reported planned changes in the management team. John is moving to Lafarge Head Office, in Birmingham, in September, to take charge of special projects - including the new rail infrastructure and administration buildings for Hope Works (which received planning permission on June 16th). He will also oversee the closure of Northfleet works, which is scheduled to cease production in 2008. The new works manager for Hope will be Ashley Bryan, who is currently manager at Northfleet. Around 80,000 tons of waste stone from the quarry will be used in the construction of the new rail sidings. It will be transported to the site in dumper trucks on internal roads. There will be no disruption to the village, but an increase in noise level is anticipated during this process. Lafarge are considering a request, from Michlow residents, to make the temporary entrance to the new Michlow development into a permanent exit, which would allow one-way traffic flow on the site. Trial burning of Meat and Bone Meal (MBM) is scheduled to start on August 16th - for six weeks. The original target of November 2005 for the commencement of indirect firing of kiln 2 has now been delayed again to September 2006 and kiln 1 to January 2007.

The Lafarge tsunami charity cycle race, which terminated at Hope Works on April 30th raised over £1000 on the day, and £35,000 overall. The proceeds will be spent on providing permanent homes for workers, at the Lafarge factory in Banda Ache, whose houses were destroyed in the tsunami. It is hoped that at least seven new homes will be provided.

The derelict Hadfield's quarry, at Pindale, is now managed by Derbyshire Wildlife Trust.

Carnival

The Sports Cub have agreed to a PC Carnival Committee request to lay a permanent underground electric cable, in the sports field, from the pavilion to the site of the marquee.

Lafarge are providing the cable and ancillary electrical equipment free of charge.

AFFORDABLE HOUSING

The Peak District National Park Authority wants to find out if the Park's stock of affordable and farm workers' homes is still meeting the needs of local people, so 700 home-owners or occupiers are being surveyed in July/August. The key to making sure the homes stay available for the people they were intended for is that when they change hands, they continue to be occupied by local people in housing need, or farm or forestry workers.

REBELLION KNOLL WI

Following the business meeting - Helen Gillham (President) welcomed Jean East, guest speaker for the evening who gave a very enjoyable, knowledgeable and informative talk on her recent 'Trip to Bhutan'. Jean explained that Bhutan is in Nepal, close to the Himalayas. It has 700,000 inhabitants and is also known as "The Kingdom of the Dragons" although to her certain knowledge there are no dragons. It is a small, breathtakingly beautiful country, with swathes of lush vegetation, mountains, rivers and streams. It has only recently 'opened up' to the western world (1950s) and its airport is very small with only 3 aircraft (of which the Bhutanese are extremely proud), plus an equally small terminal building.

80% of the population of Bhutan live an hour away from any road network and 40% of these live a whole day's travelling time away from the capital, Thimpu. Bhutan has only one prison with very few inhabitants, crime is almost non-existent and there was no evidence of litter or graffiti. Although the country is poor in our terms, the people have a comfortable life and are happy, content and very proud. The culture is (surprisingly) matriarchal - but the ruling monarch is male, and his foremost concern is that his people are happy.

Bhutan is a Buddhist country and Jean was impressed by the many monasteries with their numerous prayer wheels and prayer flags "everywhere you looked". School children were very proud to attend school, were educated in the English language and pleased to try their language skills whenever they had a chance. Archery is their national sport and whilst there, Jean was treated to a demonstration at a sporting gathering.

Rice is the main crop and export commodity (two harvests a year) and they are very skilled weavers. Bhutanese homes are colourfully decorated and very clean. There is little electricity and homes are lit by oil and candles. Whilst some electricity is produced, it is generally 'exported'. Jean completed her talk with an example of Bhutanese music which she agreed was a question of an acquired taste.

Betty Bradwell thanked Jean, on behalf of members, for sharing her 'Trip to Bhutan' and the meeting concluded with a question and answer session over tea and biscuits

I worked at Blue Circle as an apprentice engineer before joining the Royal Military Police. I married a Bradwell lass, Caroline Biggin and we live in Ashbourne with our three lads, two dogs, one cat and a parrot - so you can see why I look forward to work.

I have very strong ties to Bradwell and I hope to serve the Bradwell community for many years to come.
