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News from the Parish Council

Stand for the PC or lose it?

Your Parish Council will be dissolved next April, prior to the May election. We currently have one advertised casual vacancy – but no takers.

Two of our longest serving members have indicated their intention to retire and two others may be leaving the Parish before the election.

My two-year stint as Chairman will be complete then, and I would hope to pass the chalice to a willing nominee.

So to make an election necessary, six, or more, new candidates may be required. If no one is prepared to join us in the new Council, we may be unable to continue effectively and might consider the option of disbanding and handing over responsibility for Parish matters to the District Council.

We feel that the best outcome would be for some of the voluntary village organisations to nominate a member candidate and thus have a say in Council decisions.

If you have considered becoming a Councillor, but been put off for some reason, please contact me, or Richard Jarman (Parish Clerk).

Q – I've heard a rumour that the Peace Garden might be changed to a wild plant area.

A – It was suggested at a recent meeting that it could be offered to village schools for horticultural projects, but this has not been progressed. We are grateful to John Wilson and other nearby residents for tending the PG.

Q – Dog-mess is getting worse on the Yeld and other field paths - what can the Parish council do to stop it?

A – We could install more dog-bins, but would need acceptable sites to be identified.

We could take action against offending dog-owners, but witnesses would be needed.

We appeal to owners to act responsibly, by collecting free doggie bags from the Post Office and making use of them whenever necessary. Please don't just leave the mess for someone to tread in.

Q – Can the PC do anything to stop garden fires?

A – No, this isn't a smokeless zone. However, a regular fire might be considered a nuisance, in which case you should discuss it with District Council. Garden fires must be difficult to justify, now that District will take up to four rubbish bags per week and provide a monthly compactor skip which seems to cope with all we can throw into it.

BRADWELL FIRE STATION NEWS

PARKING CONCERNS

This is just a short reminder from your local fire station, to all people who own a car in Bradwell. Several residents are concerned about access for emergency vehicles and have approached us suggesting Bradwell has a problem.

Yes, we agree, there are a few black spots around the village, but if everyone just looked and considered how and where they park, then consider if a fire appliance could get through. Remember the appliance requires approximately 3 metres to get through comfortably, any less will slow us down and could endanger lives - IT MIGHT BE YOURS.

Remember most family cars require only 2 metres to pass with ease.

The black spots around the village are: -

1. Top end of Towngate
2. Hill Head where the fork in the road is and its junction with Granby
3. Smithy Hill
4. Charlotte Lane
5. Smalldale near junction with Granby
6. Michlow Lane - junction with Gore Lane
7. The Hills, The Green outside Kinder Cottage
8. The Hills, The Green at the top of the Shart
9. Bessie Lane
10. Hungry Lane

The areas above are the ones we have identified - can you name others?

Post Office Notice

Changes to the Payment of Pensions & Allowances – April 2003

If you receive, or are about to start receiving a Pension or Allowance, then read on:

The government has changed the way that Pensions & Allowances will be paid, to save money and prevent fraud. However, the unwary could find that access to their money becomes extremely difficult if they choose the wrong option, or indeed if they allow the Department of Works and Pensions to choose for them. The aim of the government is to have all allowances paid directly into a bank account, the nearest Bank being 5 miles away in Hathersage. To continue to collect your money from Bradwell Post Office, in cash, the following options are available to you:

1. Apply for a Bank Account with one of the Banks that allows you full basic banking facilities, free of charge, over the Post Office Counter. Currently these are:

Alliance and Leicester Girobank

Co Operative Bank

Barclays Bank

Lloyds TSB

Smile Internet Bank

Cahoot Internet Bank

2. Open a Universal Bank Account which will allow you access to your money over the post office counter, but no other banking facilities.

3. Apply for a Post Office Account Card, which will operate in a similar way to the current order books. That is, you will be able to draw your pension or allowance in cash at the Post Office.

The Department of Works and Pensions will be getting in touch with you over the coming months, but remember that whatever their advertisements or letters say, you do have these three choices & you should make sure that you choose the option that is best for you.

Clearly by making sure that you continue to draw your money through Bradwell Post Office, you will be helping to ensure that there will be a Post Office in Bradwell for the future.

Bradwell Churches After School Club

The After School Club (for 7-11 year old) meets in the Methodist Schoolroom each Monday in term-time for 1 ½ hrs after school. It is led and supervised by members of the 2 churches in Bradwell plus mums and friends from the village. We as a staff are motivated by the Christian belief that we care for each other as God cares for us and this belief underpins all we do - but it is very much in a spirit of fun.

We share in all kinds of activities from painting, model making and craftwork to drama, music and circus skills; we've had storytellers, a shepherd and conservationists visit the club as well as the village policeman, fireman and member of the local gliding club. The barbecues are particularly popular, as was the walk up Bradwell Edge with the Peak Park Ranger and the picnic on Rebellion Knoll. Add to these the games we play and the cooking we like to do from time to time and you get a picture of what the After School Club is about.

We are looking forward all the time, searching for new ideas and ways of improving the club. At the moment the Hope Valley Christian Youth Work Association is seeking to appoint 2 workers in the valley to further the work among children and young people. Our club in Bradwell hopes to benefit from the professional help of such a worker.
