PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

New Parish Clerk

Congratulations to Steve Lawless, who was chosen for this important post at a special selection meeting of the full Council on September 20th. Four excellent candidates were interviewed at the meeting and all Councillors agreed that every one of them would have made a very good Parish Clerk. Steve is married, has three grown-up sons, and has lived in Bradwell for over 5 years. He retired from his job as Team Manager with a large international Computer Services company after a career of over 30 years in a wide variety of roles in the IT industry. Hobbies include playing racketball and genealogical research. He has been involved in a number of activities in the village including recycling newspapers, helping behind the scenes with the pantomime players and lately has been involved with the Historical Society, especially in the 'Bradwell after Seth' project. Steve says he has greatly enjoyed his time spent in the village and in getting to know more of the people and organisations here. He applied for the position of Parish Clerk in order to help the smooth running of the Parish Council and its various committees, to ensure that Council Policy is effectively managed and carried out, and especially to ensure that the residents of Bradwell receive value for money in the services they receive. Richard Jarman continues in service with the PC as Finance Officer.

Parish Councillor vacancy

Paul Richardson has reluctantly resigned from the Council because his expanding business interests have made it difficult for him to attend meetings. Fellow Councillors expressed regret at his decision, but wished him well in his new ventures and thanked him for his contributions to Council meeting debates and to the village generally. This means we must advertise for a new Councillor, and selection can be by election or co-option. If ten or more residents request an election then that will be the method. Otherwise the Council can co-opt a new member by whatever means Councillors think appropriate. Five residents applied for the last vacancy, when selection was by interview and a secret ballot, and we hope to see the same level of interest this time. If you wish to apply, contact the Parish Clerk or speak to a Councillor. The only commitment required is to attend monthly meetings, which are held on the first Tuesday evening of each month, except August. There are of course options to increase this involvement by joining one of our sub-committees or by representing the Parish Council on external committees. The successful applicant will be offered a free training course.

Beggars Plot Youth Shelter

At a special PC meeting on September 11th, attended by several residents, we agreed to the request of Bradwell Community Action Group to construct a shelter for teenagers

on Beggars Plot Playing Field. Funding for the shelter and its installation will be sourced by the Police and its design and precise siting will be decided in consultation with the Police and the Action Group. There will be no charge to Parish funds initially, but the question of who will be responsible for maintenance has yet to be determined. Derbyshire County Council Youth Service team had recently visited Bradwell to meet teenagers and get their views on what was most urgently needed in Bradwell. The shelter was top of their wish-list.

Affordable Housing

All the new Michlow houses have been allocated to local people and many have now been occupied. On September , the Dowager Duchess of Devonshire visited the site and commented positively on the development. "I was very impressed by everything I saw. The houses fill the criteria, which is so apt for this part of the country, in that they look as if they have always been there. The newly-occupied house at Bradwell is obviously a joy to its new tenant and I can understand her pleasure in the place - light, roomy and cheerful with wonderful views. It is so pleasing to realise that this programme is well on its way, with so many more similar houses needed all over the Peak Park." Deborah Devonshire. The quality and design standard of Affordable Housing developments in the Peak District National Park (PDNPA) is nationally recognised and, as lead member for Affordable Housing I recently attended the Planning Institute awards ceremony in London to receive their top award - on behalf of the PDNPA. But the quantity is insufficient and we still have a sizeable waiting list in Bradwell. There is no further Council land available, so any new Housing Association development must be on land which is currently privately owned. But if the development is of high quality, sympathetic to its surroundings and for local needs only, there surely cannot be many objections. As I reported in my last notes, the Parish Council is striving to secure more Affordable Homes for Bradwell and it is now likely that the necessary village needs survey will be carried out in November. This is a crucial first step and I hope to have more information for the next newsletter.

STUDENT OF THE YEAR AWARDS

CONGRATULATIONS TO BEN MORLEY

Ben has just completed his student years as runner-up for the Science, Engineering and Technology Student of the Year Awards, Aeronautical Category, sponsored by Airbus. An interview at the Royal Aeronautical Society, followed by a Gala Dinner at the Royal Courts of Justice in London, which was attended by representatives of industry, was held on 21 September. Ben's dissertation was 'Investigation into nonlinear model predictive control for application into missile guidance systems'. He attended Bradwell Infant and Junior Schools, moved onto HVC, where he gained his GCSEs, and then to Lady Manners to study maths, physics and chemistry at 'A' level. He gained a place at Sheffield University in 2002 to study Systems and Control Engineering and graduated this year with a Masters degree, together with the Mappin Medal and Premium in Automatic Control and Systems Engineering. Ben's hobbies include sailing, for which he has competed in both inland and offshore races, and caving. He spent July in Crete exploring and mapping new caves with Sheffield University Caving Club. He currently works for a defence company as a production engineer
