PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

Election?

By the time you read this, the deadline (April 4th) for receipt of nominations for membership of the parish council may have passed and we will be waiting to see if there have been sufficient applicants (more than 10 required) to make an election necessary. If there are more than 10 nominations an election will be held at parish expense, on May 3rd, to coincide with the district council elections. If there are not more than 10, then all nominated councillors will meet to elect officers and commence business at the annual meeting of the PC on May 8th.

Lafarge

At the Hope Works parish councils liaison committee meeting on March 13th, it was confirmed that consultants have been commissioned, by Lafarge, to study the feasibility of a direct road connection from the works to Bradwell. It was pointed out that whilst this new road would offer no perceived benefits to Bradwell, it would completely eliminate works traffic from Brough and halve that which currently passes through Hope.

Youth Opportunities Fund (YOF)

A village project group has now been formed and an application prepared for the £7000 grant offered to the village by the YOF. The aims listed in the application are based on the needs expressed by Bradwell teenagers in a survey carried out by Jeanette Jewell. Barry Fletcher is leading the group and he will allocate the funds as agreed by the group committee. Whilst this is not a PC initiative, the PC has pledged its support and we have agreed to receive and hold the funds on behalf of the group until they are needed

Scouts

As part of the above project, Councillor Ashley Briggs has agreed to undertake scout-master training with a view to reestablishing a scout troop and bringing the scout-hut back into service. Hopefully the scout-hut might eventually also be made available as a drop-in centre for young people. Anyone interested in helping with this venture should contact Ashley (tel. 623575)

Until now, site-notices have been the main method of letting people know about applications in the National Park, with letters being sent only to the nearest neighbours, but from this month (March 07) the National Park

Authority will estimate the impact of a proposal on the immediate locality, and notify neighbours accordingly. For more sensitive sites, such as listed buildings and conservation areas, or for major proposals, the Authority will use both site-notices and letters. Site-notices will still be used in rural, or less built-up areas where there are no immediate neighbours. Applications for major developments will still be advertised in the local press when required by the planning legislation. BRADWELL HISTORICAL SOCIETY - 17th April Alison Uttley - A Derbyshire Childhood

If you are a reader with an interest in women authors, have a love and knowledge of the countryside, especially folk lore, or if you collect second hand books then this talk is for you. Alison Uttley (1884 - 1976) was born on a Derbyshire farm. She gained an honours degree in Physics at Manchester University, started writing for magazines in the 1920's and wrote the first "Little Grey Rabbit" book in 1929. When her husband died in 1930 she turned to writing to support herself and her young son. Her many books include the "Sam Pig" series and twenty titles for adults.

TOWNGATE - BI CENTENARY CELEBRATIONS

Two hundred years ago Towngate would have been buzzing. The finishing touches were being put to the Methodist Chapel (ex Wesleyan). The builder was William Marsh of Aston Lane and his workmen would have quenched their thirst with ale from the Bull's Head (Towngate) and the White Hart. As well as these workmen, Methodist men and women would have given their time labouring as a religious duty for the cause.

Bradwell was an important Methodist stronghold. John Wesley had twice preached in Towngate and this is recorded in his journal. Since those early days, when the chapel was lighted by candles there have been many improvements, alterations and repairs, some quite costly.

ERNEST CROOKS

Mr Ernest Crooks died at home on 4th March aged 85 years. Born in Chesterfield, the only son of Horace and Madge Crookes he lived in the Spital area of Chesterfield went to school there. He started work at Markham's Engineering Company and in 1950 came to work at the Newburgh Engineering Company, where he remained until retiring at age 66, although he continued working part-time until he was 82. Ernest married Dorothy Marriott at Newbold Church in 1947. They lived at first with his parents, then at Newbold, then moving to Great Hucklow and finally to Bradwell - first to Hugh Lane and then to the Orchard. He was a keen cyclist until he met Dot, then took up rambling and developed a general interest in nature. Ernest enjoyed holidays in Cornwall and Scotland, but his greatest pleasure was collecting stamps, an interest he retained all his life. He leaves his wife Dot, sons David and Michael, grandchildren Louise, Martin and Dominic and a great-grandson Ellis. Cremation took place at Hutcliffe Wood followed by a service of thanksgiving at St Barnabas Church on 1st March.

BRIAN RAMSDALE

Mr Brian Ramsdale died at Los Cristianos Hospital, Los Gigantes, Tenerife on 17th February while on holiday. He was aged 71 years. Eldest son of John and Bertha Ramsdale he lived at Smithy Hill before moving to Batham Road. He was educated at the church school before starting work as a gardener at the Marquis of Granby, remaining there until leaving to do his National Service in the RAMC in the Salisbury area. On leaving the army he worked at Kitchen's Gardens before working for the Debson family at Hathersage. He then moved to Hope Valley college where he remained until his retirement. In 1962 Brian married Heather Johnstone and they lived at Church Street until moving to Bridge House where they remained for 40 years. Two further moves took them to Michlow Drive and Gore Lane. Brian was a keen chrysanthemum grower, exhibiting all over the country and at national shows, winning many cups and medals. He even exhibited at the International Chrysanthemum Show in Canada. In later years he became a judge at the shows and his advice was sought by clubs and growers throughout the country. His proudest moment was when the President of the National Chrysanthemum Society presented him with the societies' silver medal for outstanding service. He leaves his wife Heather, and brothers Keith, Alan, Michael and Eric. Cremation took place at Hutcliffe Wood followed by a service of thanksgiving at St Barnabas Church on 13th March.

BRADWELL WAR MEMORIAL HALL

Because the Hall is a village amenity there have been two grants given from the Derbyshire County Council. One was for new windows to replace the old ones, which were in a bad state of disrepair and the second was to replace the window curtains. Neither of these items could have been replaced without additional financial help. The Memorial Hall was built in 1921 financed only by money collected from the village community, who gave willingly. When you enter the Hall through the front door you will see wooden plaques naming the lads of Bradwell who gave their lives that we might live. Now, if the Hall is to continue, it needs people prepared to help run it. We are fortunate, and very grateful, that someone has offered to be Treasurer in place of Margaret Grasby, but people are needed for the Committee.
