PARISH COUNCIL NOTES**Affordable Housing Survey**

This survey of Bradwell housing needs was carried out last January and February and was supplemented by workshops involving local people. The results have now been analysed and we have invited the people who carried out the survey and workshops to attend our November Council meeting to present their findings and recommendations. Anyone can attend this meeting, but Council standing orders do not allow visitor participation in debates, unless specifically agreed by a majority of Councillors. However, if any residents wish to speak on non-agenda matters, they can do so in the first ten minutes of any PC meeting. We hope for a good attendance, because this is a very important issue for the village, particularly in view of the proposed re-development of the Newburgh site. The meeting will be held in the Methodist Hall, on November 6th., commencing at 7.30pm.

Carnival Funding

As you know, the Carnival is managed by the Parish Council Carnival Committee and subsidised from the Parish precept. Two years ago we decided to allow local organisations to take over our previous cash collection activities on Carnival day and to use the proceeds for their own purposes. This year the beneficiaries were - the Sports Club, the Parish Church, the Bowls Club and Mountain Rescue. We understand that they jointly raised around £2200, much of which will be used to the benefit of village residents. Despite the obvious success of the event this year, we are still left with an overall deficit of around £2300. This will have to be replenished from the precept, if the Carnival is to be staged next year. At our October meeting, Councillors unanimously agreed to the replenishment, but we would be pleased to hear your views.

PC Youth Centre

At the time of writing, the planned official opening date of the Centre is November 1st., and will be carried out by the High Sheriff of Derbyshire. A report of the opening will appear in the next issue. Attendances are continuing to exceed 40 young people at each session. Thanks to Newburgh Engineering, the problem of heating the Centre over the winter has been resolved. Newburgh have given us three new large electric space-heaters – just in time for the onset of frosty evenings.

Old British Legion Site

We need extra storage space to accommodate PC equipment and Carnival items. We are considering applying for temporary planning permission to put a container on the site for this purpose. Before we make a decision we would like to hear from anyone who has objections to this proposal. Please make your views known to the Parish Clerk.

Millennium Children

As you know, DCC Highways have removed the District Council Millennium Tree on road safety grounds. We have retained the two memorial plaques and have agreed to make a new single plaque which will be installed in a central village location. TITAN CAVE DISCOVERY

Hope Valley College, 7.30pm Thursday 15th November.

BRITAIN'S biggest cave was discovered in the heart of the Peak District, and only because of the determination and detective work of Derbyshire pot-holer and leading cave explorer, Dave Nixon. He and his team discovered the natural marvel after seven years of searching based on an obscure manuscript from Cambridge library. The cave has been called Titan - and at 459 feet deep - 140 metres - it reaches as high as the London Eye. Carved out over millions of years by water eroding limestone it contains a massive waterfall. To hear about this amazing discovery at first hand come along to Hope Valley College for a talk by Dave Nixon illustrated with photographs.

.....and THE OFSTED INSPECTION

The Juniors started the new school year on 4th September, and two days later received notice of an Ofsted inspection to begin the following week. As the teachers were only just getting to know their new children and making a start on their planned work, this was quite an anxious time for them. However, the inspector who visited was quite understanding of the situation. He did a very thorough examination of all aspects of school activity, even going to talk to parents waiting to pick up their children from the school gate. The results of the inspection were very pleasing. Of the 26 areas inspected, one was judged "Satisfactory", 24 assessed as "Good" and "the extent to which learners make a positive contribution to the community" as being "Outstanding". The inspector said, "Standards in English, Mathematics and Science are above average and achievement is good". The report praised the work of staff in all the areas examined stating "Teaching and learning are good", "Care, guidance and support are good" and "Staff provide good support for pupils who need additional help, and successfully challenge the more able". The children were praised too, for their involvement in the running of the school through the School Council and the ECO Council, and for their excellent community spirit. We can all feel proud of the Head, Staff, Governors and above all the children of our village Junior School, to whom this government inspector has given such an excellent report
