Karen has an NVQ level 3 qualification in Childcare and Development, lives in Bradwell and has two young children. Pre School is extremely lucky to have such a super team and they are much appreciated. Pre School's AGM will be held in October where we will be saying goodbye to our Chairperson, Adrienne Millar and our Treasurer, Kim Copley. Pre School re-opens for the new term on Monday 8th September at 9:00am until 12:00pm, four days per week (Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday). Children can start from the age of 2½ with free funded places available from the term after their 3rd birthday.



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PARISH COUNCIL NOTES***Newburgh Development Referendum?***

Yes - there will be a village referendum on the outline plan, which is expected to be submitted to Peak Park within the next two weeks. This was decided almost unanimously by the sixty residents who attended the public meeting held in the Memorial Hall on September 26th. The meeting also decided the question to be asked in the referendum, which will be **'Are you for the outline application in its presented form and scale'**, to which voters can answer yes or no. It was also agreed that the Parish Council should fund the estimated £700 cost of the referendum process. We agreed to give residents the earliest possible indication of the referendum date, which is expected to be in about 6 weeks time. Peak Park Officers have suggested that the size of this proposed development, which will be the biggest single application ever made in the Peak District National Park, and the number of local people who might wish to attend or speak may cause them to convene the Planning Committee in Bradwell to make their decision. We will be pressing them to do this and also to arrange a Committee site visit prior to the decision meeting.

Councillor vacancy

Councillor Brian Hardy is leaving the village and moving to Buxton and has consequently resigned from the Parish Council. Brian was a County Council Highways Engineer before he retired and his knowledge and advice have been invaluable to the Council, particularly in his role as a member of our Rights of Way and Common Land Committee. We thank him for his service to the village and wish him all the best in his new residence. We therefore now have a vacancy for a Councillor and invite applications from eligible residents to join us. If you feel that you would like to contribute to managing the business of the PC and could regularly attend our meetings, which are held on the first Tuesday of each month, please contact the Parish Clerk (tel. 620329).

PC Youth Centre

We have received a cheque for £5,000 from Nationwide Building Society which is to be spent on improvements to the Centre. We thank them for this generous donation and we also thank Dales Housing, for arranging it with them on our behalf. We anticipate having a new Centre Coordinator in post in November. Meanwhile, we would like to hear from anyone who is willing to act as a volunteer helper at the Centre on one evening per month. Wortley Court

Some concern has been expressed to the PC regarding the new access onto the site from the rear of a property in New Church Street. Permission was given to the property owner, by Dales Housing and County Highways, without reference to

Wortley Court residents or the PC, which owns Wortley Field - Dales Housing being the leaseholder. Dales acquired the lease from the old Bakewell Rural District Council via DDDC. We understand, from reading the original PC minutes relating to the lease, that conditions were attached to it regarding restriction of access permission to the site and we are taking this up with both Authorities. Many residents of Wortley Court have signed a petition requesting the provision of a lay-by on the school side of the access road to alleviate the damage being caused to the grass verge. The PC was asked to support the survey but has deferred a decision pending resolution of the new access issue, which is in the same area as the lay-by requested by the petitioners.

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REBELLION KNOLL W.I.

Our meeting on 10 September began with mariachi-style music, maracas and castanets. Two very nice ladies in true Calendar Girl style then began to undress – all with great elegance and in the best possible taste, of course – we are the WI after all!!!

Fourteen members welcomed Jane Latham and Kath Charlesworth, they of Cycle Cuba fame. The ladies told members of this their first visit to Cuba, the cycle ride with 32 other cyclists (and one man!!!), from all over England, ages ranging from 29-69 years of age and their efforts to 'get fit', raise money to fund their trip and to ultimately raise the profile of the WI, all in the celebratory year of the WI's 90th birthday. The 'undressing' was to show we non-cyclists, the type of clothing needed to sustain their trek: seamless shorts with padded bottoms (no comment please!!!), gel seats, all-weather leggings, special shoes, ingenious drinks bottles, special gloves, sunglasses, all topped off with the obligatory safety helmet. To fund the trip - £2,250 each (£1,235 actual personal cost) was needed – some serious sponsorship was undertaken and very generous donations given. So, our two intrepid cyclists, got out their bikes, dusted themselves off and began their fitness regime; slowly at first – mini bike rides building over a period of twelve months, to distances of 100+ miles per journey some over just one day, others (longer) over 2/3 days and one in particular covered 450 miles of the west Irish countryside (4/5days). Fundraising events were organised and involved: auctions, a 'posh puds' evening, dinner parties, car boot sales, quiz nights, raffles, garden parties, special lunches to name but a few and with funds still coming in, a massive £7,000+ (at the last count) was raised. All set then and the two ladies set off from Heathrow to fulfil their mission on behalf of the WI and all those who had sponsored them. The Cuban countryside proved testing for our cyclists; hilly, poor road surfaces with many pot holes, punctures, falls, cuts, bumps and bruises but the locals were friendly and merriment, curiosity and music met them wherever our ladies went. At all times the group was accompanied by medics, mini-buses, tour guides and they were exceptionally well looked after. There was time for culture stops; a visit to the Che Gevara museum (which unfortunately was closed), memorials to the fallen of Cuba's battles all of which the Cubans were immensely

proud; a solitary man rolling Havana cigars, a visit to a zoo of exotic animals. Whilst the Cuban people lived in poverty and poor social and economic conditions, they were very proud of their heritage and their country in particular and were pleased to meet and great this curious band of people and join in the euphoria. All in all, a very enjoyable and educational trip culminating on the final day, with a rousing rendition of Jerusalem from the group atop the Es Cambré mountains.

The entire group have met twice since to enjoy reminiscences of their Cycle Cuba excursion. They cycled 328kms over a period of 5 days, and raised £83,000 for Denman College – the dedicated WI College in Oxford. Well done ladies – we applaud you all (and secretly wish we had the stamina to have done it). Our next meeting 'Bobbin Lace' will take place in the Methodist School Room, Towngate, on Wednesday 8 October at 7:30pm. Come on ladies of Bradwell, join us, you might be quite surprised and will certainly be very welcome.

GLYN ALLEN BATES

Mr Glyn Bates died in the Hallamshire Hospital on 8th August aged 58 years. Born in Bakewell, one of the three children of Ron and Eileen Bates, he was educated at Litton School and then at Tideswell Purseglove School. On leaving school he served an apprenticeship at Newburgh Engineering Company, and went on to work at Carbolite before spending 31 years at Ferodo.

Glyn married Anne Nadin and they lived at Chapel-en-le-Frith before moving to Bradwell fifteen years ago. He was a keen cyclist and a member of Bradwell Cycling Club. He was also a football fan and enjoyed the occasional game of golf.

He leaves his wife Anne, son Matthew, daughter Kerry, grandchildren Ella and Harry, brother Stephen and sister Sonia. The funeral was at St Barnabas Church, followed by burial at Litton on 20th August.

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
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
