## PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

**Newburgh Referendum:** The planning application has been delivered to Peak Park and registered by them. The application documents are available for viewing on the Peak Park web-site and this link will take you directly to it -

(<http://217.147.178.232/pam/view.jsp?ID=NP%2FDDDD%2F1208%2F1089>). Newburgh Engineering have agreed to hold an exhibition of the proposed development at the Methodist Hall on Saturday Jan. 24th from 9am to 1pm. The referendum will be conducted by officers of Derbyshire Dales DC in the Memorial Hall on Friday Jan 30th between 4pm and 9pm and the result will be announced that evening. DDDC have advised us that ballot cards will not be issued and registered electors wishing to vote should arrange to attend at the appropriate time – preferably with some means of identification. Apart from the referendum, residents can make their personal views known by writing directly to Peak Park and can attend the meeting at which the PC decides its response. Peak Park say they are planning a meeting, in Bradwell, to explain the process and to answer residents questions, but the date for that had not been fixed at the time of printing this newsletter.

**Co-op newspapers/magazines:** At our PC meeting, on Dec. 2nd., we discussed the Co-op's plan to stock newspapers and magazines when the store reopened on Dec. 6th. Councillors were unanimously against the Coop initiative because we felt that it could seriously impair the viability of the Post Office in its current form. We asked the Co-op Head Office to reconsider but they declined and instead offered a meeting. This took place on Dec. 30th and was attended by two senior managers from Manchester. They listened to all our arguments and concerns regarding the future of the PO and indeed the future of all retailing in the village, but were unmoved. Their view is that they offer an alternative service which they will only withdraw if it is not used. **It therefore lies with the people of Bradwell to decide.**

**Dale End:** We have been pursuing adverse possession of this roped-off piece of land for almost a year and are supported in this by Peak Park – who are offering a grant towards removal of the trees. One of the potentially interested parties we contacted was the Duchy of Lancaster because we believed they probably held the mineral rights to the site. However, they surprised us, in September, by saying that they think they may actually own the land itself and, if so, might lease it to the PC at a minimal rent. They said they were investigating and would get back to us asap. As yet we have heard nothing more from them and cannot now proceed further until we do.

**Carnival – PA system:** The PC Carnival Committee would like to hear from anyone who would be willing to loan us a PA system for use on Beggars Plot on Carnival Day (August 1st 2009). Please contact the Parish Clerk (620329) if you have one available or know someone who might.

**Lafarge/PC Liaison Committee:** At our meeting at Hope Works on June 9th, the manager, Ashley Bryan, revealed the effects of the credit crunch on the cement business. One Hope kiln has been closed down until the end of March and production is being reduced at all other works to reflect an estimated national reduction of one million tons per annum. No redundancies or lay-offs are planned for Hope but capital expenditure has been severely curtailed and the proposed new access road to Bradwell is no longer a priority. Chris Furness

In many medical emergencies, simple but critical actions by trained responders can save lives. This is especially the case for heart attacks, loss of consciousness and serious breathing difficulties. No experience is necessary to become a Responder as all training is provided by the East Midlands Ambulance Service and Derbyshire St John Ambulance. Volunteers do need to be qualified drivers. ## LAWRENCE GARTSIDE

Lawrence Gartside of Hill Head, Bradwell died peacefully in his own home on 28th October, 2008 with his family around him. Born in Skelton, North Yorkshire in 1914 he came to live in Bradwell, soon after marrying Annie, from New Nook, Bradwell. Lawrence was a talented, self-taught musician who played many instruments, including trombone, saxophone and clarinet. He also had a very good singing voice. During the War he was with the Royal Marines Band, stationed at Portland Bill. After the War he formed his own band, and during the summer months he went to Butlins and other venues to play with big-name dance bands. He also did recordings for the BBC. He was quite a 'character' and his mode of transport was usually a motor bike, an old Jowett Javelin or an NSU, bought at knock-down prices. He would mostly be seen under the bonnet making repairs! Lawrence was a family man, and every year took them camping, or when he was travelling they would stay with him at his lodgings. He leaves four children - Joan, Goff, Ken and Larry.

## MORE ON BRADDA DADS

Bradda Dads are hosting the first ever 'Wolf's Pit Fell Race' on 22nd March 2009.
