SAVE OUR VILLAGE CHURCH

"Thousands of Churches face closure in the next decade......In the Church of England alone, which still has 16,000 Churches, 1,700 have been made redundant since 1969" (Times Online Feb.10th. 2007). What about St. Barnabas? Will it survive the next decade? Well it depends: it depends on the people who attend St. Barnabas and also it depends on the other people in Bradwell. At present, the members of St. Barnabas are taking a critical look at the life and work of the Church. They are seeking a way forward for everyone: "for everyone", because it can be argued that St. Barnabas Church belongs to everyone - to the Village. Local people raised money to build the Church and gave the majority of what you see inside. The Fabric of the Church is a huge concern: £164,000 needs to be raised for the roof alone. The PCC would like to set up a "building committee", a group of interested people who would look in detail at grants and fund raising etc., but the PCC cannot go it alone: it is willing to continue to work hard in this endeavour but it needs the energy and expertise of other people in Bradwell. PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

Newburgh Development

The referendum, held on Friday January 30th produced the following result:

NO - 301 Votes: YES - 50 Votes (on a 26.9% turnout of the electorate).

On Friday February 6th Peak Park officers and Planning Committee members are holding a question and answer session in the Memorial Hall (7pm - 9pm) to which all electors are invited. They will describe the consultation process and how individuals can best make their views known to the Planning Committee.

On Friday February 13th in the Methodist Hall (7.30 start) the PC will be conducting a surgery at which the views of residents can be aired and may be noted for inclusion in its response to the Newburgh planning application.

On Monday February 16th in the Methodist Hall (7.30pm start) the PC will meet to decide its response. This is a public meeting, to which all electors are invited, but standing orders exclude public participation in the debate, which will continue until a response to the application is constructed and agreed by a majority of Councillors.

The PC response and any direct individual responses have to be received at Peak Park by the deadline date of February 20th in order to be taken into consideration by planners. It is now expected that the Peak Park Planning Committee will make its decision on the application at a special meeting at the Bakewell Agricultural Business Centre in early April (date not yet set). This will be a day-time meeting and open to the public. Individuals wishing to address the Committee would need to request a speaking slot at least 3 days in advance of the meeting.

The PC is considering providing a bus to the meeting if there appears to be sufficient demand from residents. Chris Furness

MR HARRY WOOD BROADBENT

Harry Broadbent died on 20th December at Walkley nursing home aged 83 years. Born in Bradwell, one of seven children of George and Lily Broadbent, he was educated at the Church of England school and during the War he and his twin brother Archie joined the Royal Navy together. He worked at the Spar Mines for Dawson's and then Houchins until retirement. He leaves six nieces and nephews. A funeral service followed by burial took place at St Barnabas Church on 2nd January, 2009

MR FRANK IVAN WATSON

Ivan Watson died at home on 16th December aged 63 years. Born at Bamford, the only child of Frank and Iris Watson, he went to school in Bamford and then held several jobs before spending nine years working at Glebe Mine. He then moved to Blue Circled cement works where he remained until taking early retirement after suffering a serious accident at work. He married Josephine Dakin and they lived with her parents for a few months before moving to the house in Smalldale where he spent the rest of his life. Ivan was a keen Sheffield United supporter and enjoyed watching football, going to the Speedway, gardening, fishing, playing snooker and watching ancient history programmes. He leaves his wife Josephine, daughter Kay, son Paul, son-inlaw Frasier and grand-daughters Charlotte and Isabelle. The funeral service followed by burial took place at St Barnabas Church on 30th December.

MRS EUNICE MARGARET CLAYTON

Eunice Clayton died in Newholme Hospital on 11th December aged 92 years. Born in Cressbrook, the only daughter of George and Margaret Robinson, she left school in Cressbrook at the age of twelve to work for the vicar at Tideswell. At first she had to walk from Cressbrook to start work as a housemaid at 6am, but later she 'lived in'. In 1937 she married Ron Clayton and they lived in Tideswell. From 1951 to 1978 she lived in the Institute after Ron took over the job of caretaker in the church school and verger/caretaker of the church. On Ron's retirement they moved to Sherwood Road where she remained until 1996, when she moved to Bradwell. During the War she looked after two evacuees from Manchester and they continued to visit her and remain in touch for the rest of her life. The Church was her life and she took part in its many activities such as sewing classes, coffee mornings and the church choir. When she moved to

Bradwell she again became involved with the church, joining the Ladies' Fellowship and the Luncheon Club. She leaves daughters Dot and Janet, son-in-law David, grandchildren and great grand-children. Her husband Ron, brother Fred, and son-in-law Sid predeceased her. The funeral was at Tideswell Church and cremation at Hutcliffe Wood on 22nd December. Her ashes were laid to rest alongside her husband in Tideswell churchyard on 29th December.

MRS EILEEN KNOWLES

Eileen Knowles of Joiners Cottage, Towngate, died peacefully on December 9th 2008, aged 92. Born in Catcliffe, the youngest of five children she came to work in Bradwell in 1932. In 1941, she married Teddy, whose family ran the White Hart, and they set up home in Joiner's Cottage where Eileen was to live for the rest of her life. On leaving the army, Teddy ran his joinery and decorating business from the workshop next door (now Tom Cottage). For more than 20 years Eileen worked at the Toll Bar gift-shop in Castleton. She had many interests and was creative and artistic. Her family and the village pantomime benefited greatly from her dressmaking skills. In her younger days, Eileen was involved in most village activities, particularly those associated with the Church. She was a keen gardener and usually very successful with her entries in village horticultural shows. In her heyday, outings to Ascot and St. Leger with family and friends were special treats as were her trips on the QE2. In later years she was a helper at the Luncheon Club and a member of the Ladies Christian Fellowship and Golden Age. She leaves daughters Sandra and Patricia, four grandchildren and four great grandchildren. The funeral service, followed by burial, was at St. Barnabas Church on December 19th 2008
