PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

Dale Quarry Public Meeting (Thursday July 16th Memorial Hall 7.30pm)

The Dale Quarry site and surrounding land was awarded to the parish in the Bradwell Enclosure Act of 1819 "for the purpose of the getting of stone for the parish roads" and it served that purpose for more than 100 years. Men who could find no other work were able to rent stalls at the quarry, from the PC, and sell the stone they produced to road maintenance contractors. The void they created was later used for village refuse disposal. In the 1970s the then parish council had the idea of turning the guarry site into a picnic area and successfully applied for it to become a 'Common', which allowed any resident to use it for any legal purpose approved by the Council. There were some unforeseen consequences and the council later tried to restrict access. Consequently, we now find ourselves in possession of a large piece of land which is more of a liability than an asset and we are looking at ways of reversing that. We have carried out a risk assessment for insurance purposes and are arranging for the necessary works and safety notices to deal with the immediate issues. One possible way of creating value in the site would be to transfer the common land status from the quarry to Beggars Plot and we agreed to consider this option at our June meeting. It is a valid legal process but we need to prove to Government officers that it would be beneficial for the village and generally acceptable to residents. It would be an expensive option. We would have to submit £4900 with the application and this would not be refundable - whether or not the application was successful. Legal costs and other fees could add another £1000.

We have therefore decided to call this public meeting to gauge your opinion on the proposal and to consider any other possible options for the future of the quarry. Please come along and give us your views

New Councillor

Vanessa Horstead's co-option to the Council, at our June meeting, brings us back to our full complement of ten councillors. Vanessa moved to Fern Bank, Bradwell from Sheffield two years ago. She is married, with four children, and has spent most of her adult life in and around the Peak District. She is already a member of the PC Carnival Committee and the WI and has recently taken over the management of advertising in the newsletter. What attracted Vanessa to Bradwell is its vibrant working community status - and she's keen to see it remain that way.

Events planned for the field include Malcolm Sowerby's dogs and ducks, a children's magic show, queen and rosebud competitions, clowns and jugglers, band parades and lots of stalls, games, sideshows. and rides etc. The car park this year is on Margaret Morley's field (thanks Margaret) and will again be managed by Bowling Club members. Our thanks go to Mrs Mulvey for the use of her electricity supply on the day and to Pete Higgs for the loan of his PA system. Also to Lafarge for the gift of ropes and spikes for the arenas, trophies for the queen's competitions and four folding tables. The PC has granted exclusive rights for street collections on Carnival day to the Well Dressings Committee and the Centenary Players. Storybag is a community theatre which uses local people to bring theatre and entertainment to local audiences. We started in 2002 as a storytelling company touring around Derbyshire primary schools. Since then we have secured funding from Derbyshire District and County Councils to tour Reminiscence Theatre projects to residential and day centres for the elderly in our area. The 15 Minute shows started in 2004 out of my desire to contribute something towards gala week and also to share with the village some of the talent that exists among us. The shows have gone from strength to strength, to date we have produced 15 Minute versions of Hamlet, Grease, Wizard of Oz, The Sound of Music and Oliver and remains a very popular part of our Storybag's work. This will be our third consecutive year appearing at The Bakewell Show. We will never forget our roots however and for our performances in Bradwell we go under the banner of the Centenary Players and a proportion of all proceeds raised goes to The Players. The remainder goes towards the production costs of next years show. Everyone involved puts a tremendous amount of hard work and energy into these shows and their reward is your continued support. This year we have a bonkers Miss Marple battling for clues with an apoplectic Poirot, we have singing servants and many more crazy characters - all trying to work out Whodunnit. REBELLION KNOLL W.I.

Having made final arrangements for our stall at Bradwell Carnival an almost full house settled down to hear Lucy Wright from Longstone Hardy Plant Nursery. Lucy was initially a violinist with a BBC Orchestra but decided later in life to follow her love of plants. She returned to her birth place at Great Longstone and set about resurrecting a now beautiful walled garden, determined to propagate and grow all her own hardy plants which would survive in the Peak District's variable climate. Helped by her husband, Chief Mower of the paddock which now serves as the car park, she installed her own water conserving irrigation system (Bradda Allotments take note) and eventually opened to the public in 2003. Using peat free compost and helped by manure from her uncle's cows she works on her own propagating many unusual plants. In keeping with this year's WI's resolution, SOS for honeybees, she listed a number of bee friendly plants. Lucy has recently been awarded the Peak District's Environmental Quality Mark, and supplies some National Trust sites with her plants. She welcomes visitors, encourages them to walk round her nursery - you won't find any 'Keep Off' signs here! - and will take orders often a year in advance. The room was abuzz with questions and the swapping of horticultural tips which attested to the interest shown in this fascinating talk and Lucy finally left with a lot less plants than she came with!
