PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Jubilee Celebrations: The parish council would like to work with a village organisation or organisations to celebrate the jubilee weekend. An idea of a party in the park (Town bottom playing fields) on Saturday 4th June has been proposed. The Bakehouse have offered to prepare picnic bags which will contain a sandwich, cake, snack, and a drink. There will be four options - Vegetarian, Meat, Vegan and Gluten free. The picnic bags will also contain a voucher for a free ice-cream from Khazi café. This will be funded by the parish council and a Jubilee grant from Derbyshire Dales District Council. If there is enough interest in the event there will also be a bar on the field. If any village organisation or organisations would like to work with the parish council to organise the event, can you please contact the parish clerk for more details. If the event goes ahead details on how to order your picnic bag will be published on the village notice boards and also on Facebook on Bradwell Hope Valley Community Forum.

Carnival: Carnival this year is on Saturday 30th July and the theme is "70-year celebrations". If anyone would like to help with planning we would be delighted to hear from you. The next carnival planning meeting will be in May (date to be announced on the village notice boards).

Flooding in the village: Council are continuing to put pressure on the Environment Agency to come to the village to discuss the flooding issues that the village has suffered throughout the winter. County Councillor Alasdair Sutton is supporting the efforts of the parish council and is trying to help prioritise our issues with the Environment agency, who have many other flooding issues they are trying to resolve. Council will continue to press for action and to seek to move our problems up the queue for action.

Play equipment: Two proposals for new play equipment for Beggars Plot playing field have been developed. The next step is to meet with the school in May to share with pupils the options available to them so they can help with choosing the equipment. When their views have been considered a final specification will be created and quotes for supply and installation of the equipment obtained. Installation will not be until after the summer holidays, as the installation crews are already fully booked for work in other schools during their summer holidays.

Public Participation: Residents continue to attend council meetings to raise matters of concern directly with Council. We welcome members of the public at both the main council and all committee meetings. Council meetings are generally held at 7:30 p.m. on the first Tuesday. See the parish notice boards (on the side of the Memorial Hall and in the Peace Gardens bus shelter) for meeting announcements and agendas.

TALES OF OLD BRADWELL

In a copy of the Derbyshire times dated May 1933 we find the following announcement:

Mr. B P FISCHER AND MISS G. IBBOTSON

Spring sunshine flooded the church of St James and St John Derwent on 22nd April 1933, when Miss Gladys Ibbotson, second daughter of Mrs F Walker and the late Mr Walter Ibbotson of 'Nether Ashop' was married to Mr Bernhard Percy Fischer eldest son of Mr and Mrs P B Fischer of 'The Croft' Bradwell.. The service was conducted by the vicar of Derwent Rev W E House. Given away by her stepfather (Mr Frank Walker) the bride presented a charming figure in a gown of pale blue satin and shoes to match. She wore a wreath and veil, which were held in position by a narrow coronet of blossom. Three bridesmaids were in attendance on the bride. They were Miss Lily Ibbotson and Miss Violet Ibbotson (sisters of the bride) and Miss Hilda Fischer (sister of the bridegroom). All wore ankle length dress of silk with coatees and crinoline hats set with silver leaves. The bouquets were composed of golden irises and fern. The best man was Mr Alan Fischer, brother of the bridegroom. Immediately after the ceremony a reception was held at 'Bank House' and attended by about thirty guests. Tables for the wedding breakfast were tastefully decorated for the occasion by Mrs Hubbard assisted by Miss Mason. The happy couple were the recipients of a large number of useful presents. The honeymoon is being spent at Ranskill, Nottinghamshire. On their return Mr and Mrs B P Fischer will reside at 'Winhill' on the main road between Bamford and Hope.

Later, Bernard was living on Gore Lane when Pamela Mann painted a picture of him in his garden. The name of Ibbotson has both past and present associations with Bradwell. Although the spelling differs slightly (and the spelling of some Bradwell

names has varied across the centuries) in the Derby Quarter Sessions record for 1753 Robert Ibberson of Smalldale is shown as a licenced victualler being sponsored by George Duddin. Today we still have Ibbotsons living in the village. Purely by chance, the same page of the Derbyshire Times that describes the wedding has a long walk description by Bernhard Percy Fischer's father Percy Bernhard written under the pen name of 'Viator'. In the 1930s 'Viator' contributed to the newspaper a series called 'Rambles in the Peak'. These consisted of descriptions of walks illustrated by Percy's fine pen and ink sketches and historical descriptions of the places visited. Number III in the series describes a ramble from 'Bradwell Water to Derwent Head'. He starts on Bradwell Bridge, at a time before its rebuilding and ends up looking over to Saltergate from Shatton. Interestingly, he mentions on the way that the pools along the Brook in the 'The Holmes' were used by the Baptists as dipping places. DOT HAWKINS - 1927 to 2022



Dot, born and raised in Kent, came with her husband lan to live in Bradwell in 1991 when lan retired from the Ministry, making their home in Bradwell Head Road. They soon became valued members of the community. Dot was a licensed Reader in the Church, and often led services when needed. She

and lan held some healing services and started Village Praise, a monthly informal service for all ages. For her outstanding service to the Church, she was awarded the Bishop's Medal and received this at a service in Derby Cathedral in Sept. 2014. During the 27 years she lived in the village, Dot was a member of the Church Council, PCC Secretary, organist and choir leader. She loved children, and was one of the team leading the After-school club, held in the Methodist schoolroom, also helping at Messy Church. Dot had a deep Christian faith, she saw the good in both people and any situation, was a good friend to many and will be sadly missed by her family and all who have known her. She died on April 6th 2022.

PERSONAL ANNOUNCEMENTS

GERALD HUGH BRADWELL



Gerald passed away on 15 March 2022 in Haddon House, Clowne aged 88. He was born in Smithy Hill, Bradwell and was the youngest of four children born to Hugh and Elsie Bradwell. He attended Bradwell C of E School, along with his sisters Freda, Jean and Marjorie and then went on to New Mills Grammar School. After a short time serving in the RAF, he worked at Blue Circle as an electrician until 1966. He then

moved, with his wife Brenda and six children, to Dronfield, to work at Granville College in Sheffield as a lecturer in electrical engineering and later at Chesterfield College. A sporting man all his life, he played both football and cricket from an early age for both Bradwell and Earle's. After moving to Dronfield, he played for and coached the first ever junior team at nearby Coal Aston Cricket Club, leading them to become county champions with success at national level. His five sons all played at Coal Aston, and he achieved recognition from Derbyshire County Cricket for his lifelong service to the game. A hugely popular, well liked and sociable character, Gerald made many friends through sport and was a lifelong supporter of Sheffield United. He greatly enjoyed going to Bramall Lane, often accompanied by his sons and grandchildren. He leaves behind Brenda, their children Paul, Carol, Nicholas, Julian, Christopher and Ian, seven grandchildren and two great grandchildren. The funeral service and burial took place at St Barnabas Church, Bradwell on 13 April 2022.


CAROLYN TURNER



Carolyn died on 17th March 2022, aged 85, having spent her final months in care in Bakewell. Depending upon when and where you met her she was also known as Lyn or Carol. After an adventurous, well-travelled childhood – despite the restrictions following WWII – which included a trip by train to (West) Ger-

many to meet a lifelong 'penpal', Carolyn's love for and talent at art led her to London where she studied at Slade School of Fine Art and the Royal College of Art. Whilst there she spent much time in galleries, at the theatre and watching ballet, the latter being something at which she excelled until she left Abbeydale Girls Grammar School in Sheffield. Subsequently Carolyn trained as a pattern cutter and dress designer which included time in the cutting room of a famously temperamental haute-couture designer. Having met her husband Max at a ubiquitous tea dance ("he was a bit short, but what a dancer") they married in 1959, moving to Selsey then to Rutland and Lancashire before settling in Cheshire. Throughout that time Carolyn designed, cut and created haute couture dresses for the landed gentry, before becoming one of the design team for children's clothes at Mothercare in the mid-1970s and later ran her own interior furnishings business. She pursued her love for gardening, growing vegetables and dog ownership in her spare time and, after a work-related sojourn in Chichester, Carolyn and Max wended their way back north, ending up in Bradwell. Carolyn leaves her sons, Andrew and Edward and three grandchildren.


