ST BARNABAS CHURCH



COMMUNITY LAND TRUST

After six Bradwell families moved into affordable homes at Bradwell Springs last summer, the CLT is continuing to work hard to provide housing for local people. We are hoping that six more families will move into Bradwell Springs by the end of this year, bringing to a successful conclusion the initial project for which the CLT was created.

But that doesn't mean that the need for local affordable homes has all been met. Derbyshire Dales District Council will shortly be publishing the results of its survey of housing needs in Bradwell, and we are expecting to learn that there are still several families in need. We are therefore beginning to think about our next affordable housing project, and we will be consulting the village when it takes shape.

For the last few years before Covid the CLT has organised Comedy Night on the last Saturday of Gala Week and we're delighted to say that we are going ahead again this year on Saturday 6th August. Watch this space for further details.

Our Lady of Sorrows Roman Catholic Church, Bamford, is to host 'Flowers for Peace' during this year's Bamford Carnival. 

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Annual Parish Meeting: The meeting, in the Memorial Hall on 26th April, was attended by residents, local organisations/businesses and representatives of principal authorities. The meeting reviewed work conducted by Council during the year and was followed by reports from our local business and Peak District National Park Authority.

Annual Meeting of the Parish Council: The last council meeting was the council's annual meeting. Cllr Downing was re-elected as Chair and Cllr Salisbury as vice-Chair. Council then appointed Chairs to all committees. Council policies and procedures were reviewed and adopted. All policies and procedures are available on the website (bradda.org). Jubilee Celebrations: The idea of a party in the park (Town bottom playing fields) on Saturday 4th June 2022 has been agreed. Residents can order a free picnic bag from The Bakehouse which will contain a sandwich, cake, snack and drink. There will be four options - Vegetarian, Meat, Vegan and Gluten free. The picnic bags will also contain a voucher for an ice-cream from Khazi café. This is funded by the parish council and a Jubilee grant from Derbyshire Dales District Council. Garden Waste: District Councillor Furness advised council that certain parts of the village no longer have a garden waste service. Only properties who have green bins, which they pay for, have a garden waste service. The reason given is that the company now used for garden waste do not accept waste in plastic bags, even though they are compostable. District Councillor Furness advised that the plan to remove grass cuttings from the verges as they are cut is postponed to 2023. Report on ANPR in the village: PC K. Webster attended the parish council meeting to discuss the possibility of having ANPR (Automatic Number Plate Recognition) cameras in the village. He advised that this is the start of the process and he is attending parish council meetings to ask for support. PC Webster stated that he did not expect quick results and makes no promises that the project will go ahead. Council agreed to



Annette passed away on 29th March, 2022 at her home, Rippon, Hollowgate, Bradwell surrounded by family. She was 71 and had been battling cancer for a short time. Annette was born at The Plague Cottage in Eyam, where she spent her childhood attending Eyam school, followed by Hope Valley College. She began her working life in administration at Eyam quarry before becoming a mother. She moved to Bradwell in the 1980s with son Richard and later daughter Anna. Many people in this village and beyond will know Annette from her job as dinner lady and cleaner at Hope Valley College. She started there in the 1990s and continued to work there even when she became ill. She was a dearly loving mother to Richard and Anna and grandmother to Willow, Blossom and Matilda. She had so many friends and greatly appreciated the strength their friendship gave her. Annette said that she would never have been able to cope with her illness in the way she did "without the love and support of all of you ".

A great debt of gratitude is due to the team of distributors who managed to keep walking the streets right through the Covid pandemic, to Greenaway Workshop who printed every edition even though closed and also to the production team who made sure that your newsletter continued to be published during some difficult times.

Des Johnson was born in 1931 at Hellfire Corner, Bradwell, later moving to Gore Lane. He left school at 13, starting at 'lke's' as an apprentice. He enjoyed playing football and was a keen Sheffield Wednesday supporter. His teenage years were spent with his mates exploring the Peak District on their 'push-bikes'. His wife had started work with Des's sisters who told her Des was 'six foot tall and blonde' - a shock when he came home on leave to discover he was dark and only 5'4" tall! When they married they moved to Hope

and Des worked in Earle's quarry for 34 years, really enjoying his work and colleagues. Their gardens in Hope were superb and they won many awards, including "North of England Dahlia Champion", and their homes became renowned for colourful displays with superb lawns. Des loved sunshine, especially sitting in the garden listening to cricket on the radio or travelling abroad on many sunny holidays. A proud 'Bradda Lad' he moved back to the village for the last few weeks of his life and he passed away peacefully, surrounded by his family. Des will not be leaving Bradwell again because his ashes will be scattered from Bradwell Edge so he will remain here forever in the trees, streams, and grass of the village. Ninety is a good age and he had a happy, successful life.

DEREK OLLERENSHAW (STODGE)



Stodge was born at Yorkshire Bridge on 3rd March 1947. He came to live in Bradwell 53 years ago. After leaving New Mills Grammar School he started work at Newburgh Engineering and later moved to Ferodo, but his favourite job was that of greenkeeper at Sickleholme Golf Club. Stodge loved all sports, especially golf and football. He was a life-long supporter of Derby County Football Club, "once a Ram, always a Ram". As a young man he was a


