## PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

**Flooding in the village:** Council continues to work with the Church and residents to address the flooding that occurs in the village when there is heavy rain. County Councillor Alasdair Sutton is working with the responsible authorities to develop a solution to the problem.

**Grass verges:** Council continues to complain to Derbyshire Dales District Council (DDDC) about the state of grass verges in the village. Whilst DDDC did attend in early June, the verges at both ends of the village were only trimmed on the outside edges leaving the village again looking unkempt. A number of complaints from residents have been received and so further complaints have been sent to DDDC. Members of the DDDC "Clean and Green Team" (who have responsibility for grass cutting) will be here on 20<sup>th</sup> June to see the problems for themselves. It is hoped that this visit will result in a better service than we have received for the last four years.

**Council Finances:** The council's 2021/22 accounts have been approved by the internal auditor. Council has approved the overall Governance and Accounting Statements and these will be posted onto the council website. The same external auditor as previous years - PKF Littlejohn have been appointed and they will conduct a review of the accounts. The forms required for this process have been completed and the audit should be completed by the end of September.

**Play equipment in Beggars Plot Playing Field:** As promised some councillors visited the junior school in June to discuss the different options for new equipment in Beggars Plot Playing Field. Now we have the children's opinions the final specification for the equipment will be produced and put out for tender. Once the decision on the best supplier is identified the play equipment will be ordered and installed for all to enjoy.

**Carnival:** It is getting close to carnival time on Saturday 30th July and the organising is going well. Road closures have been applied for and all premises along the carnival route will be advised of the closure nearer to the date. The committee would like to remind everyone that dogs are not allowed on the playing field at any time, including on carnival day.

**Pedestrian bridge from Bradwell Springs:** Legal work for a pedestrian bridge from Bradwell Springs onto Softwater Lane and into the village is progressing well. Camstead now have the necessary permissions to install the bridge to provide a second means of egress from Bradwell Springs.

**Public Participation:** Residents continue to attend council meetings to raise matters of concern directly with Council. We welcome members of the public at both the main council and all committee meetings. Council meetings are generally held at 7:30 p.m. on the first Tuesday. ## DERBYSHIRE DALES DISTRICT COUNCIL (DDDC)

DDDC have begun their annual electoral registration canvass, which ensures they can keep the electoral register up to date and identify any residents who are not registered to vote so that they can be encouraged to do so. It is anticipated that the canvass letters and emails will start to arrive with Derbyshire Dales households from 12th July. It is expected that letters will be sent to around 21,000 households and emails to 15,000 electors for whom an email address is on record. The email will come from [electoral@derbyshiredales.gov.uk](mailto:electoral@derbyshiredales.gov.uk). Please check your junk/spam folders as some email providers may see this as junk mail. The hybrid system of letters and emails is designed to reduce the cost, which previously was carried out by post. ## ENGLISH CHAMPIONSHIP IN BRADDA

On Saturday 13th August Bradwell will be hosting a round of the English Fell Running Championship, six races which decide this years champions. The route up, down and around Bradda Edge has been planned to make it a tough, challenging course of 8.8 km with 450m of ascent. Race HQ and finish will be at the Sports Pavilion at Stretfield and the start of the women's and men's races will be adjacent to Beggars Plot, at 1.00pm and 2.30pm respectively. As well as being able to see some of the best runners in the country in action, there will also be refreshments on the sports ground including an Intrepid Brewery beer tent, Sunshine Pizza and organic foodstuffs from local producers. We hope the hundreds of runners will enjoy a great reception at both the start and the finish line - please come and cheer them on! ## FIRST RESPONDERS

For a number of years Tideswell and the Hope Valley have had cover from Community First Responder groups in each area. They have worked closely with responders attending calls across both regions. Due to reducing numbers in the Hope Valley scheme from volunteer turnover it was agreed to merge the two groups, which will give more stability and improve recruitment, training and fund raising. Current funds will be used when required to buy equipment that will benefit residents in Tideswell, the Hope Valley and surrounding areas.

If you like a challenge, are calm in an emergency, would like to help your community, can donate at least 4 hours a week of your time, hold a full, clean driving license and are in reasonable health then you could be eligible to join this very worthwhile service. CFRs are in schemes founded and run by volunteers who give up their spare time to attend appropriate emergency calls in their own community. They are

dispatched by the East Midlands Ambulance Service (EMAS) to patients in their homes, workplaces or public locations. They receive appropriate training and equipment so they can provide basic life support and initial care as a first responder on scene until the arrival of an emergency ambulance. EMAS always provides the fastest possible response to emergency calls using its conventional resources such as ambulances and fast response cars, but for patients experiencing cardiac arrest every second counts. Every minute that passes without defibrillation decreases a person's chance of survival by up to 10%. In more rural and hard to reach areas CFRs have a much better chance of providing the immediate help needed prior to the arrival of an EMAS ambulance crew. The types of emergency calls which CFRs are sent to are carefully chosen and an ambulance is dispatched at the same time as the CFR is alerted. Whilst EMAS provide some of the equipment and consumables the group have to raise funds to purchase the majority of the kit, which includes a portable defibrillator, a medical bag equipped with oxygen, masks and various other medical devices and first aid equipment. 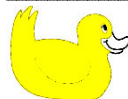
