**PARISH COUNCIL NEWS**

**Play equipment:** Following the tendering process council are pleased to announce that the order has been placed for the new play equipment for Beggars Plot Playing Field. The existing wooden trail will be removed and replaced with a new adventure trail comprising a set of wooden climbing and balancing equipment. There is also a large Jungle Climber which has climbing nets and balance ropes. Picnic benches will also be installed as part of the project. District Councillor Furness gave a grant of £500 from Derbyshire Dales District Council for the purchase of the picnic benches. Installation of the play equipment is planned for mid November.



**Social media:** Council's Facebook page is now operating and is being used to share information like road closures, meeting notifications, meeting agendas and notices that have been received from Derbyshire Dales District Council and Derbyshire County Council. As previously advised the page is for sharing factual information and not opinions.

**Café at Town Bottom playing fields:** Unfortunately, the Kha-zi café has given notice of closure due to the closure of Bradwells Ice Cream. A number of residents and local businesses have approached council to see if they could lease the room and all have been asked to complete a set of questions so their application can be assessed. The responses will be assessed quickly and the room rented to a new occupant.

**Footpath from Bradwell to Hope:** Following a request from a resident for council to help make the journey by foot from Bradwell to Hope safer for walkers, council agreed to speak to Breedon at the next liaison meeting to see if anything could be done to have a footpath adjacent to Eccles Lane. It may be some time before any feedback is available but it is felt that something should be done if at all possible.

## A TRIBUTE TO THE QUEEN

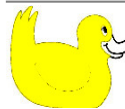
