PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Lights on toilet block: The lights on the toilet block are currently set up with a timer and this is not the most economical way to operate them. The current lights are going to be replaced with a lower wattage light and fitted with a PIR (Passive Infrared sensor), so they only come on when required, reducing use of energy.

Council Insurance: Council has renewed their insurance for the coming year. The certificates are posted on the website.

Winter Preparations: Although the weather is still mild, preparations for dealing with adverse winter weather have commenced with an audit of all the County and Parish council bins around the parish. The survey is to ensure we have adequate supplies of grit for use on public roads and pavements. The parish has signed up as a member of the DCC Winter Service Scheme for a third year. This means that DCC will provide us with snow clearing training and bags of grit. If you are interested in joining the team who spread the grit onto our pavements, please contact the Clerk for further details.

S137 Grants: Council has a fund of money available to award grants to village groups/organisations and would be pleased to consider applications for financial assistance. If you would like to apply for a grant please contact the Parish Clerk.

Planning Applications: The parish council is routinely consulted on planning applications submitted to PDNPA by residents of the parish and responds to PDNPA by giving its view on each application. Council's responses are posted to the PDNPA website and are available for public inspection.

Café at Town Bottom playing fields: Following the tender process for the lease of the room at the Toilet Block, Lynne Smith from The Shoulder of Mutton has been successful in securing the lease. Lynne will be letting everyone know her plans for the room very soon. We wish Lynne and her team every success in this venture.

Footpath from Bradwell to Hope: Following a request from a resident for the Council to help make the journey by foot from Bradwell to Hope safer for walkers, council spoke to Hope Cement, Breedon at their latest liaison meeting to see if anything could be done to have a footpath adjacent to Eccles Lane. They agreed to walk the area to assess if anything could be done to create a footpath on Breedon land and will get back to Council with their findings.

Public Participation: Residents continue to attend Council meetings to raise matters of concern directly with Council. We welcome members of the public at both main Council and all committee meetings. Council meetings are generally held at 7:30 p.m. on the first Tuesday. See the parish notice boards (on the side of the Memorial Hall and in the Peace Gardens bus shelter) for meeting announcements and agendas.

WINIFRED MARY BRADWELL



Mary was born into a Methodist Christian family on 14 July 1926. She was the youngest child of Fred and Harriet Evans and lived on Hungry Lane at Hillcrest, built by her father and his two brothers. She had a sister Margaret, 9 years her senior, and was preceded by twins who were stillborn, and a sister, Irene, who died aged 16 months. After these sad

events, Mary's arrival was seen as a God-given gift. Mary was educated at Bradwell C of E School and had hoped to become a pupil teacher, under the tutelage of her headmaster, Mr Millard. This opportunity would have given her the chance to find work as a fully qualified teacher, but her father would not agree to it. She worked at Bradwell Co-op during WW2 until she was 19, when she had to leave because the men returning from the war needed jobs. She was so proud to be asked to open the newly refurbished Co-op in 2015, not least because her father's firm had built the original shop in 1934. Mary and Stanley married in 1949 at Bradwell Methodist Chapel. They started married life at Hillcrest with her parents before moving up to the bungalow Pingle Nook, on Jeffrey Lane, where Tim was born in 1952. They moved to their final home, Ashover House, in 1989.

Mary had a great love for the English language and the local dialect. Bradda dialect words and place names were always in her vocabulary. She was a great fan of crosswords and puzzles and loved putting together quizzes for church and family get togethers. She loved socialising with friends and enjoyed breakfasts at the Yondermann, Sunday lunches at The Shoulder and The Bowling Green as well as anniversary celebrations and parties, involving singing and games such as charades. Over the years, Mary and Stanley went on numerous UK holidays in the car, with Mary meticulously planning the routes and itinerary.

Mary was involved in most aspects of the community, such as Young Wives Group, Tuesday Walkers, Meals on Wheels, Girls' Guildry and Brigade, Ladies Christian Fellowship, Bamford Singers, Eyam and District Mobile Physiotherapy, Christian Aid Collection and Bradwell Historical Society. For several years, she was a member of the Memorial Hall Committee and served on the committee of the Ebenezer Bradwell Charity. Mary and Stanley worked tirelessly as a couple in the service of the community in Bradwell and the Hope Valley. Their central pivot was the Church and they both dedicated their lives to their faith through the many duties they undertook.

Since Stanley's death in January 2019, Mary managed to live, for the most part independently on her own, until she had to go into hospital at the end of August. She died peacefully at Hillcrest on 20th September at the age of 96. She leaves son Timothy and his partner Theresa, much loved grandchildren Charlotte and Sam and two adored great granddaughters, Bella and Darcie.
