TRACTOR RUN



The Blackbridge Farm tractor run was held on 19th May and 75 tractors took part. The run started at the Travellers Rest and proceeded via Mam Tor to Peak Forest, then to the Anchor at Tideswell and down to

Bradwell. A late lunch was taken at The Shoulder of Mutton . The total raised from all sources was £1,800 to be used for medical research into breast, testicular and prostate cancer. £125 was also donated to Bradwell Football Club. The event was organised by Ann, Megan and Kate Harrison and the men of the family. A lot was learned during the run about the many experiences people have with cancer, both the successful treatments and the tragic losses, leaving little doubt that cancer affects so many of us. The Brough road closure is creating significant difficulties for local businesses, with the loss of passing trade. You will have read elsewhere in this newsletter some steps being taken by your parish council to help our businesses survive the closure. However, the effects are being felt more widely, and in response to the challenge, Watsons of Hope and Bradwell Village Shop/Post Office have teamed up to ensure that Watsons customers in Bradwell can continue to obtain their meat products. PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Carnival Day: Carnival Day is just around the corner and although the road closure at Brough may cause difficulties and possibly limit visitors, it won't dampen Bradda Spirit and plans are still moving forward. Don't forget that this year the fair will be there on the evening of Friday 2nd August as well as Saturday 3rd. If you are interested in marshalling or helping do come to the next meeting which is on Wednesday 17th July in the Gallery Room of Bradwell War Memorial Hall. Council would also like to remind anyone entering a float into the parade that the theme is "open", but all trailers and vehicles must have handrails erected for the safety of all on board. Brough Road Closure: Both the Parish Council organised public meeting and the drop-in session run by Derbyshire County Council were a success, with lots of feedback. As a result, DCC have amended some of their plans. Whilst the road will still be closed throughout to vehicles, pedestrian and cycle access will now be possible before 8am and after 4:30pm. There might even be a short window at lunch times. There will also be a shuttle bus service, provided by Hulleys. Timetables will be available soon from Bradwell Post Office. Eccles Lane will be open and not controlled, so do please be aware that there may well be extra pedestrians, cyclists and horses using the road. Please also be respectful of our neighbours who live down there. For more information on the road closure and its progress, keep an eye on Derbyshire County Council's website www.derbyshire.gov.uk/broughretainingwall There is also the option to sign up for email alerts.

At the Parish Village Meeting on 28th May a group of councillors established a support group for the village, to promote the fact that Bradwell is still open for business. For the duration of the works it would be great if you could eat, drink and shop locally. There are several businesses in the village who would greatly appreciate and benefit from your custom. If you've never visited them, now is your chance. We also need to help each other during this period, for example by lift sharing and being aware if people are struggling.

Defibrillator: Disappointingly, it seems that the defibrillator in the old red phone box on Town Gate has been vandalised, with the box itself having also been broken into. These AED devices are there to help in the case of life-threatening emergencies and should **NOT** be tampered with. Not only could they help save someone's life, but they are also very dangerous should they be misused.

Speedwatch: We need volunteers to help set up a speedwatch group. A minimum of 6 people are needed if this project is to work. If you are concerned about speeding issues within the village, please contact the Parish Clerk or George Leeson - project co-ordinator. georgeleeson121@gmail.com

HOPE VALLET CLIMATE ACTION

As I write this, the General Election campaign is in full swing. The opportunity to choose our Government is not a privilege shared by citizens of all countries, and all General Elections are important, but this one is especially so. The next five years, the lifetime of the next parliament, will be crucial for the future of our climate and hence the condition of the world in which we live, and the ecosphere on which we all depend. Although there is now agreement that the global economy has to become 'net zero', there are still arguments about how we get there, how fast we need to move, and who should shoulder the biggest burdens. So what the next Government does really matters! Hope Valley Climate Action has always believed that raising local awareness and local action to address the causes and consequences of climate change are essential, but not in themselves enough to avert climate breakdown. That is why we have always seen advocacy – for the policies that are necessary at national and international level - as an important part of what we do. For this general election we have produced a 'Manifesto' of our own, for what we think has to happen in the Valley, and by the time you read this you should have received a summary version through your letterbox. We have sent this to all parliamentary candidates in High Peak and Derbyshire Dales, asking if they support it and what they would do to deliver it. If you are reading this before July 4th and have yet to vote, please think about the climate when you cast your ballot. And if it is afterwards, join us in holding the new MPs in the Valley, and the new Government, to account for their actions on this vitally important topic. MORE ON DEFIBS

Do you know where the AEDs are in Bradwell? Do you know what an AED is? AED stands for Automated External Defibrillator and now is a good time to remind ourselves of the locations of the (Defibs) in Bradwell. The forthcoming road closure may mean emergency response vehicles take longer to get here, and there is not a Community First Responder (CFR) based in Bradwell. The nearest CFR's are in Litton and Tideswell, so the Community First Responder Group (CFRG)have offered to run a session on the use of an AED and basic CPR for anyone in the village who is interested. You will see on this page that Hope Heartbeat Defibrillators Group are running a free awareness session in Hope, but due to the road closure it might be a tad difficult to get there. Bystander CPR and the early use of an AED makes all the difference and increases survival rates. I live in the village and am happy to liaise with CRFG and set something up for the village if there is enough interest. TRAFFIC SURVEY

Residents might have noticed some activity on Netherside during Wednesday 12th June. The Parish Council were carrying out a traffic survey, and we are indebted to a number of residents who helped at intervals through the day - Marie Claire, George Leeson, Andrew Dalrymple. Ann West, Sue Cornish, Liz Downing, Jill Salisbury and Theresa Green. The survey results will be published in full in the August newsletter and also on the village Facebook forum, but a quick overview is as follows.

The survey ran from 0800 to 1700.

We broke it into three categories:


HGV's (more than two axles), Large vans and buses, Cars and Motor cycles. The total count was 2,932 vehicles. 7.4% were HGV's, 13.8% Large vehicles, vans and buses and 78.8% cars and motor cycles. The number of vehicles travelling north to south versus south to north was approximately the same. We'll be repeating the exercise at some point later in the year.

RITA MARY CRITCHLOW 30th April 1938 - 10th May 2024



Rita was born at Castleford and moved to Rotherham when she was two years old, with her parents and older sister. She worked as a secretary in Sheffield and took a City and Guilds course in cake making and decorating. She met Vernon Critchlow at a dance in Sheffield and they were married in 1972. They lived at Windmill for 30 years before moving to Bradwell in 2002. Rita was a member of two W.I.

groups and enjoyed playing indoor bowls. Vernon passed away in 2014. After a fall in 2020 Rita lost her independence and relied on help from her good neighbours, Jo and Jeanie. In 2022 she moved into a care home, where she was well looked after until her death on 10th May. A service to celebrate Rita's life was held at St. Barnabas Church on 4th June 2024.

BRADWELL IS OPEN FOR BUSINESS

Much has been said about the road closure at Brough, and no-one can deny that it is just about as disruptive to village life as things can get. To have one of our main access points closed off to all traffic for the whole of summer makes life very difficult, and your Parish/District Councils have been thinking hard about what we can all do to help each other. As might be expected, residents have come up trumps by offering ride shares, and communication and information sharing via the Facebook forum helps to keep everyone informed about what's happening. It is also encouraging that, thanks to the great turnout of residents at the DCC drop-in session, limited pedestrian and cyclist access will now be allowed, plus a shuttle bus service to Castleton. It's a pity this discussion with the authorities hadn't happened a lot earlier, but they listened to us, and we will manage. We'll be posting updates regarding progress of the repair work in this newsletter and on notice boards so that residents without internet or not on Facebook can know how things are going. Please spare a thought for our local businesses at this time because they will be losing a lot of passing trade at what should be their busiest time of year. We are planning to put notices at the Tideswell junction with the message that, although the road is closed our businesses are very much open. You can also help them survive this period. If you are thinking of eating out, do so at the Shoulder or Bowling Green. Shop at the Bakehouse or have lunch at the Brook Café. Both serve excellent food. There is a great range of food products at the Post Office and of course we have our Co-Op for much more. If we all support our local businesses through the closure we will be helping to ensure they are still there for us in October.
