POSSIBLE BAKEWELL BANKING HUB

Derbyshire Dales District Council held a meeting of Bakewell Banking Hub stakeholders on Friday 12 July. The meeting was attended by John Whitby MP and stakeholders agreed to collaborate in the preparation of a 'business case' to enable Mr Whitby to progress discussions with the government minister. It was proposed that Bakewell Town Council co-ordinate activity. Paul Wilson, Derbyshire Dales District Council Chief Executive said "The meeting on Friday was very positive with a wide range of stakeholders contributing their views on the need for a Banking Hub in Bakewell. We are delighted that progress is being made." The District Council expressed a wish to secure a banking hub in Bakewell, following the closure of the Natwest Bank branch in the town in February of this year.



Please be aware that there could be pedestrians using the lane. Community Speed Watch: The village speed-watch volunteers have started their training and will soon be beginning their sessions in the village. This scheme is intended to be an important part of an initiative to reduce speeding in the village. It will also help identify problem areas, which will help council decide where best to locate other signs and related devices. If you are interested in becoming a volunteer or would like any

BRADWELL SPRINGS

The development of Bradwell Springs has been recognised in the Royal Town Planning Institute's (RTPI) East Midlands Awards for Planning Excellence. It was commended in the 2024 'Best Project' category. As residents may know, the site, in the centre of the village, was formerly occupied by Newburgh Engineering, but when the company re-located most of its operations to Rotherham several large industrial buildings were no longer needed, leading to interest from developers. National Park planners and the Bradwell community began working together in 2015 to identify both the local need for affordable housing and also to earmark what became known as Bradwell Springs as a site which could bring significant community benefit, through a Neighbourhood Plan. Bradwell Community Land Trust was established and it owns twelve affordable houses on the development, on behalf of the community. These are rented to local people through the Peak District Rural Housing Association. All the new homes were sympathetically designed, with an appropriate external appearance, reflecting local building traditions.

The RTPI judges commented: "Bradwell Springs is an excellent example of how an active and forward-thinking community utilised the Neighbourhood Plan process to strongly influence a redevelopment scheme in the Peak District National Park. It has created a high-quality combined housing and industrial space which enhances the character of Bradwell.'

Peak District National Park Policy Planners helped Bradwell Parish Council with drafting the plan, and their Development Management Team helped shape the design and conditions to make the scheme work. Head of Planning, Brian Taylor commented that the community have appreciated the close working relationship with the Peak District National Park and the result is a great development which everyone can support.

SWIFTS EVENT

The recent event was a great success, with many people passing the stall and expressing an interest in Swifts, plus taking one of our new informative leaflets or Swift badges. We were also told about two new swift sites in the village, which is fantastic. Several of the people who chatted to us live in the new houses on Swift Close and indicated that they were keen to try and put up boxes on their properties to help provide a welcome home for Swifts. Swift Close was so called because the old Newburgh site, where the houses were recently built, was a hot spot for Swifts in the past. This year the cold, wet Spring and Summer has created very challenging conditions for Swifts that are trying to catch several thousand insects per day. We can help them by putting up Swift boxes in suitable locations, gardening to attract a range of insects that Swifts eat, making a wildlife pond where insects will breed, and remembering not to use pesticides. Please be aware if you find a Swift on the ground it is likely to be in trouble, so it is very important that you contact us on bradwellswiftreports@gmail.com so that we can immediately try and get it to a specialist carer for injured/young Swifts. Every Swift counts!

C-R-Y.

We would like to pass on our sincere thanks and gratitude to Bradwell CE Infant School, who have a generously raised and donated £50 from sale of plants to C-R-Y and the Kyle Hancock Memorial Fund. This money will be used for heart screening days for the young aged 14 to 35. It now costs £6,800 for a screening day and 100 young people can be screened, so this donation is gratefully appreciated and we thank everyone involved. We are pleased to announce that the next C-R-Y screening day in Bradwell Memorial Hall is booked to take place on 17th April, 2025.

NEW WEEKLY SHOPPING BUS

Every Thursday, Ashbourne Community Transport (ACT) takes residents of Hope, Castleton, Bamford and Bradwell to Buxton. The Derbyshire Connect Shopping bus is meant for those who have difficulty or can't use the regular bus, but in effect everyone can use it. All you have to do is register with ACT, book your place and wait to be collected from your house. If you've got a bus pass it's free. If not, adult return fare is £4.50. It's simple to book your shopping journey. Either call 01335 300670 (9am-4pm Monday to Friday) between seven days before or the day before you want to travel. Or email enquiries@ashbournect.org.uk. Please give 48 hours notice. If you need to use a wheelchair or specific walking aids please mention this when booking. Please note that the shopping bus is completely separate from the 62 bus service, although both services go to Buxton.

HOPE VALLEY CLIMATE ACTION

Although we are currently (as I write) having a rather dull, cool, wet 'summer', the impacts of climate breakdown continue. In Delhi, India, temperatures hit an almost unimaginable 50 degrees, while Japan is currently experiencing a heatwave with temperatures over 40 degrees. At the Hajj pilgrimage at least 1,300 people have died as a result of the heat, and in the West Indies the hurricane season has started much earlier than ever before, with devastating impact. Closer to home the impacts are perhaps not quite so dramatic, but crop yields are down, food prices up, and damage leading to the road closure for repairs at Brough, so annoying to many, is likely to have been at least in part contributed to by heavy rainfall, itself a consequence of climate change. The change in the political landscape following the Mayoral and General Elections provide new opportunities for action to address the crisis. Both High Peak (NW end of the Valley) and more remarkably Derbyshire Dales (SE end) are now represented by Labour MPs, and with a Regional Mayor (responsible for transport policy) and National Government all of the same political hue, there are undoubtedly opportunities for joined up approaches. Early signs, and the Party's Manifesto, suggest that the new Government is prepared to take some radical steps. Radical steps are needed. We, at Hope Valley Climate Action have secured a meeting with the Mayor to discuss the transport needs of the Valley, among other things, and are seeking early meetings with each of the two new Westminster MPs. At the same time we will be considering how the new political landscape should influence our strategy. We are as always keen to hear the views of local people on how we can best address the crisis
