PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Now that the excitement of carnival and the Brough road closure has calmed down, council are looking at other pressing matters in the community.

Speed Watch: The campaign, led by our dedicated volunteers is working well. There have been several sessions at different points in the village and the general report is that motorists are driving sensibly and within the speed limit. However, we are aware that this may be a show for the camera and council are still looking at options for a fixed sign that records speed and data. Council would like to give thanks to these volunteers who give up their time for this initiative.

Breedon: Council thanks Breedon, whose employees have been doing some wonderful voluntary work within the community over the summer. The War Memorial Hall had a fresh lick of paint on its doors, the Infant/Pre-school outside play areas had a huge clean up operation in its playgrounds and the Junior School even had a brand-new wooden pirate ship built for the children to play on! Town Bottom: Not such good news that we once again have reports of vandalism at Town Bottom Toilets and Brook Café. After a great Carnival Saturday the scarecrow that was outside the cafe was damaged beyond repair. We appreciate that people want to have a good time, but this was a careless and cruel act of vandalism, with a lot of hard work ruined. On separate occasions, the toilets have also been left in a mess and chairs have been thrown into the brook. Council are discussing ways to help eradicate these problems, but we would also appreciate your help in reminding your children and teenagers that it is their village they are damaging. If the toilets have to be locked in the evenings this will spoil things for many people.

Dogs: There are also reports coming in about dog faeces on the footpaths of the village. The paths in the middle of Bradwell are used daily on the school commute and young children and those with prams are stepping in it. It is unpleasant for residents to have to clean your dog's mess from wheels and feet. Please be responsible and considerate to others and ensure you are cleaning up after your own dog.

Other Issues: Council appreciates that problems do occur in the village and whilst we can fix some of it, unfortunately there are many things that are out of our control, including pavements, highways, verges, trees not on council land and problems with local transport. MHA COMMUNITIES

MHA Communities Derbyshire Peaks and Dales is a new community scheme which sets up services and social activities for people aged 55 and over, in the local area. The scheme has recently set up two "Love to Move" sessions every Tuesday in Bakewell Town Hall from 10am - 11.30am and in Hathersage Memorial Hall every Thursday 11am -12.30pm. Both sessions are followed by refreshments. The Love to Move programme was developed by the British Gymnastics foundation to help support cognitive function and mobility in people living with dementia. The gentle chair exercises are all set to music and are great fun for everyone. From October MHA Communities Derbyshire Peaks and Dales will be running the already popular dementia support group "Forget Me Nots", previously run by Derbyshire Dales CVS. The sessions aim to link people living with dementia and their carers to others in similar situations, creating support networks, providing useful information and light hearted activities. There are three sessions each month, the first Wednesday of the month at Bakewell Methodist Church 2 - 4pm, third Wednesday of the month at Hathersage Memorial Hall and last Wednesday of the month is a group walk from various locations. BRADWELL MISCELLANY

Beginning a series of short pieces from Chris Furness. WATER

Glaciation meltwater created lots of rivers and streams south of Bradwell, draining the water and forming several valleys. These all converged and were trapped by what is now known as Hazlebadge. This was originally a coral reef in a tropical sea. The rivers combined to form a lake, the water from which flowed from north west to south east across Hazlebadge where the river bed can still be seen. Over thousands of years the water in the lake dissolved its way through the rock towards Bradwell, creating caves which eventually collapsed to form a valley – Bradwell Dale – where the water continued to run till the glaciers in the area were completely melted away.

A NOCTURNAL VISITOR

Bradwell resident, James Roberts has just moved here from "the Big City" and he rather likes the different way of life in the village. He likes the relaxed feeling and the view of the beautiful hills from his bedroom window. Of course, there's also all the lovely wildlife. One night recently he was alone in his lounge when he heard what he thought was a mouse moving around. A quick search found nothing it was left until the morning. On retiring to bed (directly above the lounge) he could hear the moving around even louder than before. It was in the bedroom! It was around midnight, and when the lights were turned on the noise stopped, so James used the light on his phone to look around. At this point he saw saw the reflection of two little eyes in the corner of the room. Thinking it might be a mouse or, perhaps worse, a rat he looked closer. The giveaway was when he saw spikes - it was a hedgehog! He managed to get it into a box and the next morning called the British Hedgehog Preservation Society. They told me that hedgehogs can very easily climb carpeted stairs. Luckily his son had made a hedgehog house a few months ago, so after dark the hedgehog was released alongside it, and it has not been seen since. So, keep an eye out for hedgehogs on Main Road and in your bedrooms.
