PC NOTES

Carnival: The year is moving very quickly, and as we are now entering July carnival plans are in full swing wit the first event of the year happening at the end of the month. The eve of Carnival event, which was introduced last year will happen again on July 31st on Beggars Plot. There will be music from local bands, a bar, food and fun. The field will open from 5pm. We are also pleased to announce the Street Fayre will be run on behalf of FOBS on the Monday as usual, and this year we are also bringing the carnival Torchlight procession back on August 10th. After its popularity last year we will again be providing a flyer showing what's on during Gala. It's not too late to add your event to the flyer, so let the clerk know if you want something adding. We will also again be looking for marshals and helpers to enable these events to run smoothly and safely, so if you can spare some time please email the clerk. There is still time to book a stall on the field (Beggars Plot) on Carnival Day. The Brook: Council have been in discussion with the Environment Agency over dredging of the brook, and they have told us that they do have plans to do it this year. Due to fish spawning seasons there is only a small window when this can be done, so Council are working with the riparian owners and the Environment Agency to try to make sure that the dredging does happen this year. We are also aware that the Environment Agency has started contacting households regarding their Flood Protection Scheme, and hopefully residents will be offered measures which could help protect their homes from flooding.

Vandalism: Council became aware that some damage had been caused in the public toilets on Town Bottom. Via our newly installed CCTV system we were able to view the footage and identify the culprits. Their parents were informed and in this instance the damage was minor, but we do work very hard to keep the toilet block open 24 hours a day, and replacing/repairing damaged equipment takes time and effort and costs money which comes out of your council tax.

Playing Fields: Council plans to make the playing fields more appealing and some changes will be happening. Some of the tired play equipment will be getting some new exciting colour changes, and users of Town Bottom may have noticed that the spinners have gone. This was decided as they were not financially viable to repair. If residents or children would like to put ideas forward for their replacement, please let the clerk know. Softwater Lane: Users of the bridge between Bradwell Springs and Softwater Lane might have noticed that work has begun to improve the area. In the next few months we will be surfacing the path to make it easier to access especially for those with wheelchairs and prams. We will also be installing safety fencing at the base of the footpath to make things safer for any young users of the bridge.

Residents are always encouraged to attend parish council meetings which are held on the first Tuesday of each month at 7:30pm. There is a period of time at the beginning of the meeting where residents can address their concerns, put questions to council or simply observe.

BRADWELL RAILWAY STATION

There was twice nearly a station here. The first was planned in the 1840s by the North Midland railway before it merged with the Midland railway. No plans were ever drawn up but the line was initially expected to progress alongside the Derwent river through the Chatsworth estate from the old station at Rowsley, but the then Duke of Devonshire did not want railways on his land so a new station was built at Rowslev and the line had to progress through the Haddon estate and via Bakewell in the 1860s. If the Duke had been more amenable, it must be assumed there would have been stations at Baslow, Calver, and in different locations at Grindleford. Hathersage, Bamford/Shatton, then Brough, Bradwell, Great Hucklow and Tideswell (five lane ends). The line would then have swung west towards Manchester. Thus tunnels would be avoided, although Peak Forest would be difficult. The station at Bradwell would have been to the East of the village since the line would have to run along the bottom of Bradwell Edge up to Great Hucklow. The second near miss was a branch line from Hope station to Castleton via Bradwell in the 1890s/early 20th century. The plans were drawn up by a group of local enthusiasts and approved by parliament but insufficient funds were raised. It was hoped that Midland Railway would step in but they were not interested. The station was planned for near the bottom of Gore Lane. It might have been electric since a possible generator was planned near Bradwell station. If it had been built it would now be a tourist attraction and would have provided a main line link for Hope cement works when that opened in 1929. Chris Furness

ROAD WORKS AT MYTHAM BRIDGE

The road works to repair the eroded section of road at Mytham Bridge will begin Monday 23rd June and last for 15 weeks, subject to weather. The road will remain open on traffic lights. The repairs will involve drilling interlocking steel sections into the ground beneath the level of the river for a distance of 20 meters. The plan is to use local materials where possible, drainage improvements will be made and the whole area will be resurfaced after work is complete.
